

Physical description of property and statement of historical significance:

The Greek Revival style Hall House is one and a half stories tall, with an L-shaped floor plan and steeply pitched gable roofs. The gable end on the east facade contains one/one, double-hung windows with cornice moldings and non-original decorative shutters at the first and second floors. The front porch to the south has been enclosed with a blank wall. The gable end on the south facade contains a single, one/one, double-hung window. A garage addition is located off the rear southwest corner. The structure is clad with shiplap siding and corner boards that have capitals below the frieze and projected eaves.

History

The adjacent lands were owned by the Hall family and this is reported to be the farmhouse. Nearby properties were sold piece by piece by Grama Hall with the earliest structure located here. The Rodgers and Leichie families were early residents of this house.
