

Physical description of property and statement of historical significance:

Colonial Revival details enliven this two story, box-shaped house, which has a pyramidal roof, a central chimney and a hipped dormer on the front with four-light casement windows. There is a full length front porch with a hip roof, boxed cornice, plain frieze and modified Tuscan columns. On the south end of the porch there is a new screen of wood and fiberglass panels. The front door contains a single light and the casing is corniced. The window to the left has a similar cornice molding and a leaded glass transom. One/one, double-hung windows occur in each corner, usually above first floor window or door openings. There is a partially enclosed porch at the southeast corner which features a pediment and boxed columns. The frieze continues around the house dividing the horizontal siding on the first floor from the shingling on the upper floors. The shingling is laid out in horizontal fish-scale and diamond patterns. Other windows are irregularly placed on the elevations and are of different sizes.

History

This property changed hands rapidly during the period when the house dates. During 1907 J. McMonagle sold the property to G. W. Spurling who sold to W. J. Mitchell and in 1913 Joseph Benner purchased the property, remaining here for nine years.
