Physical description of property and statement of historical significance:

The Dougish House is a two and a half story Arts and Crafts structure with a square plan on a corner lot. There is a hip roof with hip dormers on both public sides and a boxed cornice with paired scroll brackets. The front porch has box columns and a pediment above the stairs at the north. Fluted wood pilasters brackets frame the front door, which has a large single light, bead and dart molding and dentils. There is a large single-light window with a leaded glass transom to the left of the entry. On the second floor are a three-sided bay and a rectangular bay, which contain one/one, double-hung windows. The entire building is clad in clapboard siding. The dormers contain paired four-light windows. On the south elevation there is a three-sided bay to the left and a double hung window on the right. The windows all have large single lights below and leaded glass in the upper sashes. There are two chimneys on the back wall and a small square addition containing a rear entry. A skylight has been installed on the east face of the roof.

History

Evert Dougish, the early owner associated with this house, was the owner of a local hardwood store. The house was constructed by Wayne Bogart, a builder and carpenter from Missouri. The next owner was Roshel Grove who remained until 1978, when the interior was renovated to provide professional offices.
