

Physical description of property and statement of historical significance:

This one and a half story Gothic Revival house has a raised basement and an L-shaped floor plan. There is a non-original porch with a hip roof on the west, the corner of which has been filled in with a large single-light window. The entry door has a full height light and a transom. Directly above is a wall dormer with a pointed arch window. The gable end on the east contains one/one, double-hung windows on the first and second floors. In the center beside the stairs that rise to the porch is a door to the basement. The basement is lit with eight/one, double-hung windows in each corner.

The east (side) elevation contains a wall dormer with a pointed arch double hung window. To each side are one/one, double-hung windows on the first floor and eight/one, double-hung windows on the basement level. There is a single story addition on the rear. The interior chimney located where the two gables meet has lost its cap. The base is shingled while the upper floors have shiplap siding and corner boards.

The building has possibly been raised to accommodate the basement apartment.
