The pep band played for all the home basketball games and attended many out of town games. The school bought the band new outfits consisting of a vest and tie.

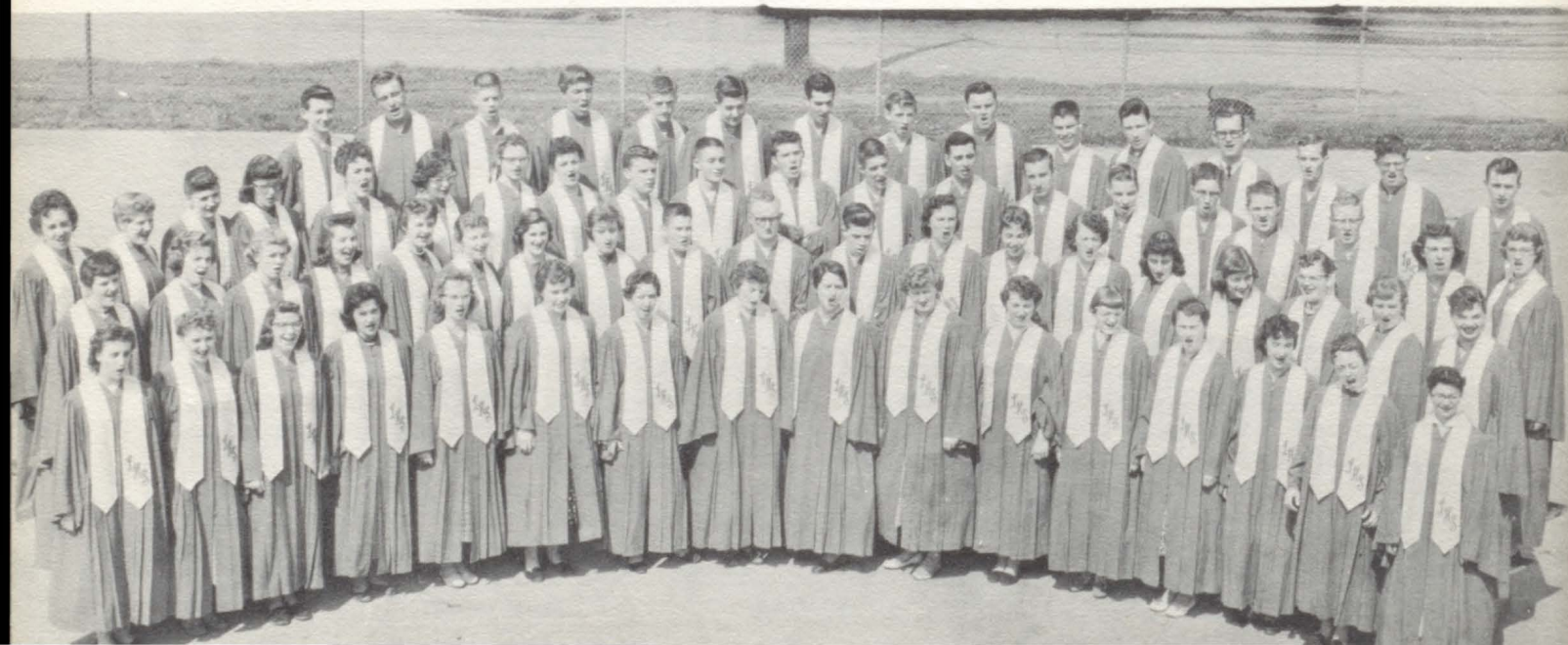

Boys' League was given the task of keeping the campus clean during the May Day picnic.

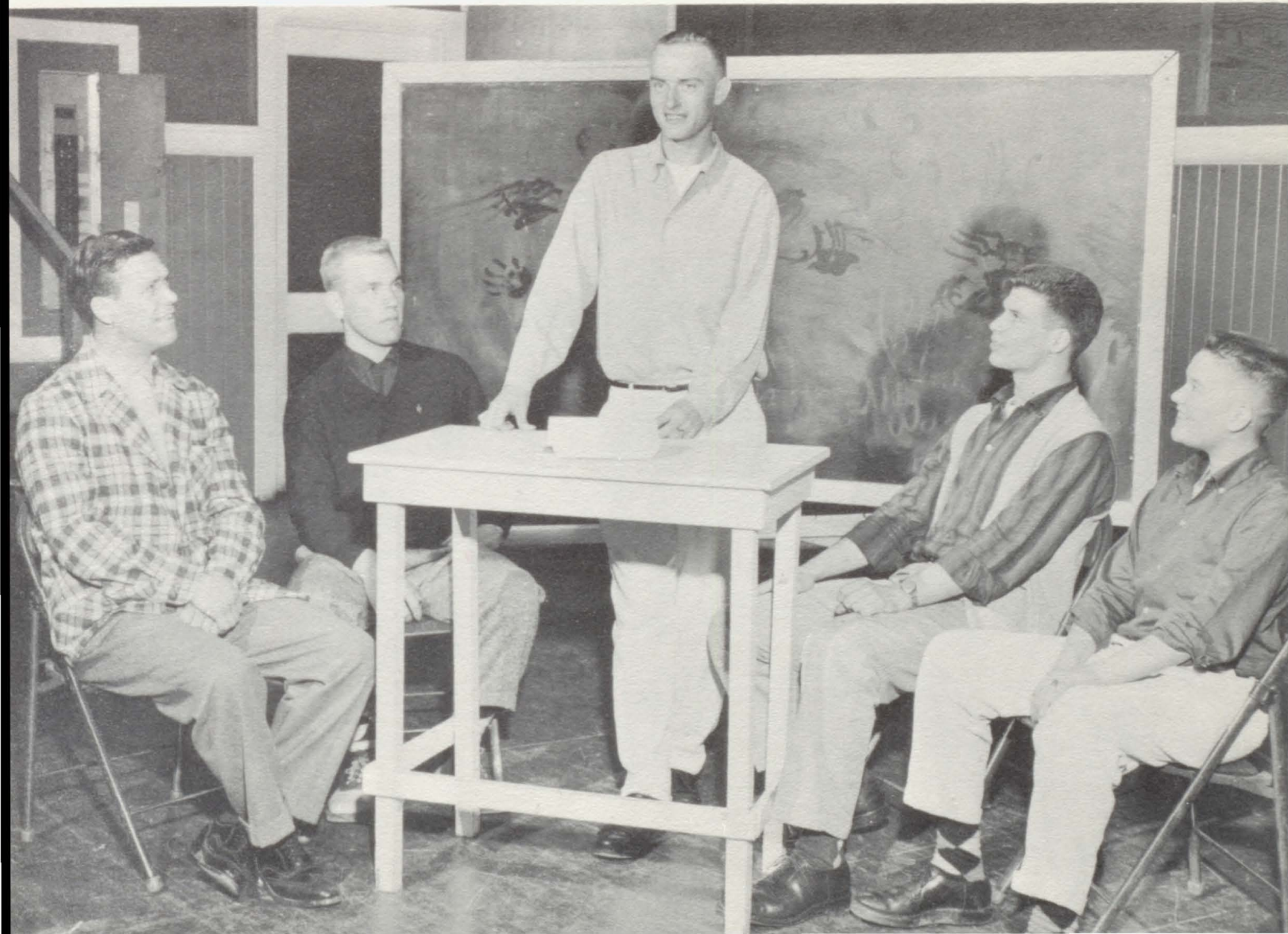
The last regular meeting was a business meeting with the nomination of candidates for next year's offices.

Christmas baskets of food to needy families of the community, and by supplying the annual Christmas tree for the main hall, which traditionally is trimmed by the Tri-Y.

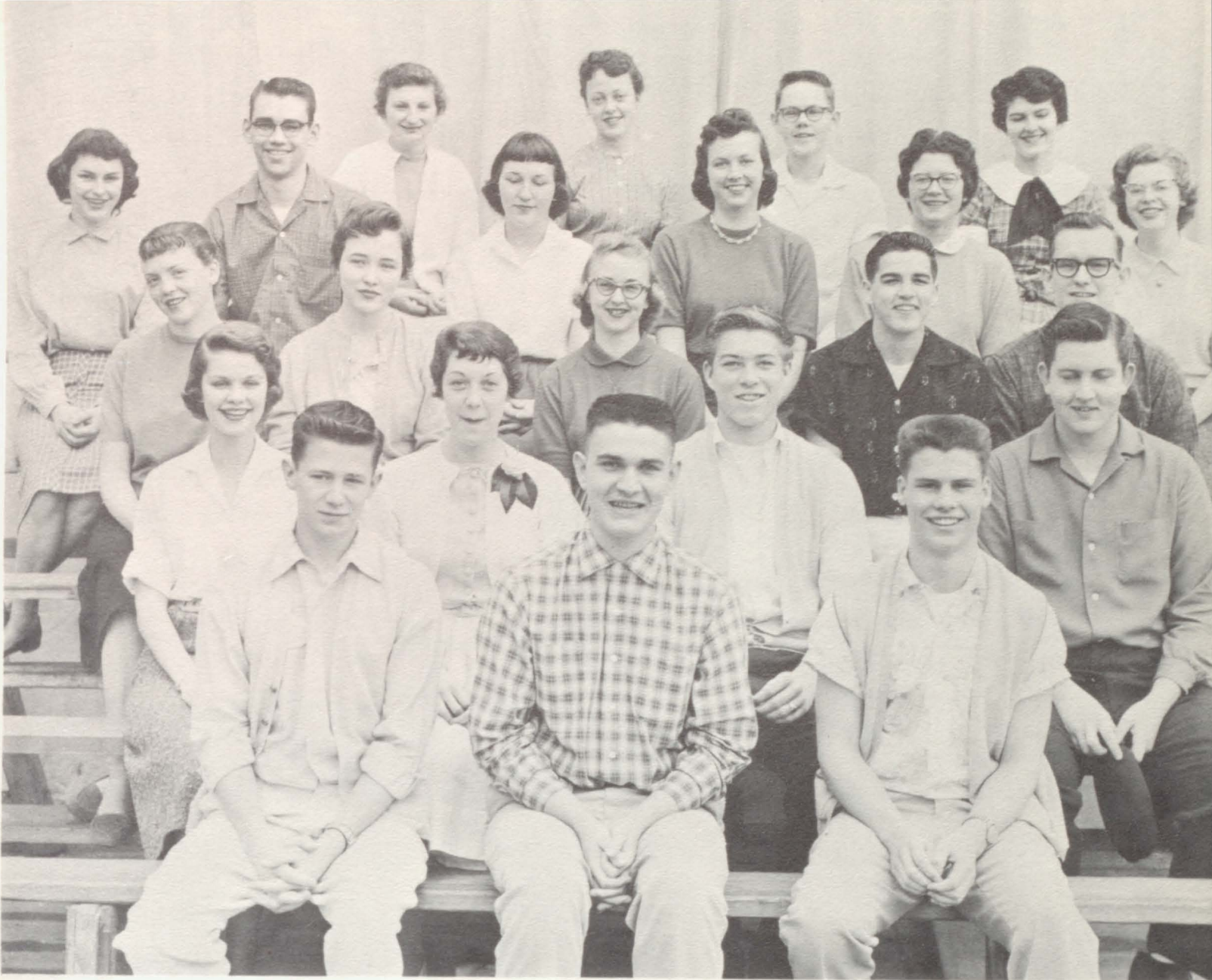
Other activities for the year 1956-57 included a banquet, selling at games, sponsoring dances, and the showing of a noon movie.

To become a member of the club you must earn at least one letter. Each member is then to set a good example for other students to follow.

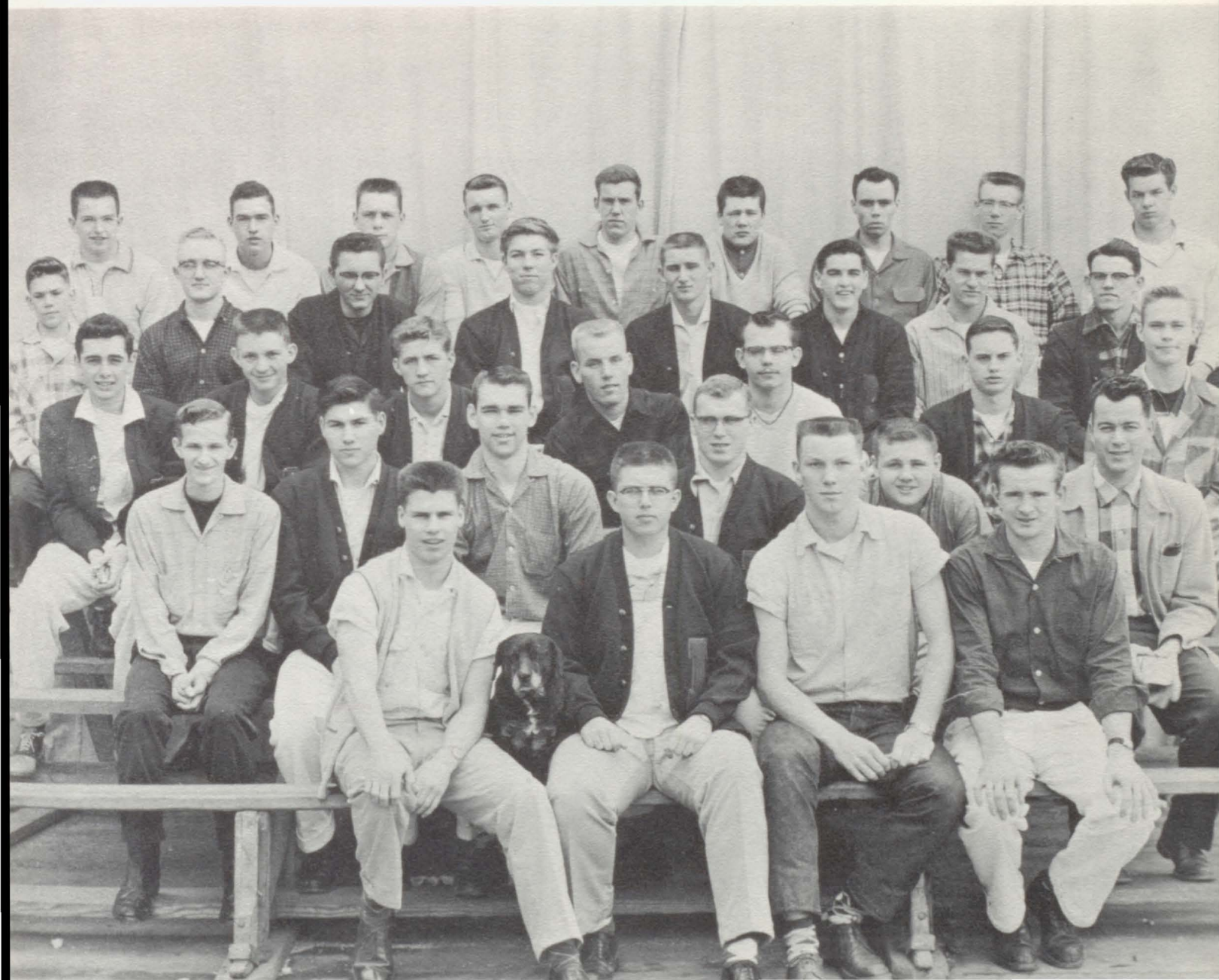
One of the services we performed this year was to help with the seating in the gym for the assemblies. We saw to it that the chairs were

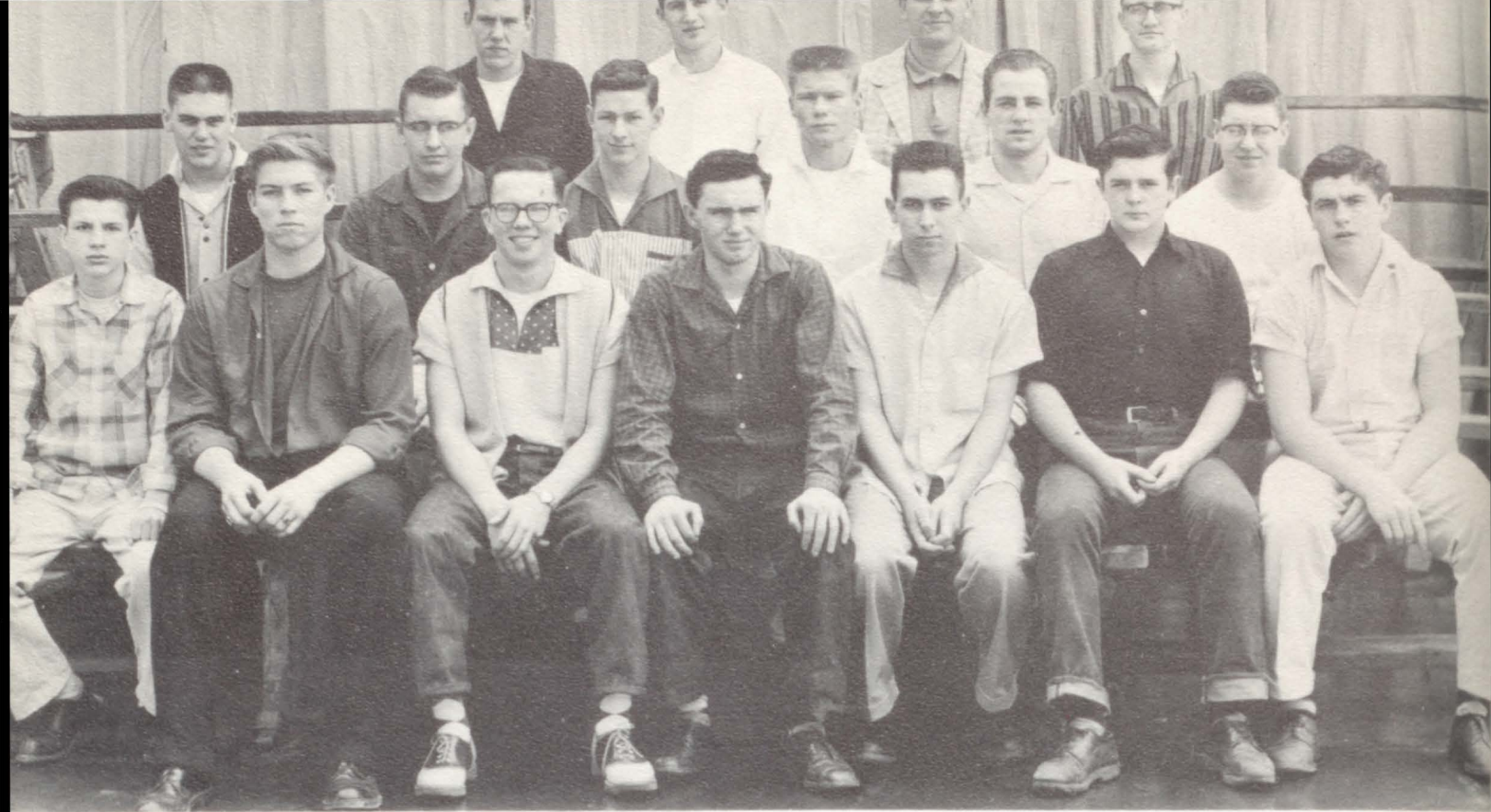
Evan Richey, Lebanon's football mentor, turned in a noticeably improved record this year of one win, two ties, and five losses.

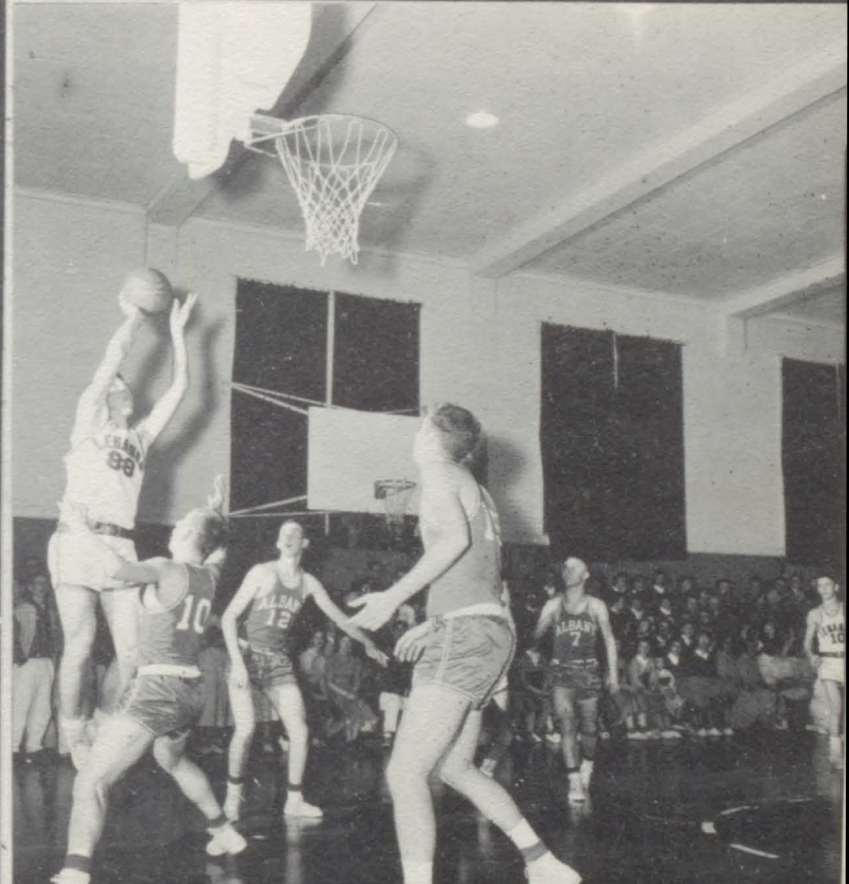
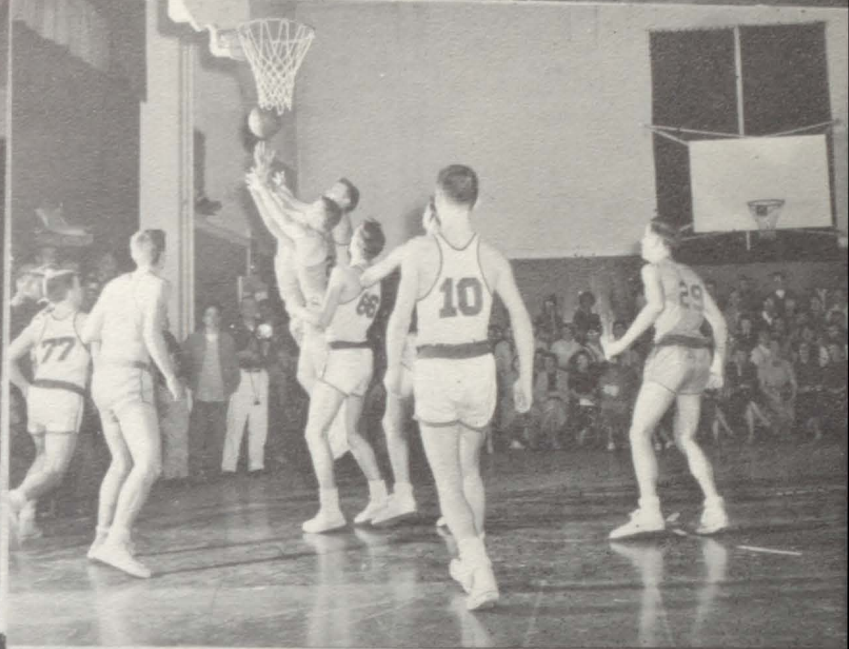
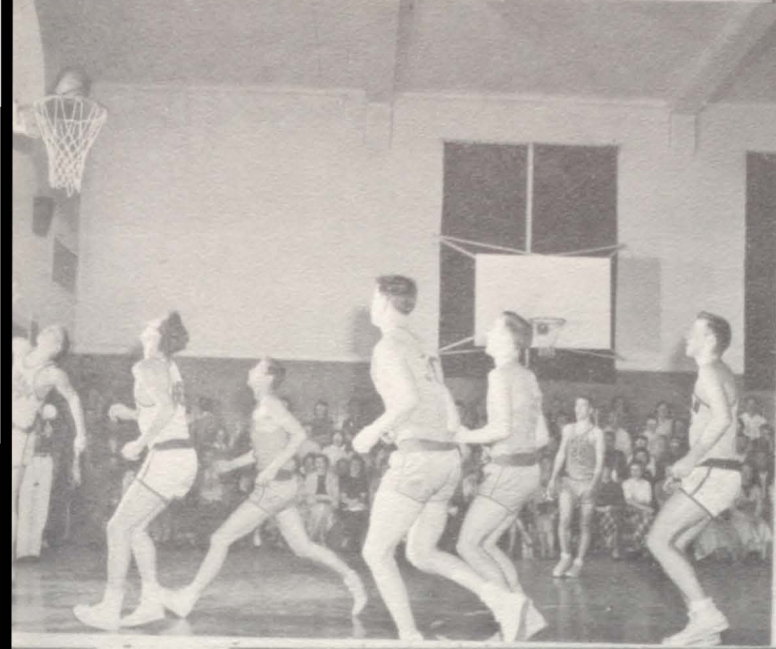
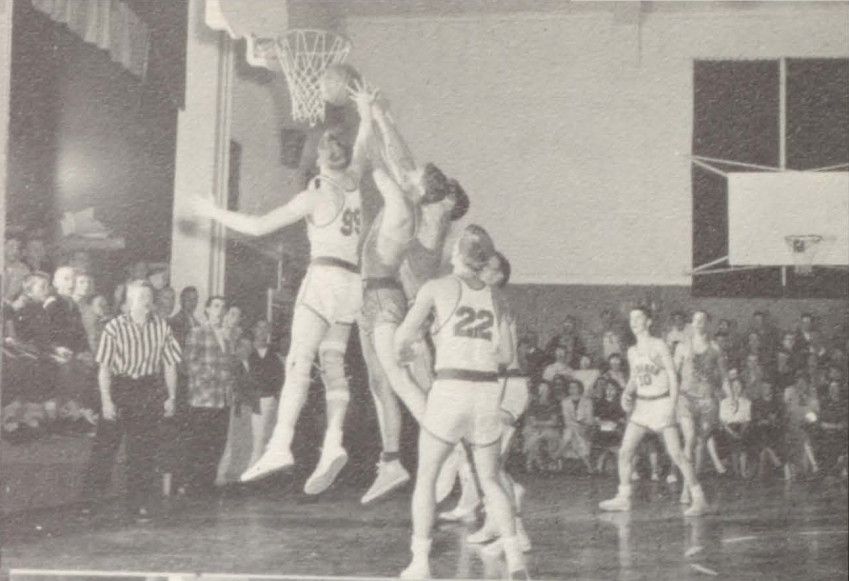
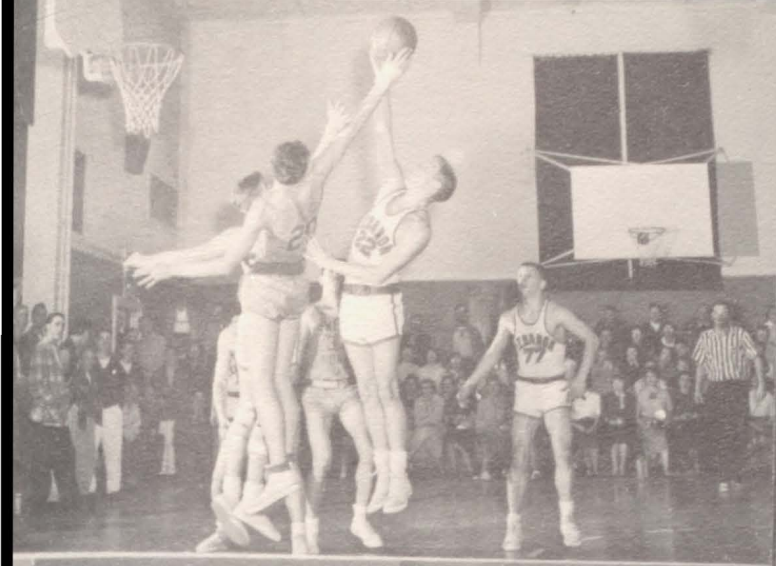
The freshmen gained the much needed experience in the skills of basketball which will help them to form a better team of future basketeers.

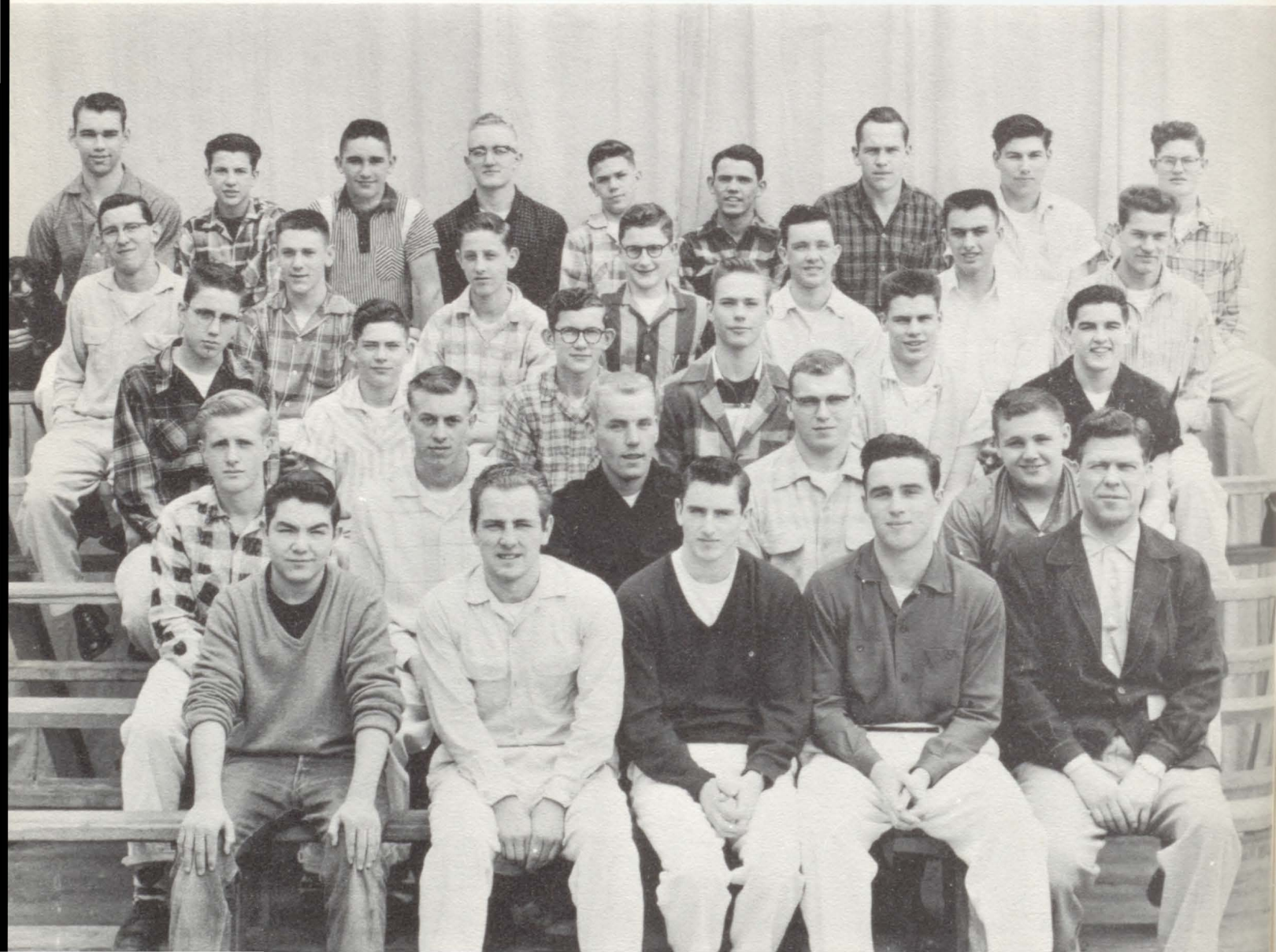

## Track

This year's Warrior track team, coached by Dale Reynolds and his assistant, Evan Richey, made a good record for itself, winning five meets and losing three.

Speaking of records, the Lebanon boys were certainly "in the groove." They broke 12 school records, nine in the JV and three in Varsity. Two Willamette Valley JV records were toppled by Lebanon boys, and also two district records.

The Willamette Relays, held at Salem, opened the track season. Every Lebanon relay team placed. Being in the top five of the 100 schools contesting was quite an honor.

Among the inter-school meets, there was one four-way meet and two triangular meets. In the four-way, Lebanon placed fourth by a close margin; they placed second in one triangular meet and defeated Corvallis and Sweet Home in the other by an eleven point margin.

The thin-clads swept over Stayton, a triumphant

51 points in the lead. Then in turn, they outperformed Dallas by eight and two-thirds points, and downed Sweet Home twice by 22 points the first time and 35 points the second.

Albany proved too much for the Warriors to handle and the Bulldogs won with a margin of ten points.

In the district meet Lebanon lagged to sixth place, having a total of 35 9/20 points. Also in the Willamette Valley JV meet, they were once again in sixth place having only 22 points to show.

Two Warriors, Jon Pattinson and Kent Wilcox, made the grade to the state meet. Pattinson contested with the javelin and shot put, having made new school records with both and a district record of 179 feet with the javelin. Wilcox ran in the 880 and also set a new school and district record of 2:00.2.
