Another first for the class of '59 was the sponsoring of the winter formal dance entitled, "Snowflake Flury," which was held on January 24.

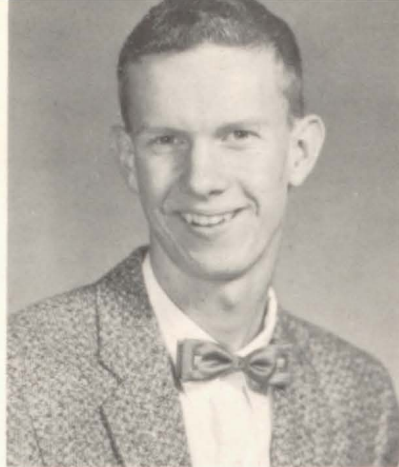

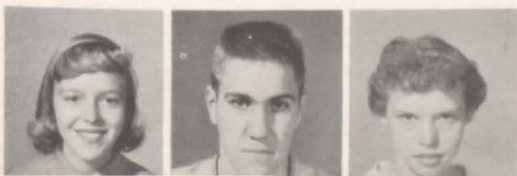

This year the Junior Class was very honored by the selection of Celene Christensen as Queen of Homecoming.

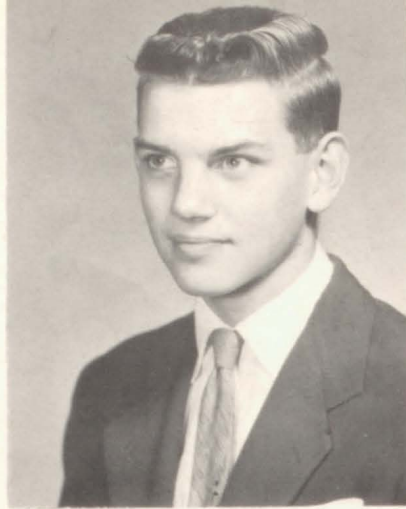
The class was also very proud of Carolyn Scott, who was selected to spend the summer in a foreign country.

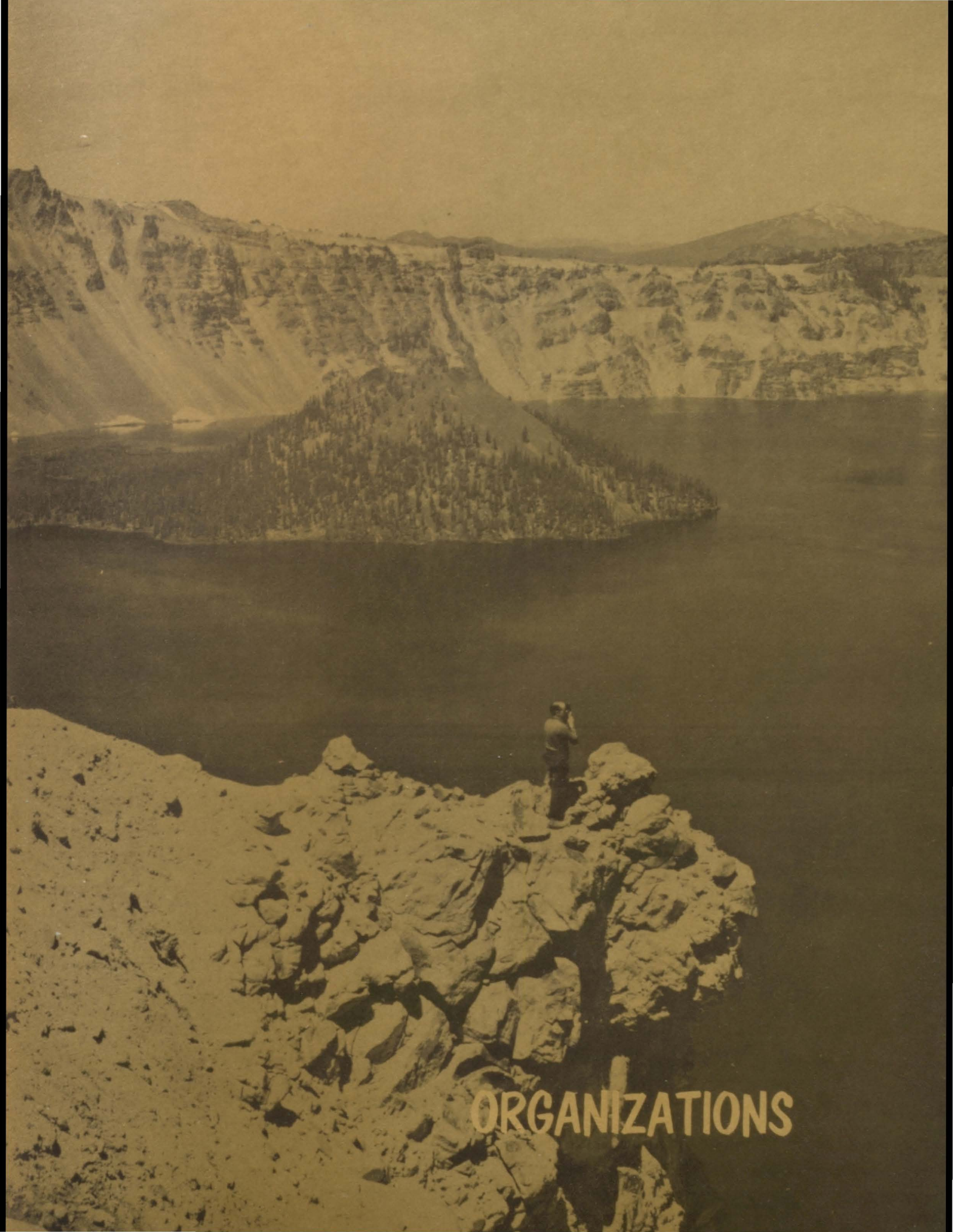
There was a large turnout for the "Get-acquainted Party" which was held on the twelfth of December. Everyone had a good time dancing to the recorded music of Dick Peterson.

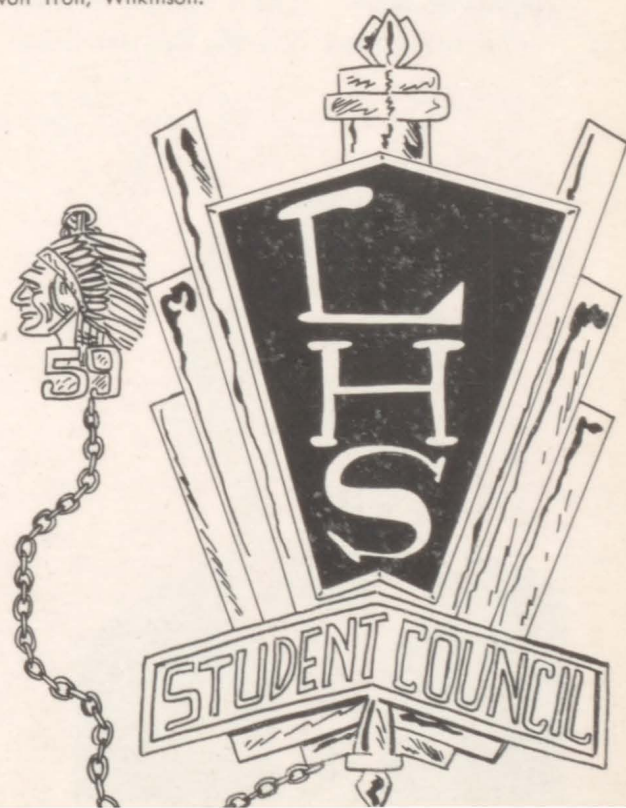

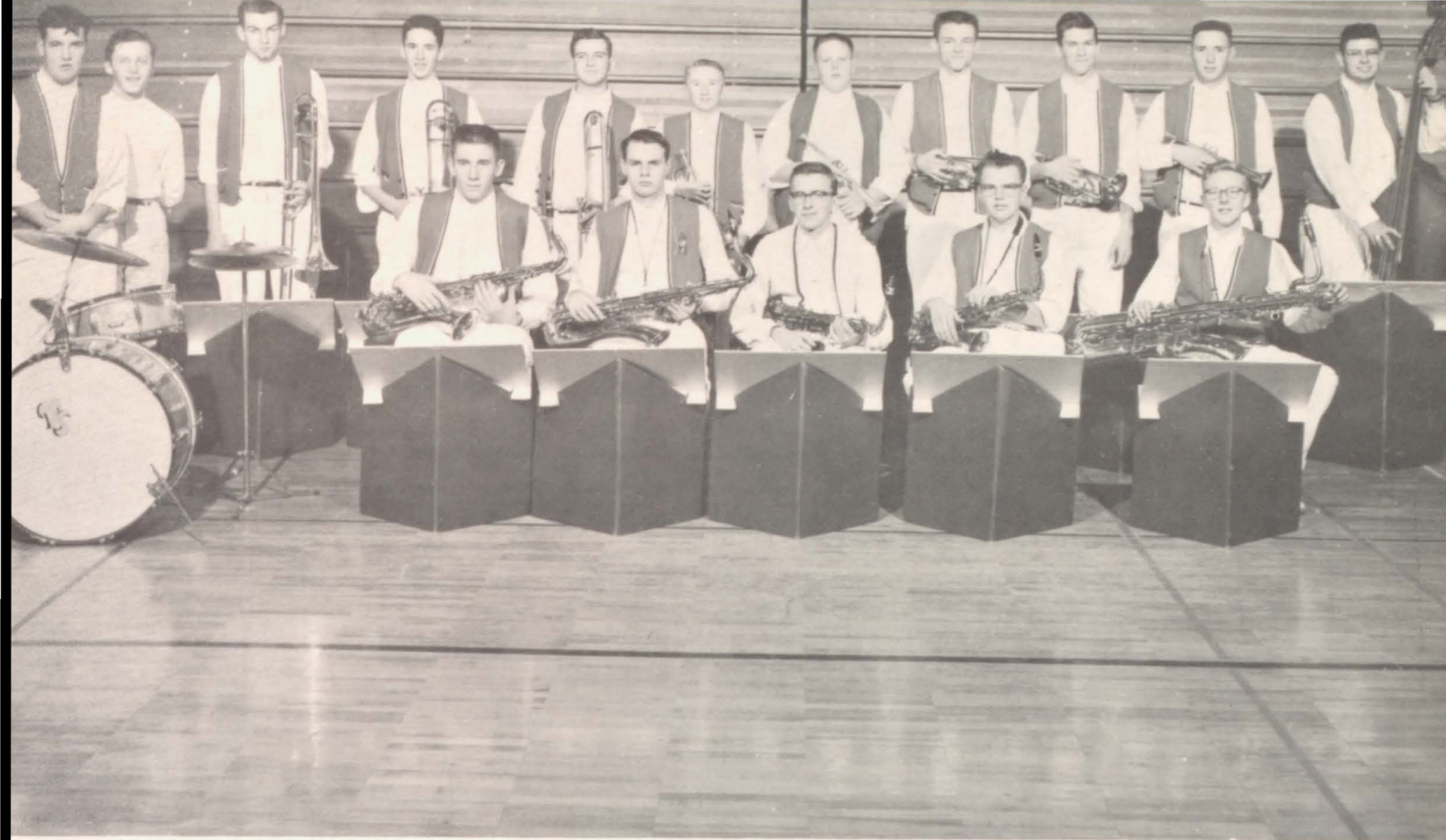

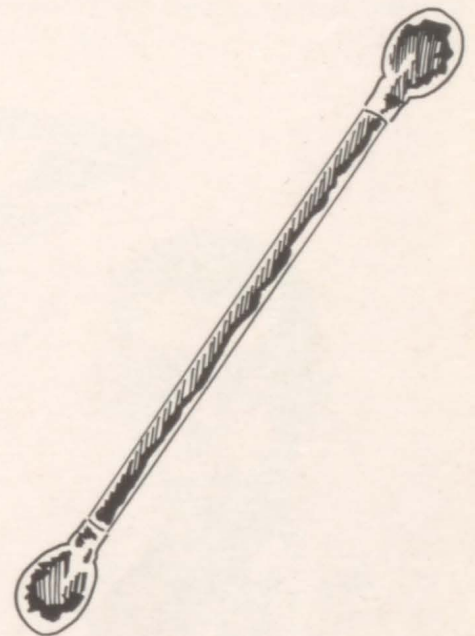

SWING BAND

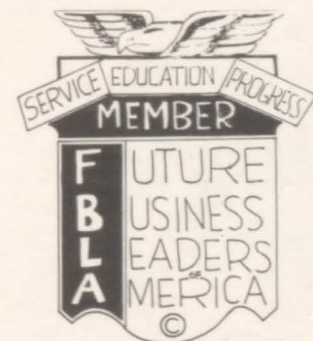

Mr. Thompson, an antamologist, showed his films and gave a very interesting account of his visit to Iran. It was thoroughly enjoyed by all.

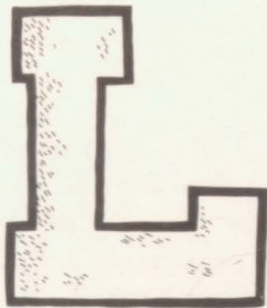
