It is with mixed emotions that we leave Lebanon Union High School. We truly hope each class that follows us will maintain the care and high standards we have tried to achieve.

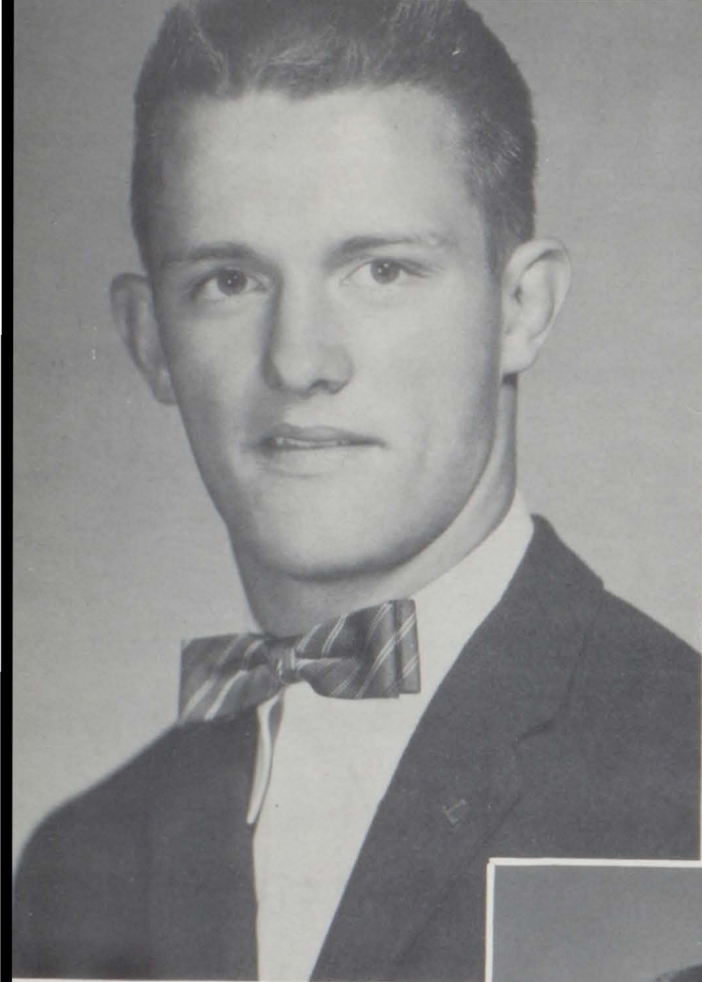




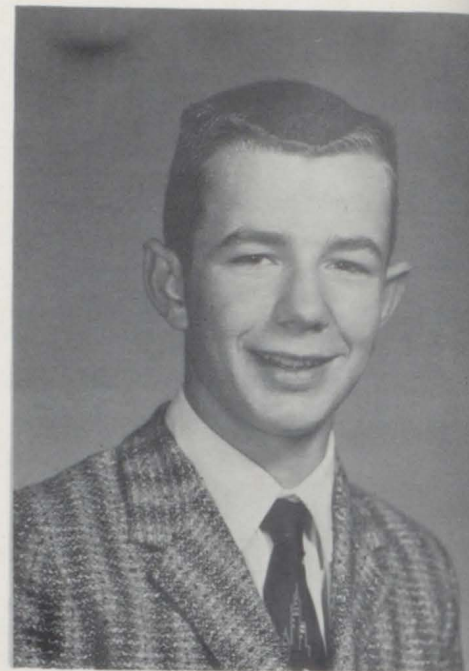

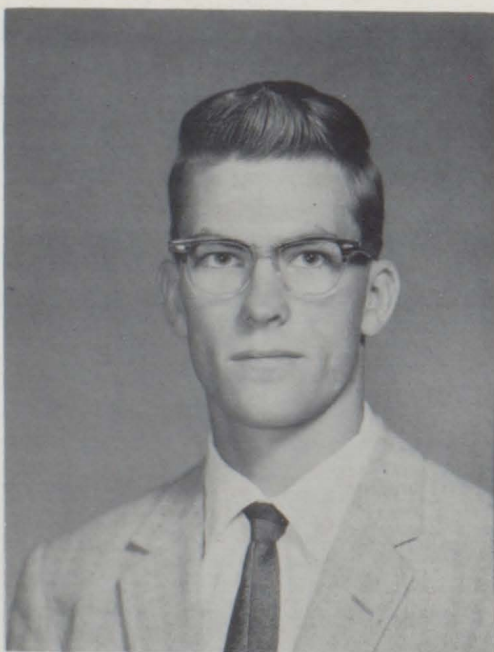
## Band

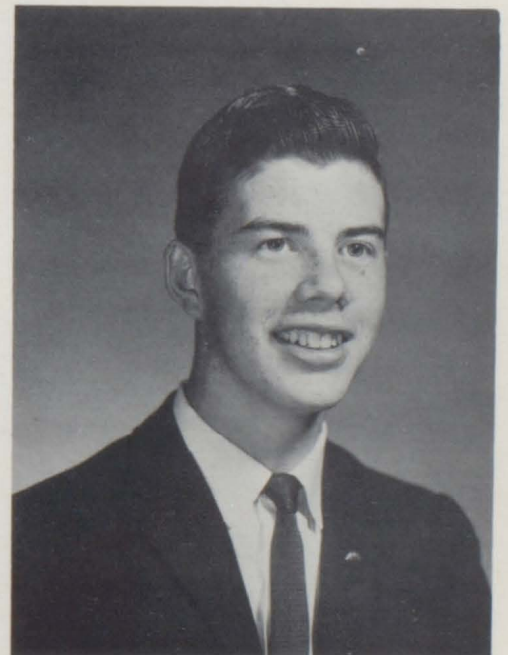
## I. A. C.

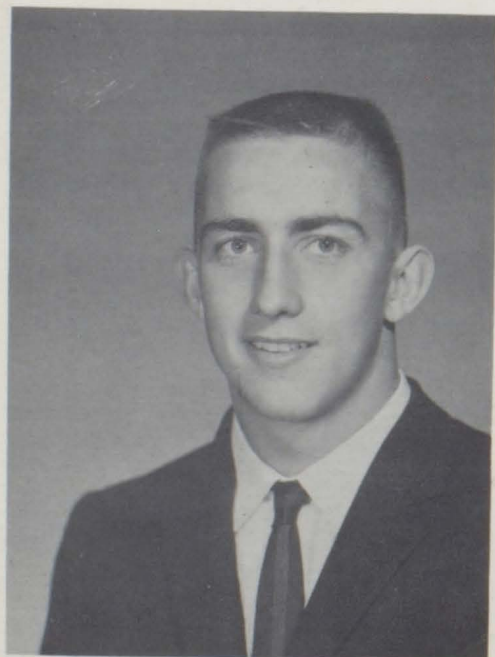

The members and all the officers have worked very hard this year and have enjoyed its many activities.



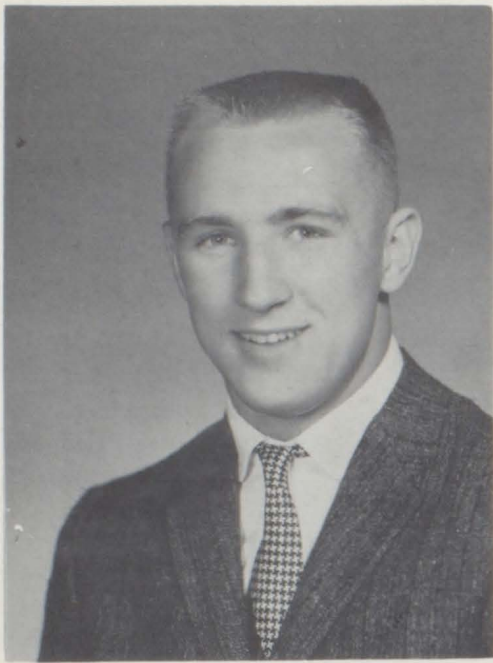

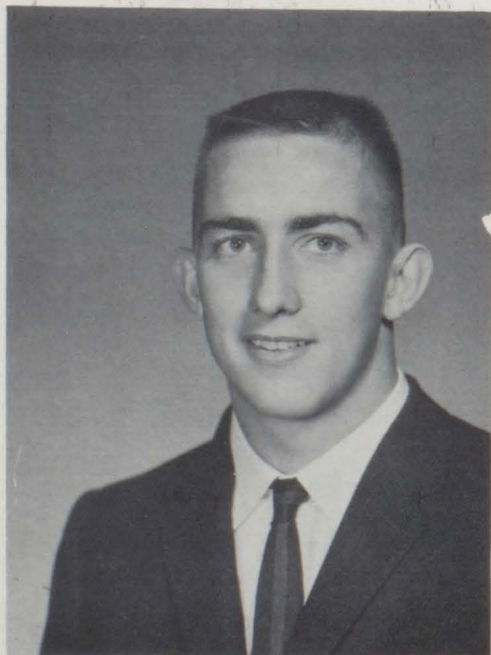

The purpose of this club is to acquaint students with the retailing profession. This is done by on the job training and proper education in the classroom.

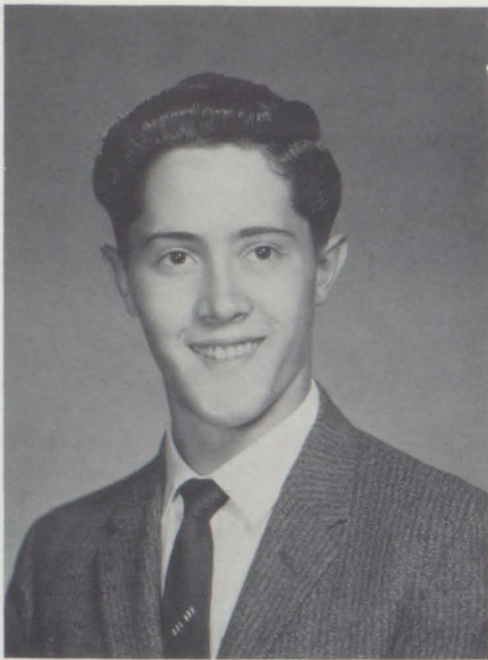
We, as a club and a class, while in the study of advertising, went to different stores. At these different stores we obtained information on the cost, type, and purpose of that particular store's advertising.
