To the Class of 1962:


May I express to you, the Class of 1962, my sincere congratulations on the completion of your high school education. We are proud of your accomplishments and of your contribution to your school and your community life.

Best of luck to all, and may all your years be as profitable as this one.

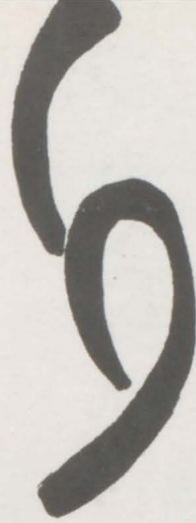

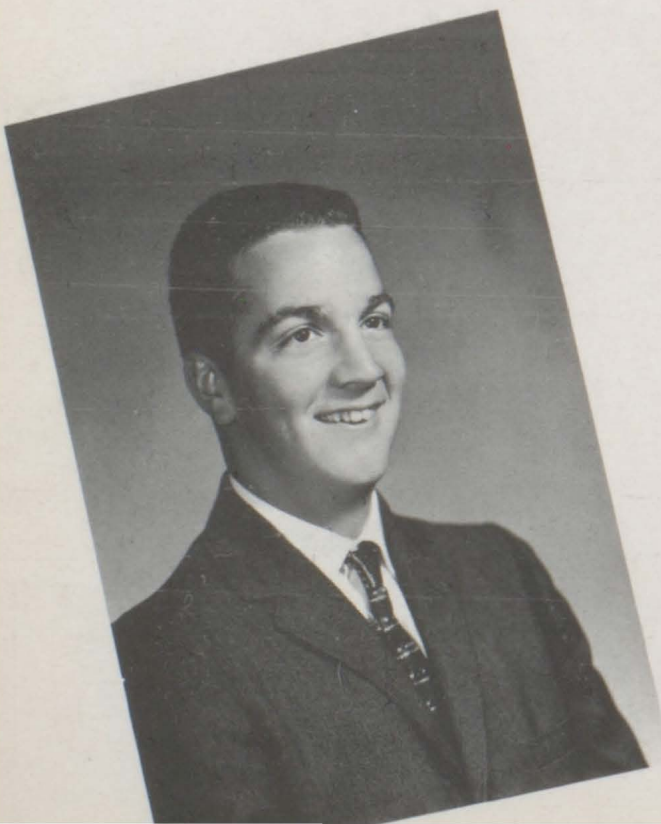
Biology Club

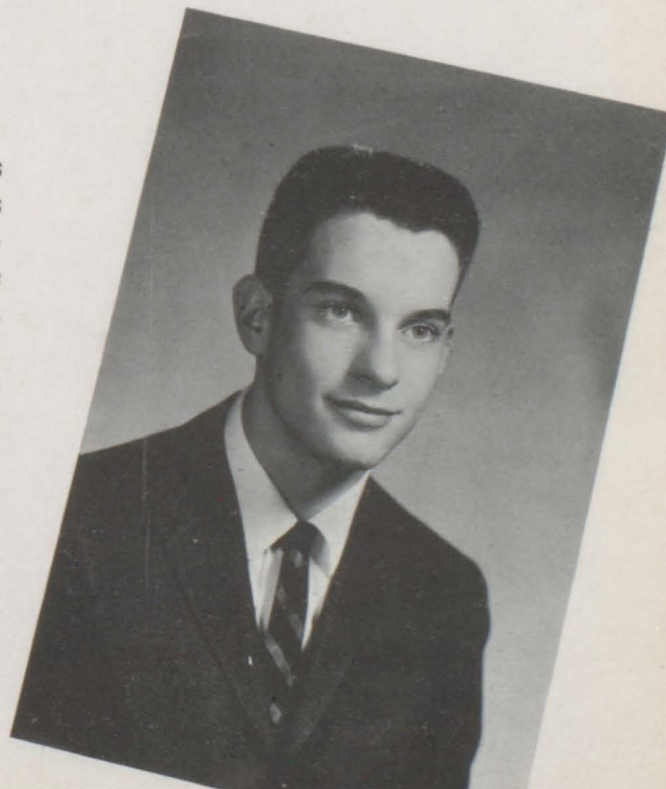

Concert Choir, under able direction, has had a very successful year. Several concerts were presented to the public.

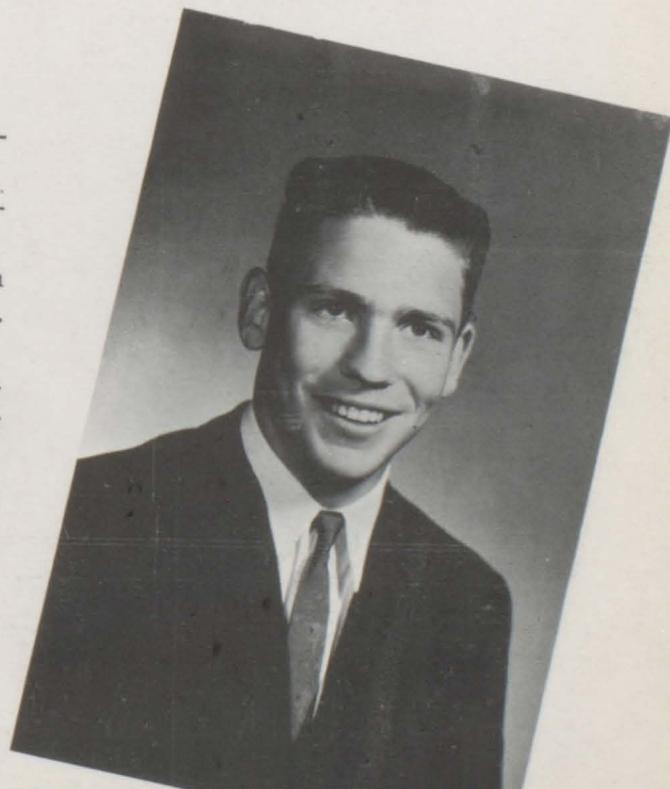

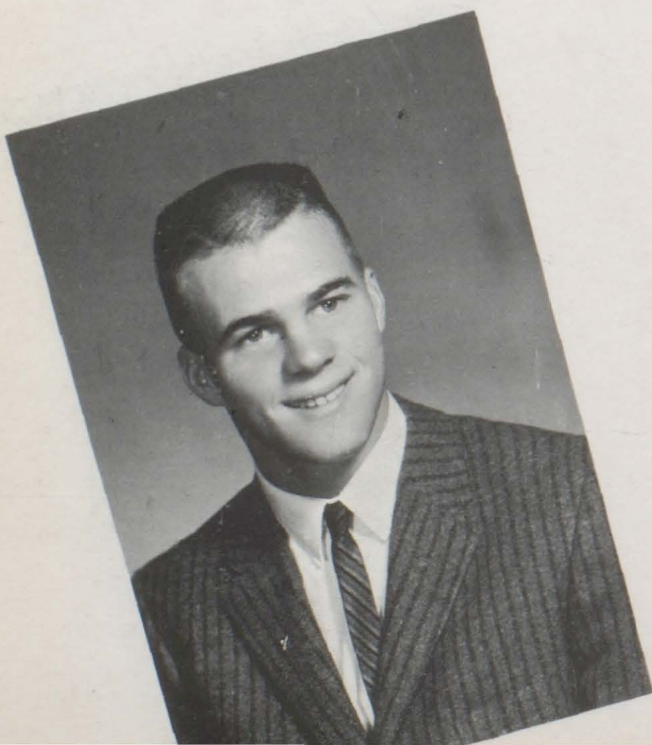
The purpose of Hi-Y is to create, maintain, and extend throughout the school and community a high standard of Christian character.

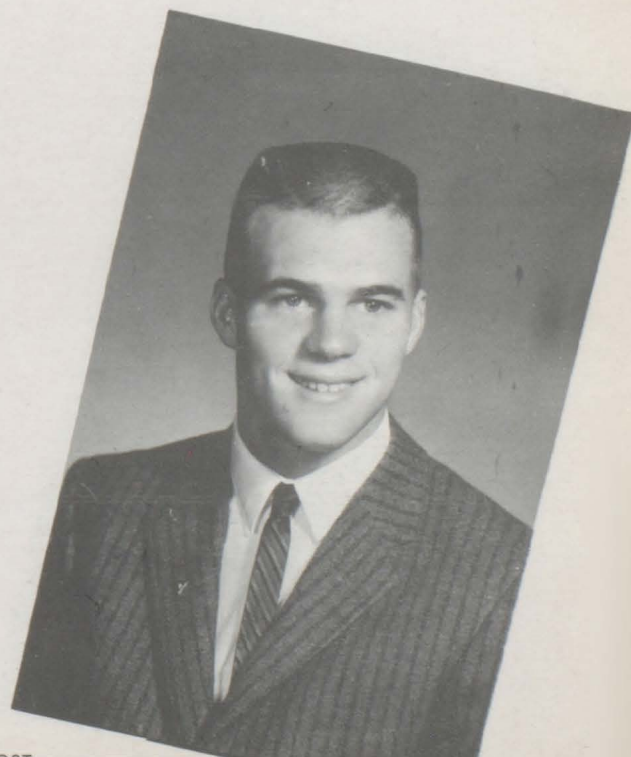

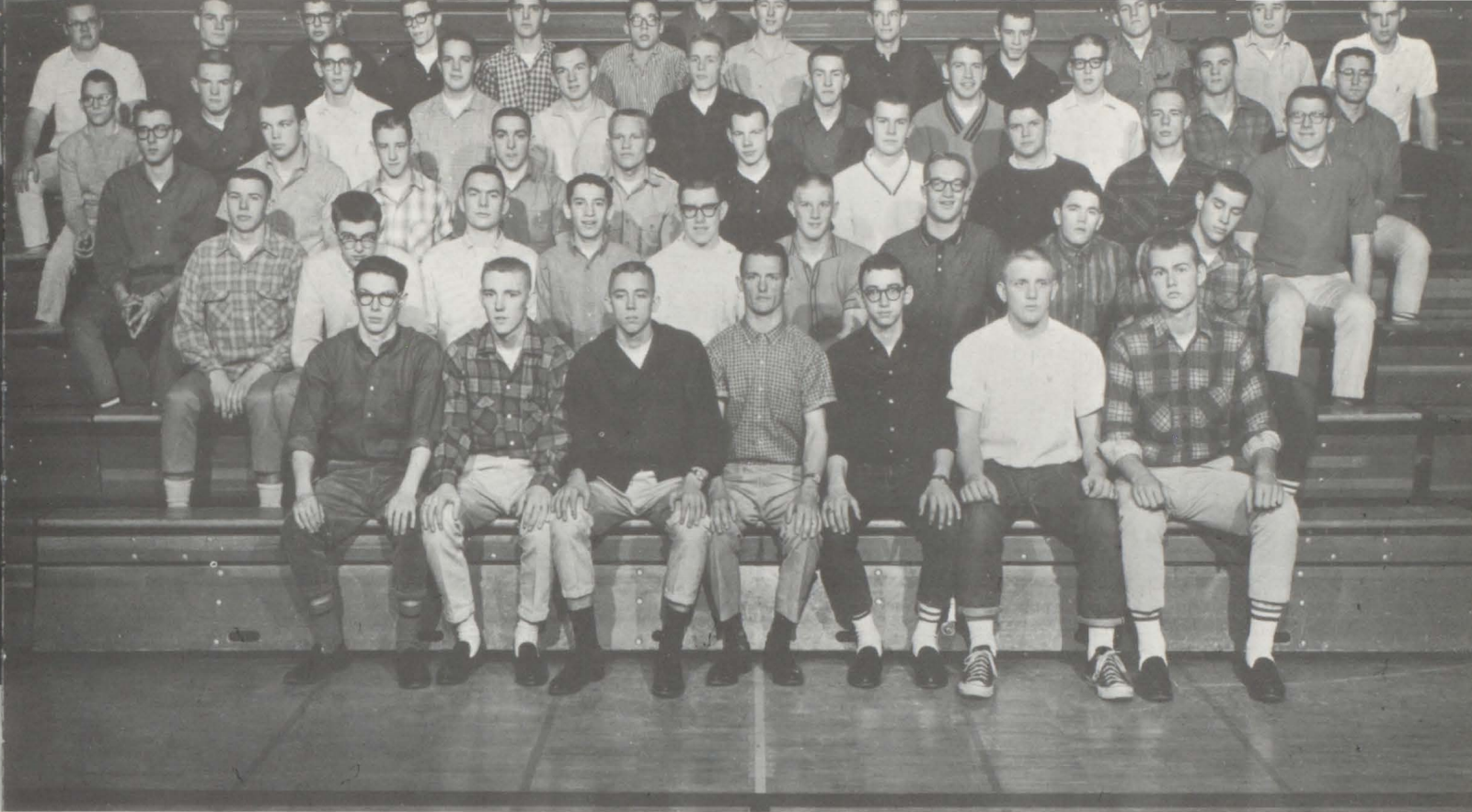

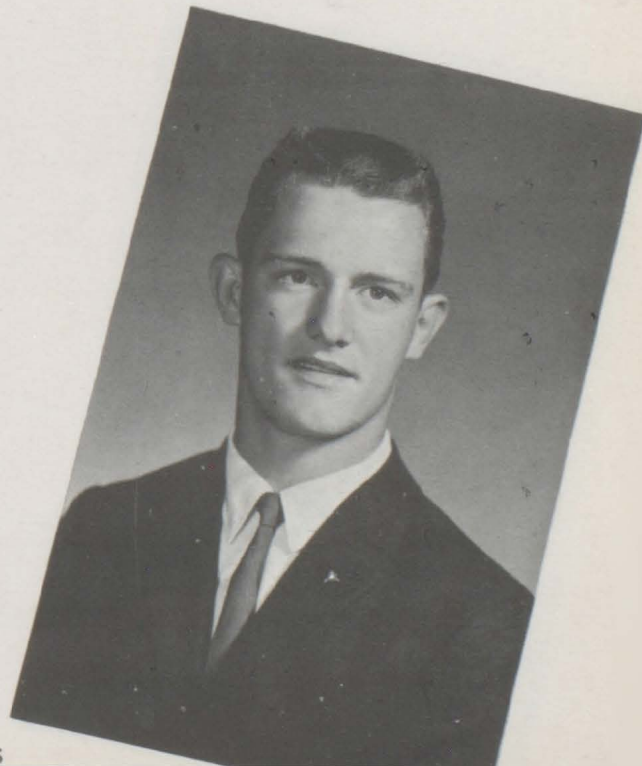
Letterman's Club

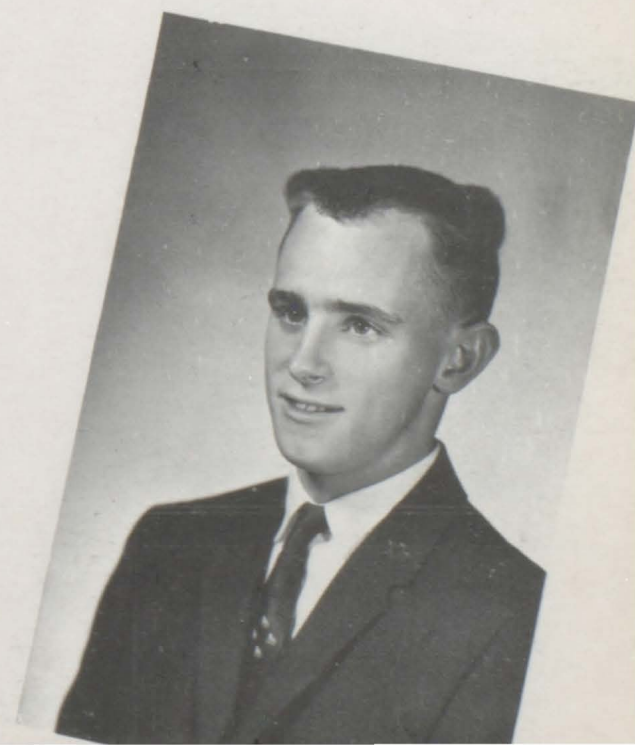

National Honor Society

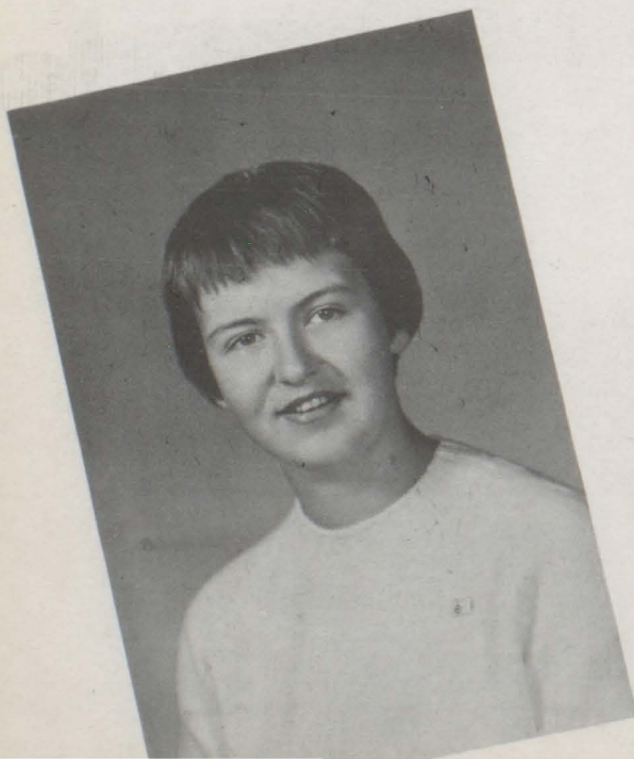

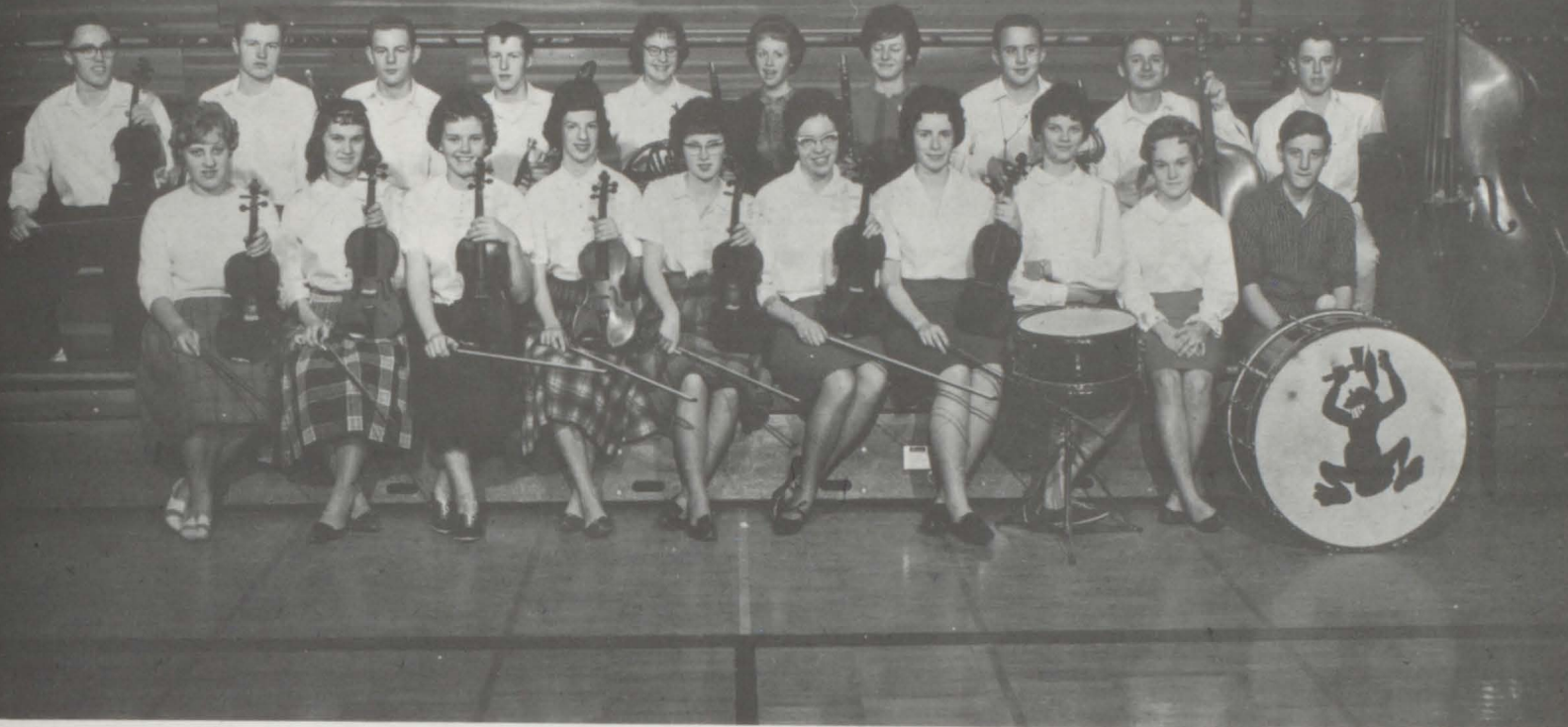

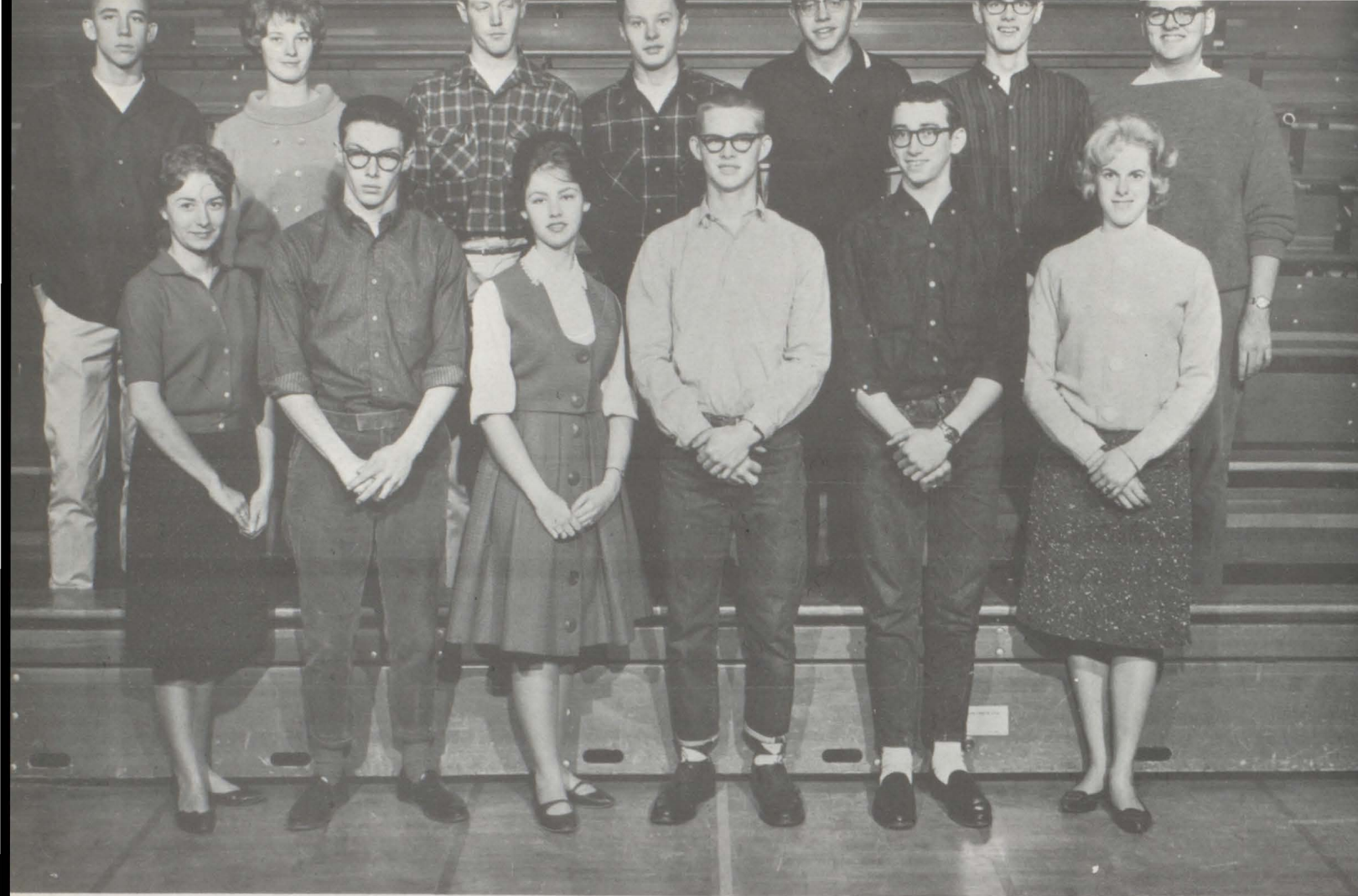
Paletteers

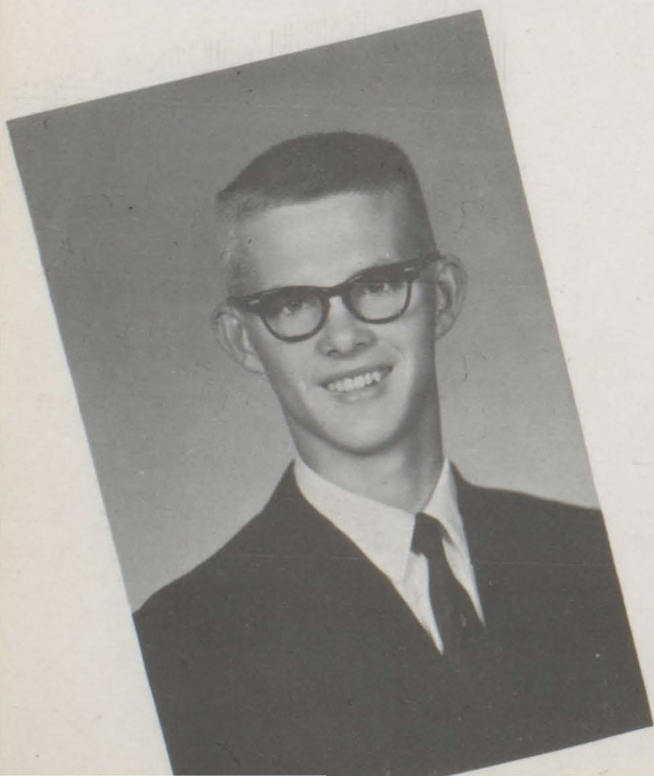
S.P.O.T. Club
