
May I express to you, the Class of 1962, my sincere congratulations on the completion of your high school education. We are proud of your accomplishments and of your contribution to your school and your community life.


Biology Club was organized for the purpose of promoting interest in the field of biology. The club membership is open to all who are especially interested in this field and wish to participate in club work.


The purpose of this organization is to foster sportsmanship and school spirit, act as a service club for the students and school and to represent the school with a high standard of ethical conduct.


Science Club



The new telescope has stirred much interest among the members and they are eager to use it. The club plans to demonstrate projects at local grade schools later this year.




