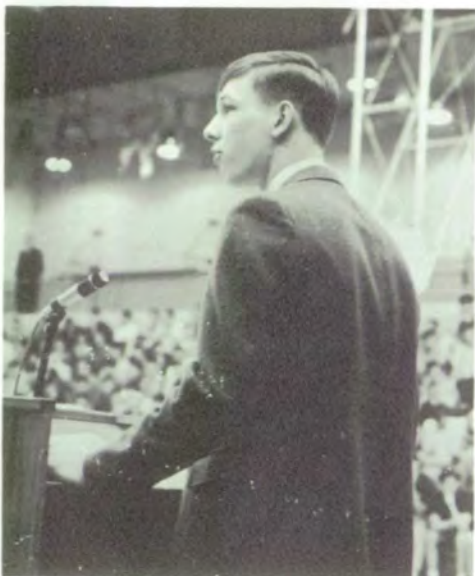

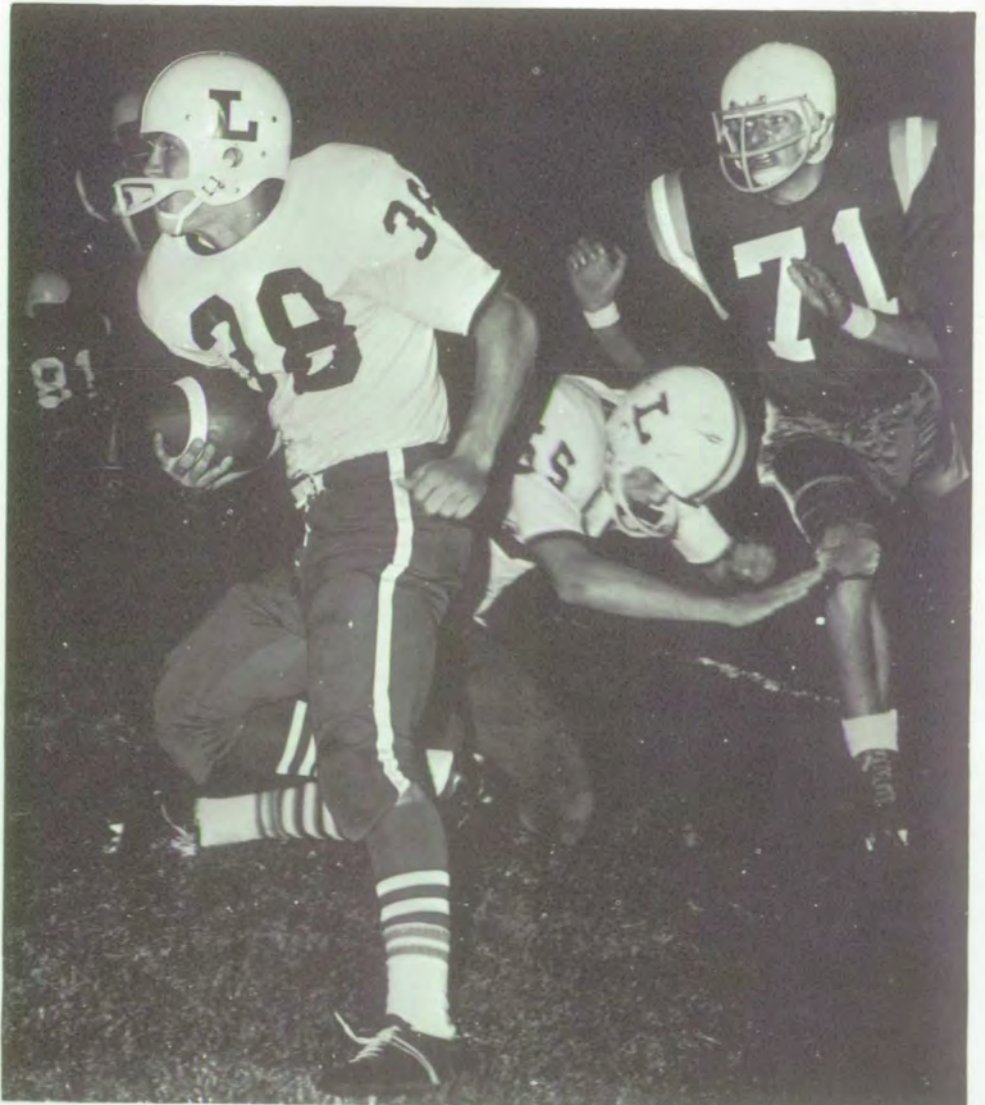

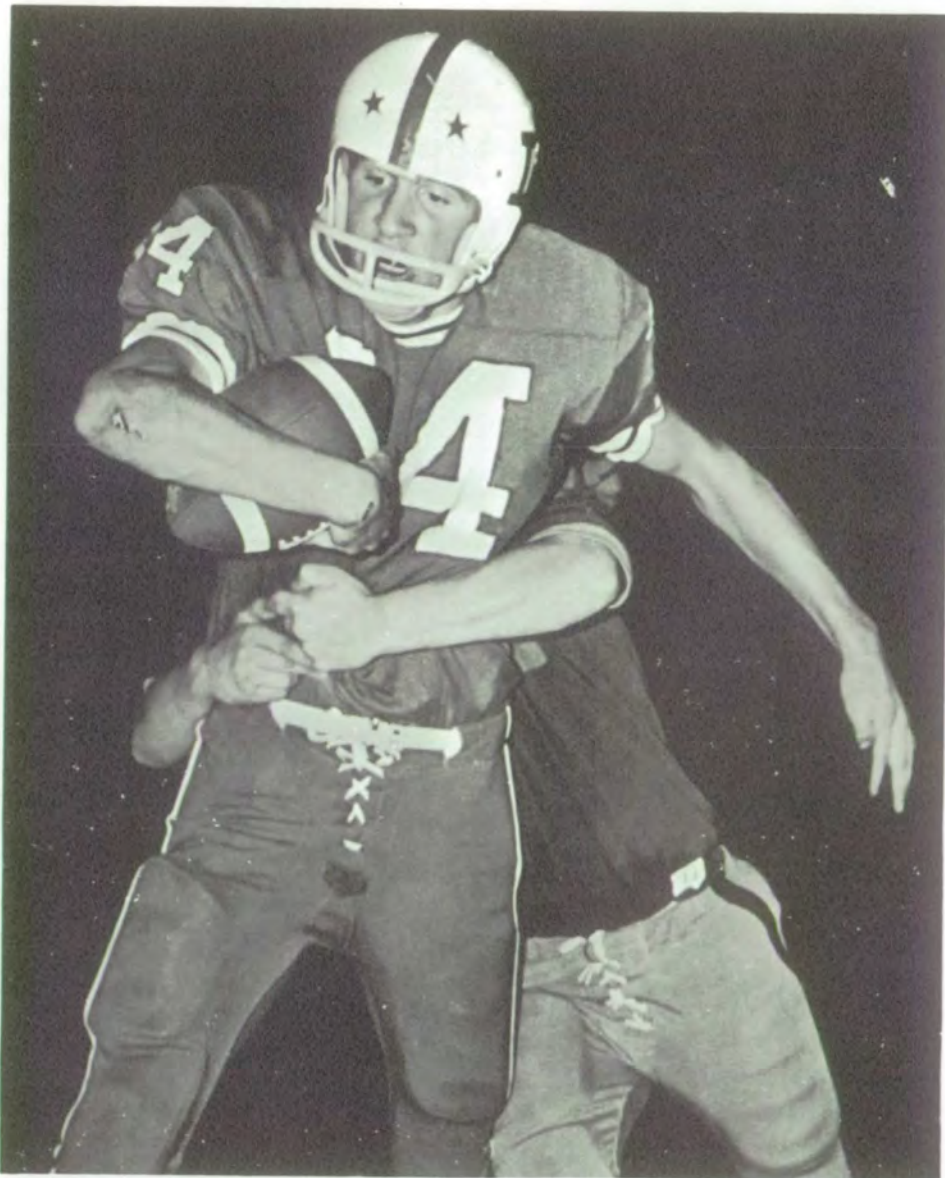

Grapplers Sport 11-1 Dual Meet Record

Coach Dick Weisbrodt has produced many individual and team champions, but the 1965-66 season may have been one of the most fruitful years ever. Finishing fourth in the state tournament, the Warriors proudly boast of their dual meet victories over third place finisher Corvallis, 27-20, the second place Cavemen of Grants Pass, 30-19 (the first dual meet loss Grants Pass had suffered in five year), and their sole season loss to state champion David Douglas, 27-26. Other dual meet wins included victories over such perennial powerhouses as Madison of Portland (27-21), Hillsboro (38-16), Canby (26-21), and Sweet Home (36-19). The Warriors were once more district dual meet champions because of their undefeated season in league competition. The only loss absorbed on the home mats by the grapplers was a 26-0 dual meet loss at the hands of the traveling Japanese team. These young Oriental lads were the national champions of Japan and their presence in Lebanon was an honor in itself.

Individually, as well as team-wise, the Warriors fielded a strong contingent. Rick Mailloux became a two-time state champion and sported a perfect 26-0 record. Gary Thompson placed second in the state and had a 21-4 slate which included 19 pins. Heavyweight Fred Jaross, despite an influenza attack, finished fourth in the state and registered a 19-4 record that included 16 falls. Sophomore Jim Crumley failed to place in state but did battle his way to the District 8 A-1 "outstanding wrestler" award and a district championship.

Crumley will return to the Tribe's mats next year along with many other sophomores and juniors in an effort to top the excellent 1965-66 wrestling record.

Reynolds runners fashioned another fine season for themselves by "running up" a handsome 6 win 2 loss dual and triangular meet record. The sophomore-laden cinder team suffered only two defeats in dual meet competition and both of those losses were identical 70-61 setbacks at the hands of Corvallis and Albany. 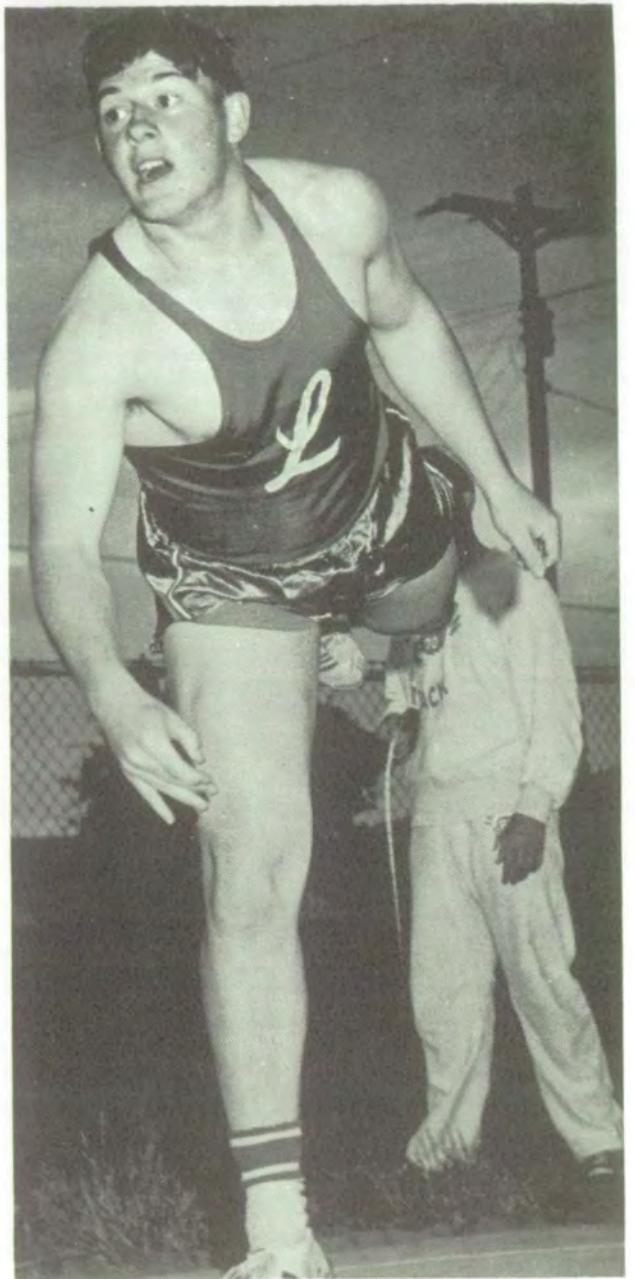
