The Warriors finally set out for the State tournament held at Gill Collisium. Running into rough wrestling, Dan Speasl was the single wrestler left to compete in the second day. Speasl won his Semi-final match and earned a chance at the State Championship. Speasl finished second, leaving no Warriors in the top ten. Though, the Warriors did not place in State, they did beat Newberg twice, North Bend and Redmond who all placed in the top five at State.

The Warriors were hindered all year by injuries which began with Bob Chandler nursing a football injury and Dan Calahan out because of a knee injury early in the season. Duane Ray and Keith Olmstead also with knee injuries returned to the Warrior lineup later in the season. Dalton Johnson suffered a seperated shoulder and was unable to compete in the District Tournament.

The Warriors look forward to a young team next year for they lose nine seniors. Returning lettermen, however, will be Steve Ditterick, Bob May, Jon Powell, Gary Dahl, Dalton Johnson, Kurt Fritz, Duane Ray, Mark Cox, and Joe Egner pointing to a potentially great future.
