














Registration

Registration involved two new procedures for returning students and faculty, pre-registration by new arena scheduling and final registration when students return for the next year.

Arena scheduling was held on May 17, of last year so that student classes could be organized before the school year began. Homecoming


Homecoming began with many shouts of excitement as students worked hard to complete their floats before gametime.

The fall production of "Antigone" was presented in the auditorium, November 20, 21, and 22. The Greek drama was adapted to French by Jean Anouilh and translated into English by Lewis Galentiere.

To give the play more impact, actors remained motionless on stage while the audience was being seated. No curtains were used and blue lighting cast the entire area in shadow. All acting was done on four different levels of platforms, and most of the stage was draped in black burlap.

Antigone was first performed during the German occupation of Paris in WWII. The strong moral of the story, echoed the French underground's motto of saying "no," even when saying no means death.





Eugene Ionesco was a modern playright who experimented with the theater. He believed that the message a play conveyed was more important than plot or character. Only by following the actions of the players could the audience see or feel the message. Ionesco felt this to be a sign of thinking and communicating. This unusual effect created many questions for the audience.

In "The Chairs" an old man and an old woman have hired an orator to deliver their message to mankind. After inviting many friends and public officials, the ole man and the old woman feel that their lives are fulfilled and they commit suicide. 









Academics




Administration



Instructional Resources

The Instructional Resource Center contained a useful library and an area where audiovisual material and equipment was on loan to students and teachers. Films, books, and other materials were filed on over 202,500 three by five index cards.

The audiovisual department had many films and records available. Over 825 hours of film were shown in school, helping students to better understand concepts taught to them.

More than 82,142 student hours were spent using the library-media center, and over 15,000 peices of material were checked out for further study.



They were responsible for making repairs, remodeling, and construction. Some of their achievements were repairing restrooms, adding on more offices, and building new classrooms in the English department.


Groundsmen performed such duties as mowing lawns and landscaping while the warehouseman controlled school property.





The addition of computers was an educational boon. These machines gave students the ability to solve difficult problems quickly with less error.













Special Education



Everyone, including the teacher, Mr. Kilborn, were treated equal as each humanitarian is to each humanitarian.




Guest speakers highlighted noon Bible Club meetings. Topics included religious practices in foreign countries, in different denominations, and the experiences of local people.



In April a banquet was held to honor a sponsoring employee and employer of the year. These were chosen for their interest and concern for D.E.C.A.






Officials' Club entered its second active year providing a service to the community by officiating athletic events.

Self expression describes the Thespian Troupe best. In theater there are many ways to accomplish this. Acting, lights, make-up, and set construction are open to both old and new talent.








The Brave Squad played an aggressive, gangtackling style of defense finishing the season with a 5-4 record.

With the experience they acquired playing junior varsity, many of these gridders will step in and help future squads.




Under the guidance of first year coaches, Nancy Harle and Mike Coury, gymnastics was turned into a year-round project with practice being extended to include summer months.











Led by head coach Dick Weisbrodt and assistants Don Carroll and Gary Yates, the Warriors proved to be a team of competitors.


The Warriors always seemed to be more aggressive than their foes who would stall at times.

Freshman Steve Weisbrodt was the only Warrior to be a district champion. He became the first in the history of the meet to be champion as a freshman.








J.V. Wrestling

These athletes should step up the line and get the district title back to Lebanon.























Dear Friends,






