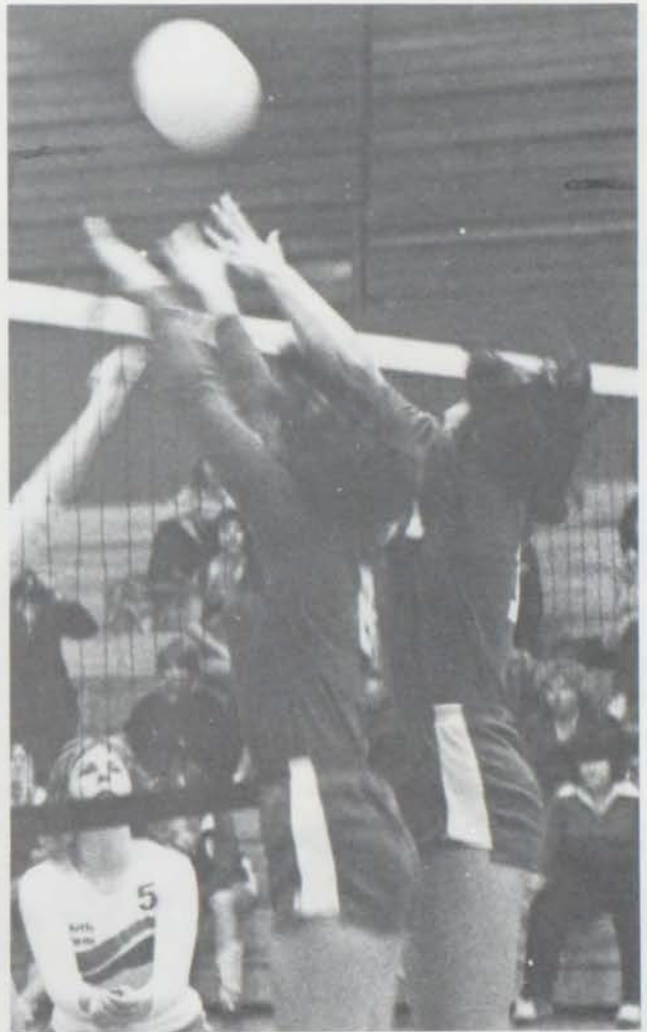

After defeating Corvallis for the first time in 12 years, the Warriors were looking toward a Valley League Championship. They were not disappointed as the team achieved 8-1 league record and captured the Valley League Championship.

Now it was on to the State playoffs. The Warriors opened their debut by thrashing the Marshfield Pirates, 14-0.

Next they travelled to Ontario where they squeezed by the Tigers, 14-6.

In the quarter finals Lebanon met third ranked and previously undefeated Forest Grove. The Warriors ended the Vikings season early, demolishing them by a score of 34-0.

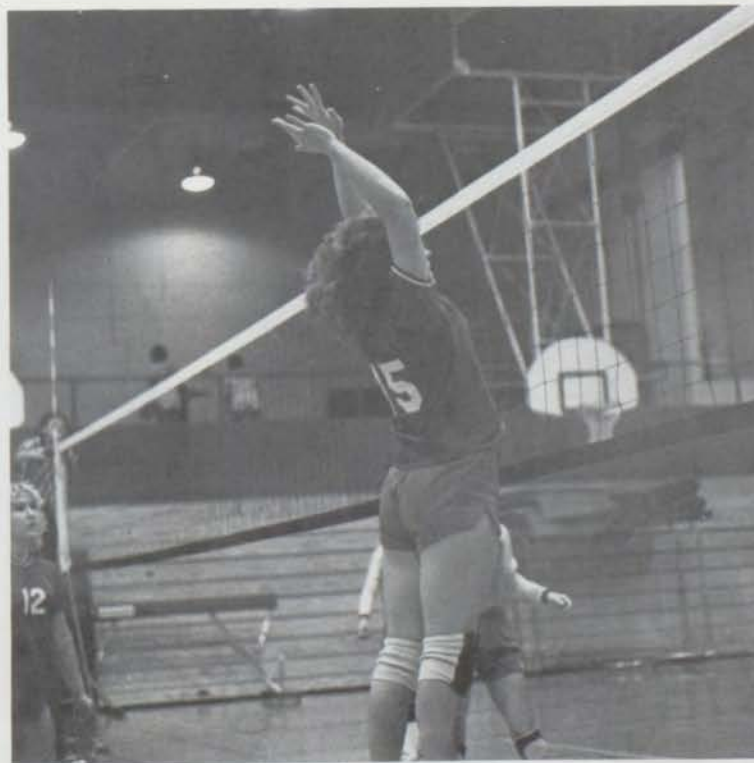

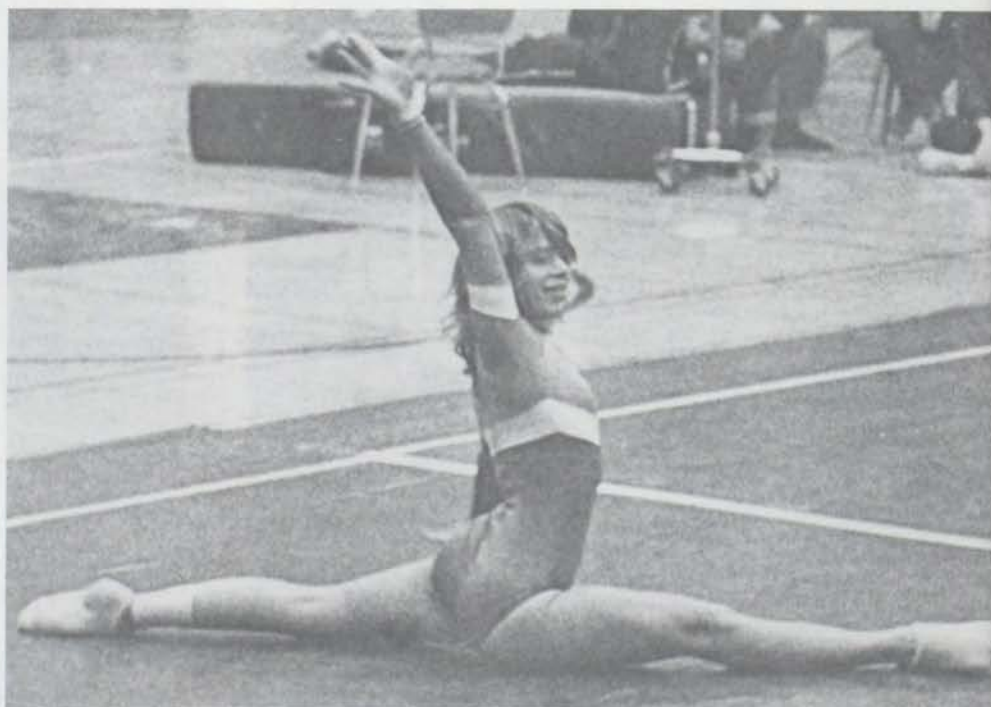

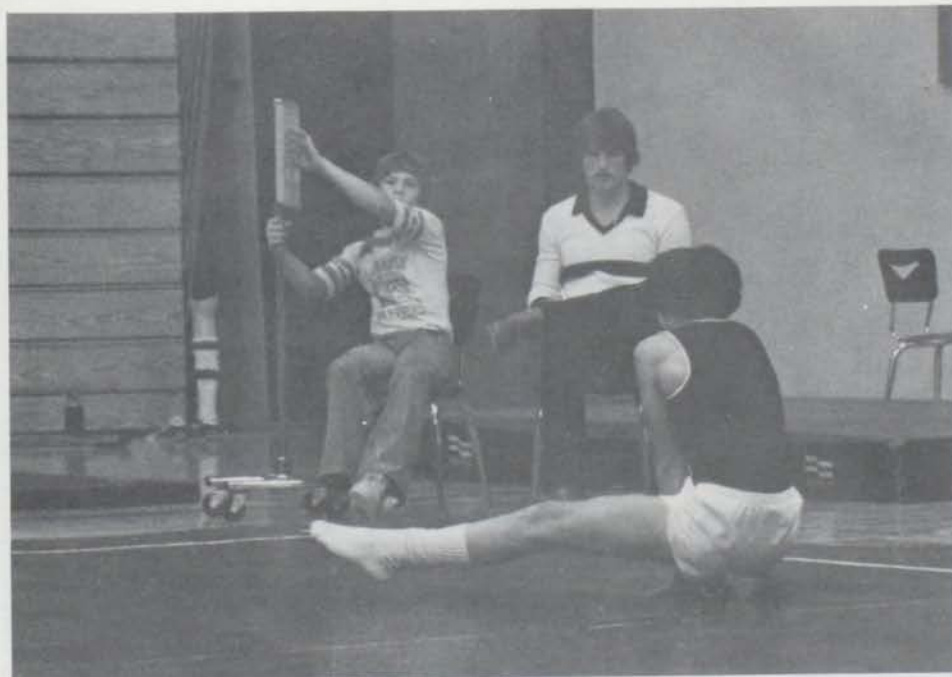

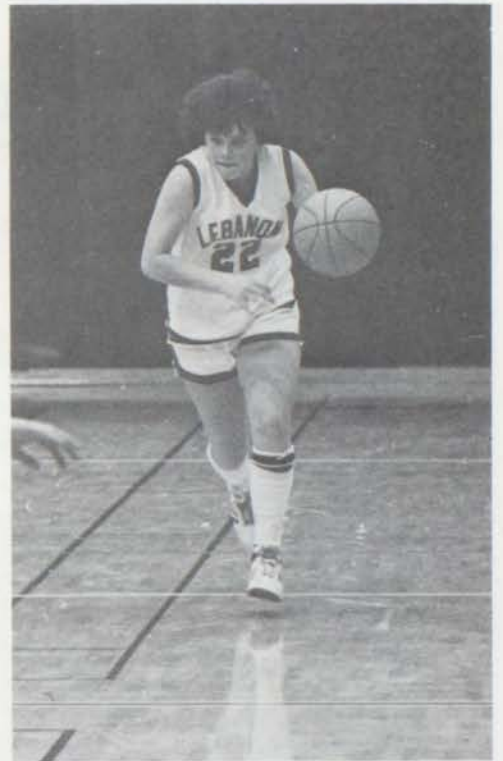

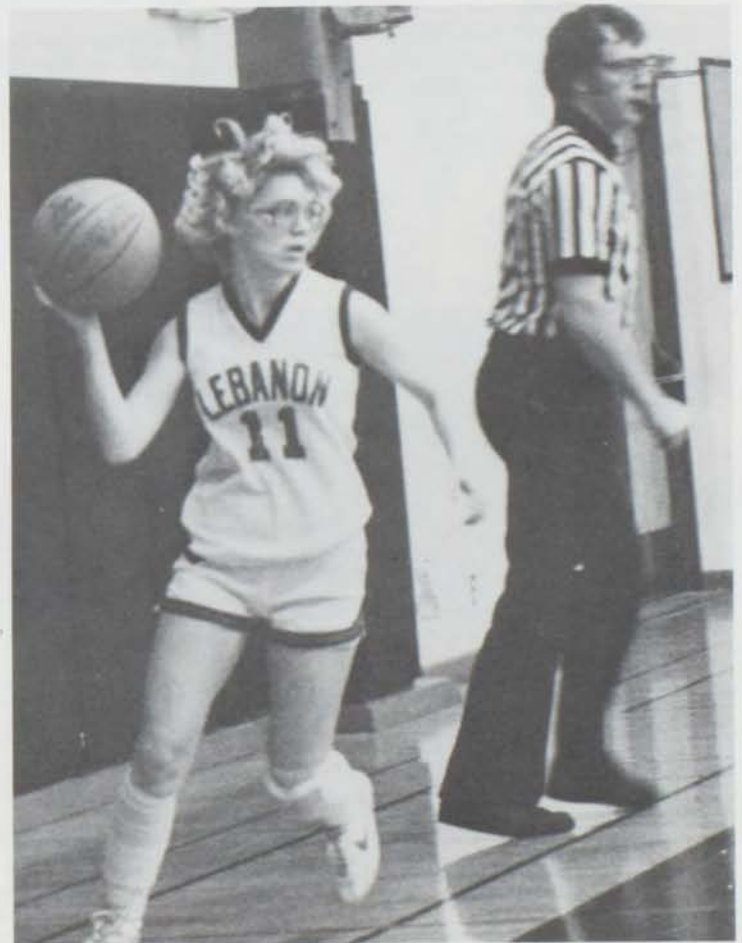

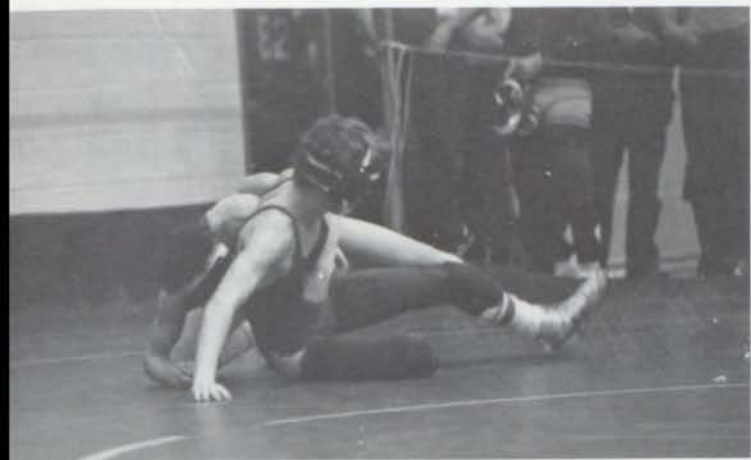

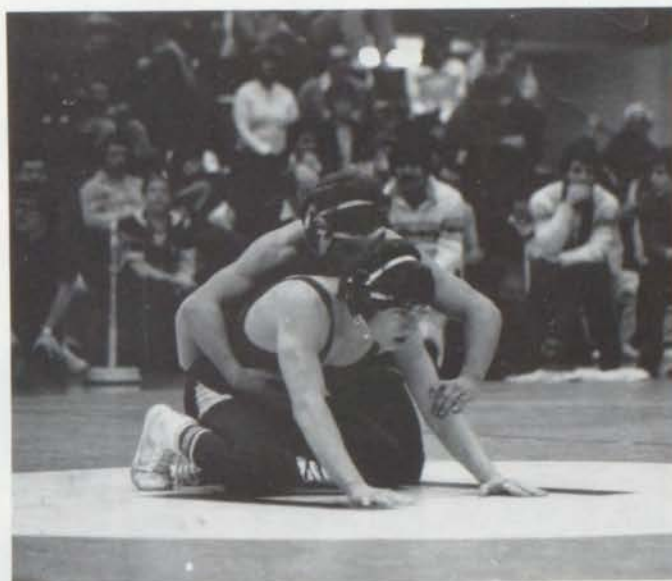

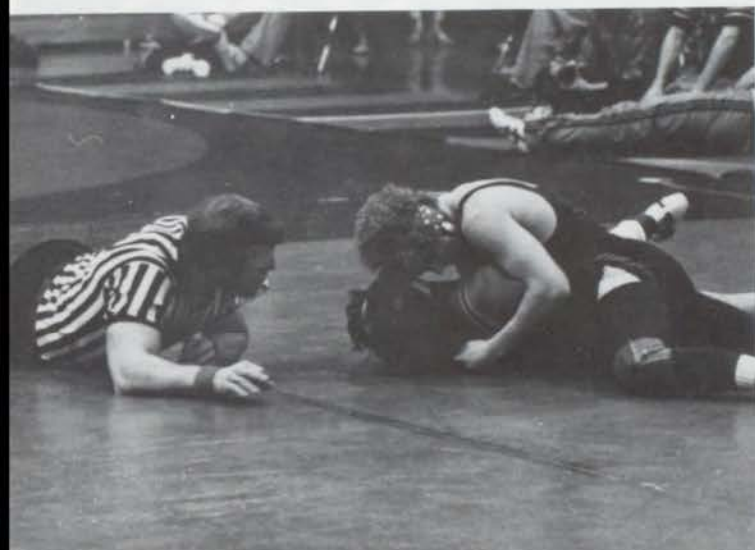

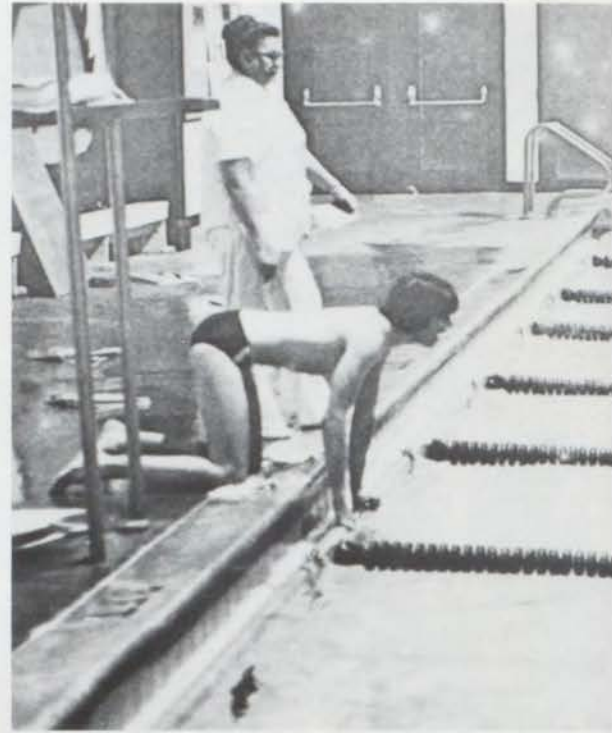

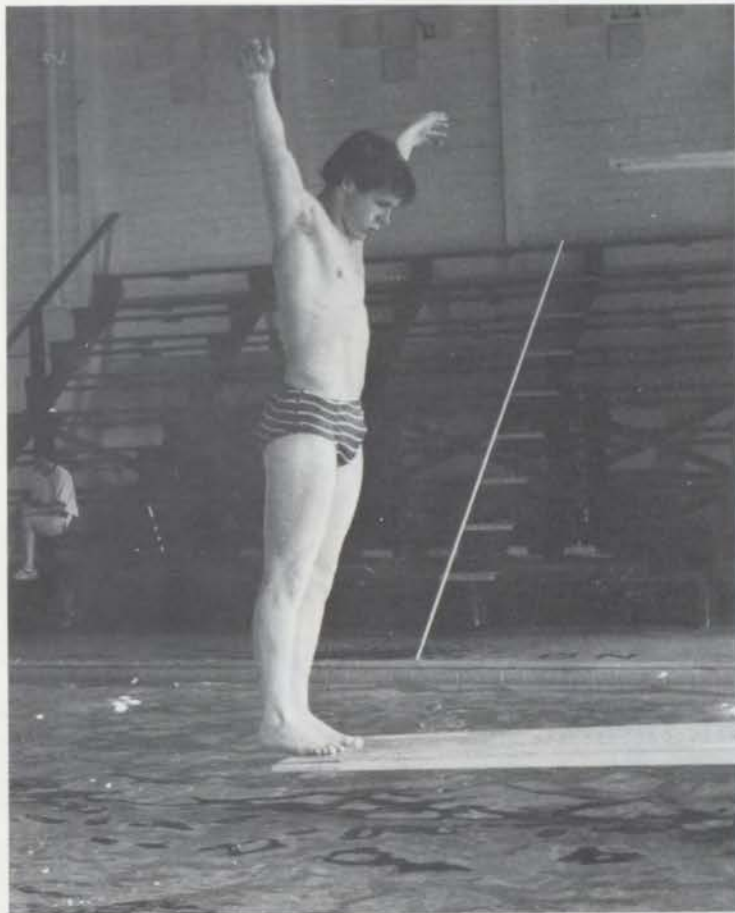

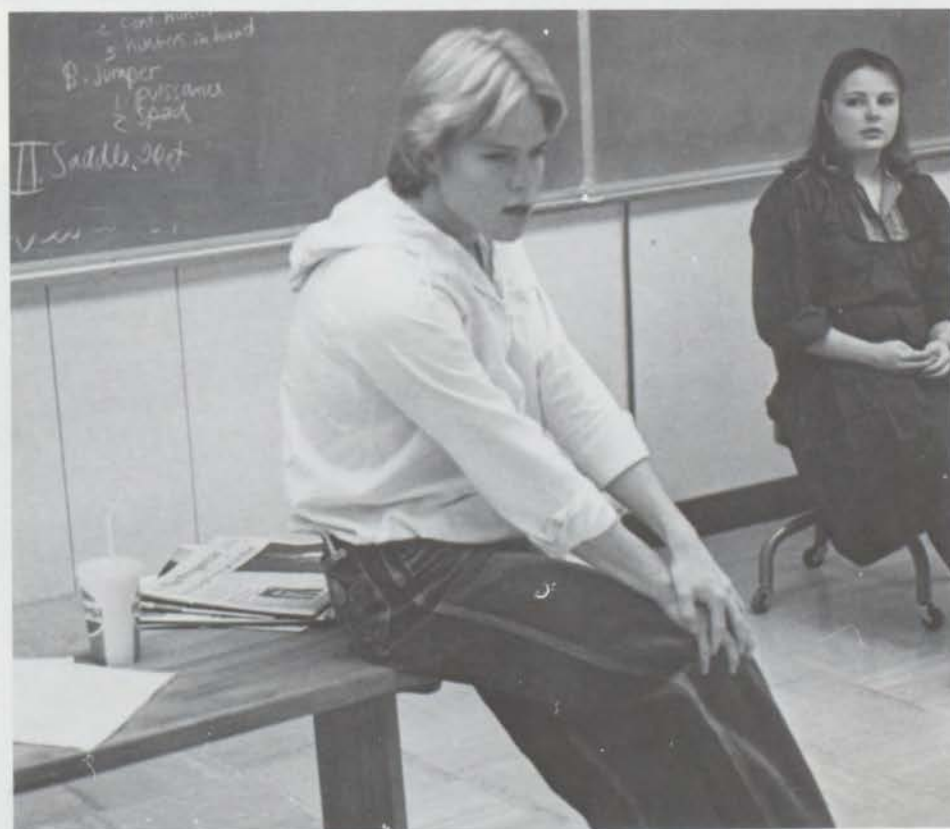

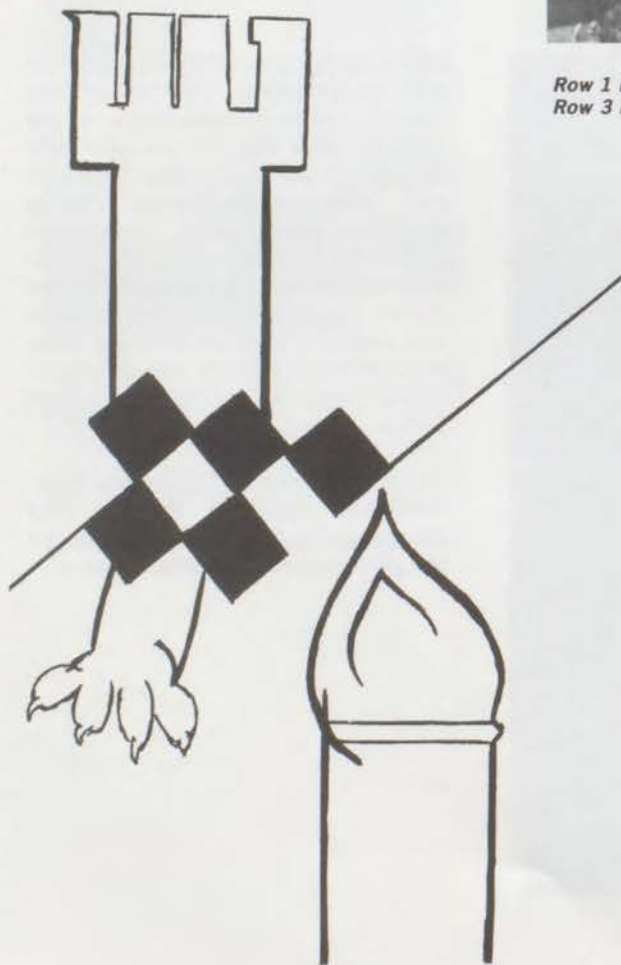

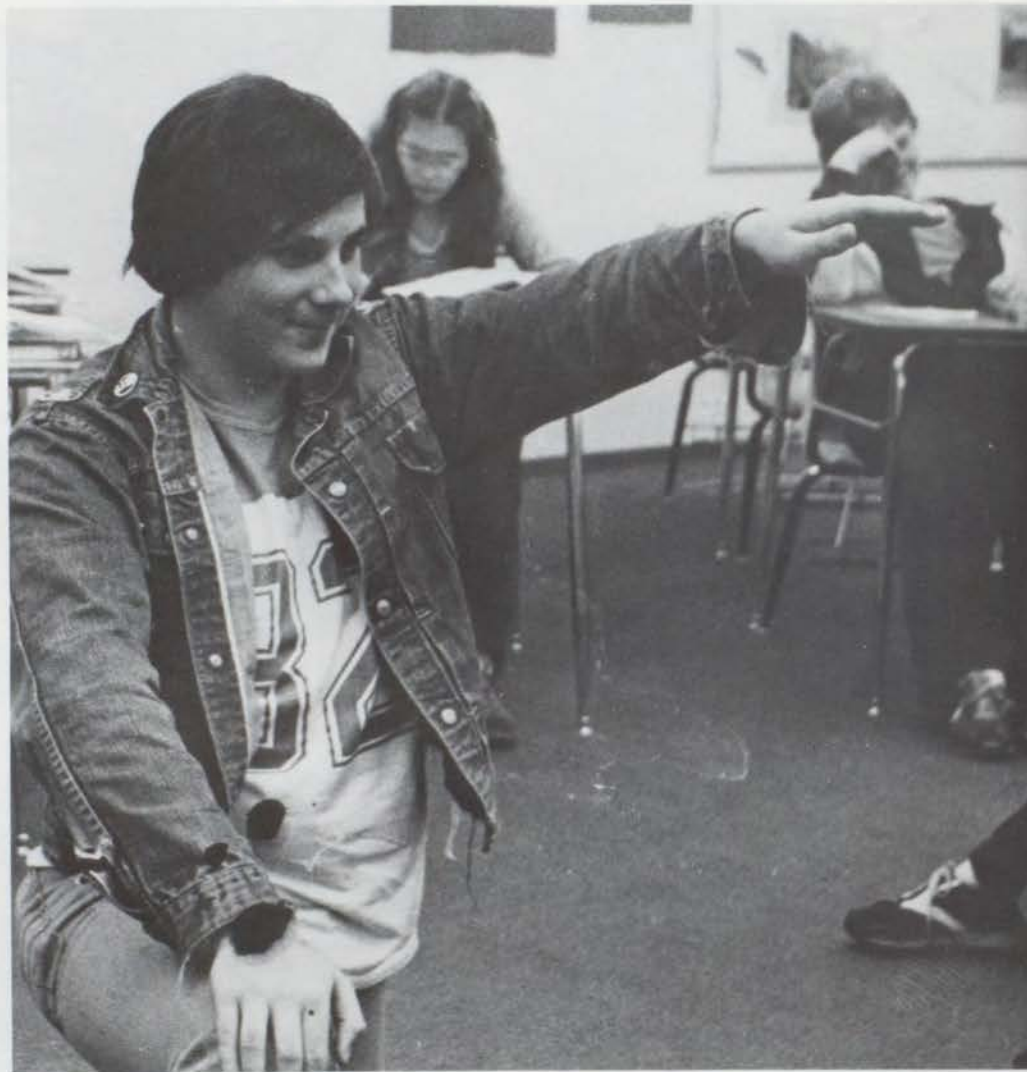

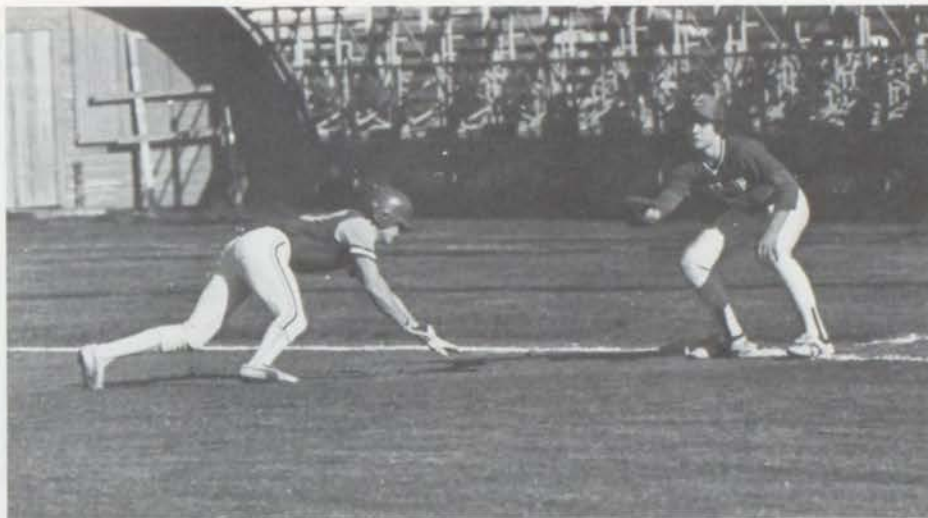

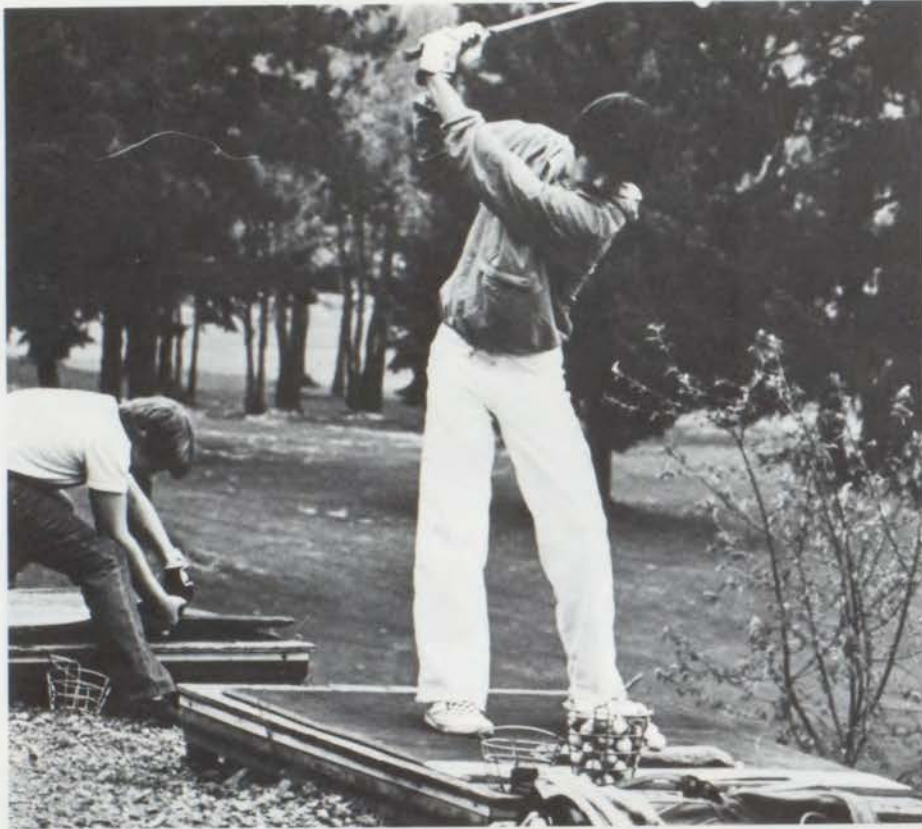

The boys team should be strong next year, as they lose, only two seniors, Steve Atkinson, and Pat Lynch, to graduation.

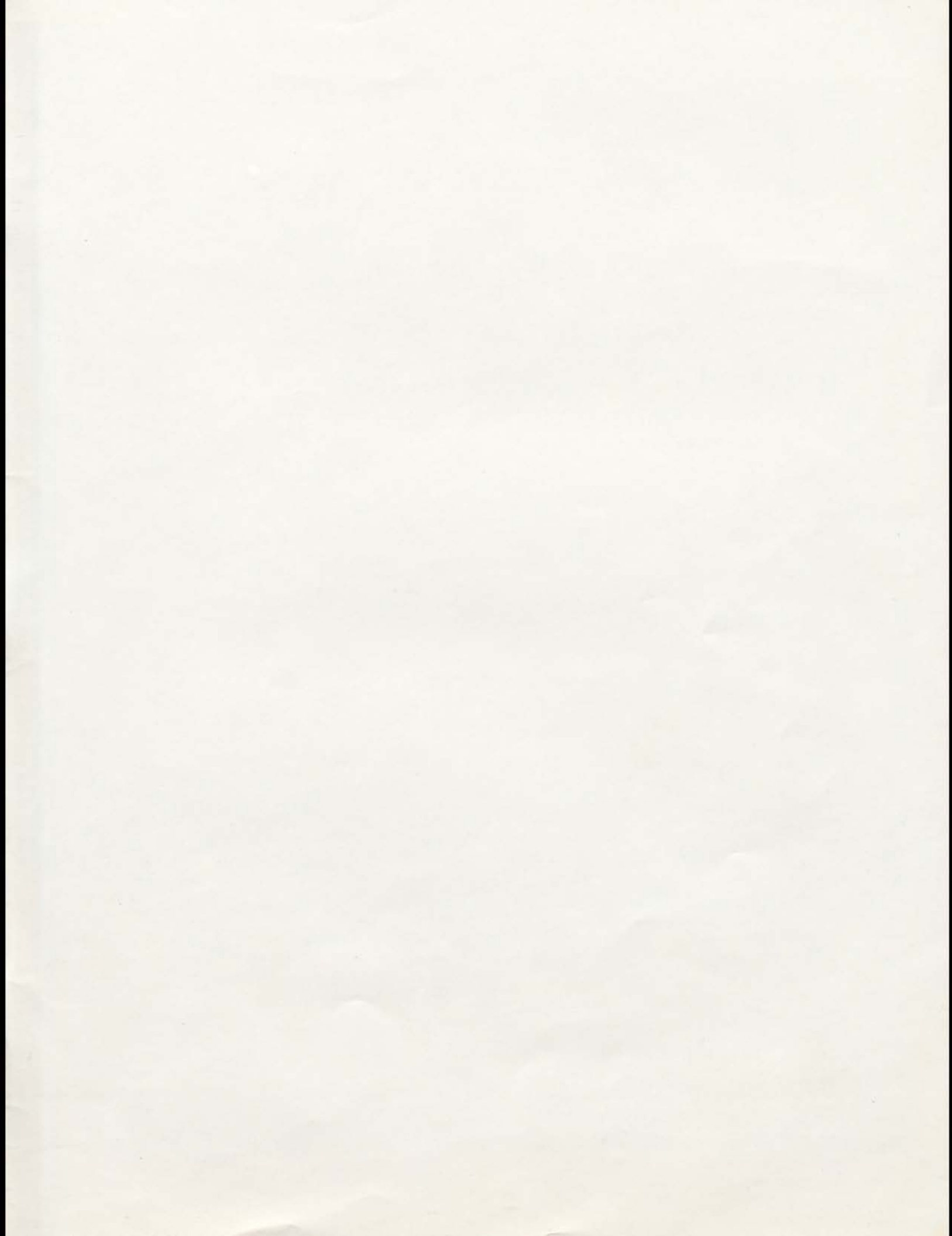
