# EDITOR'S CORNER



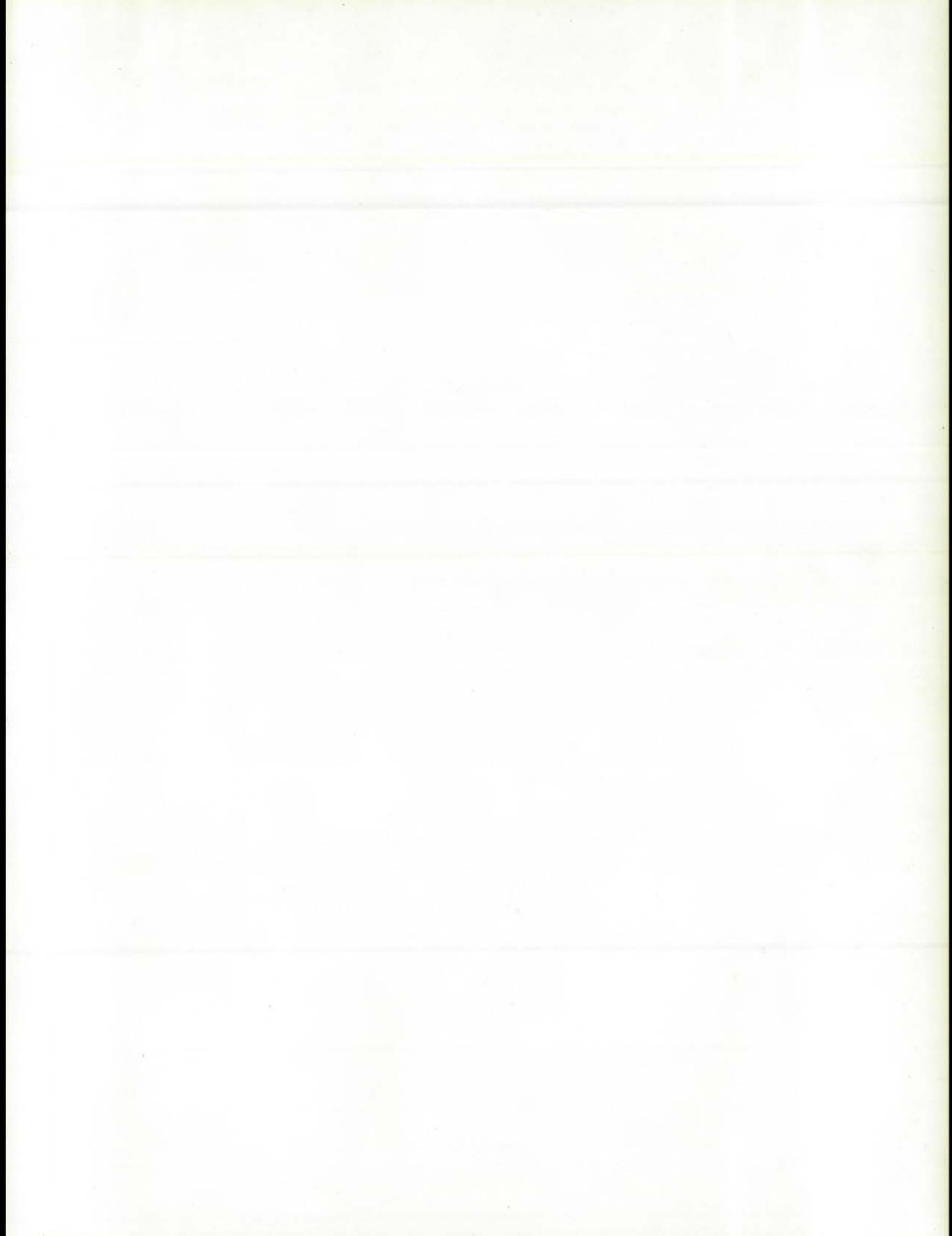

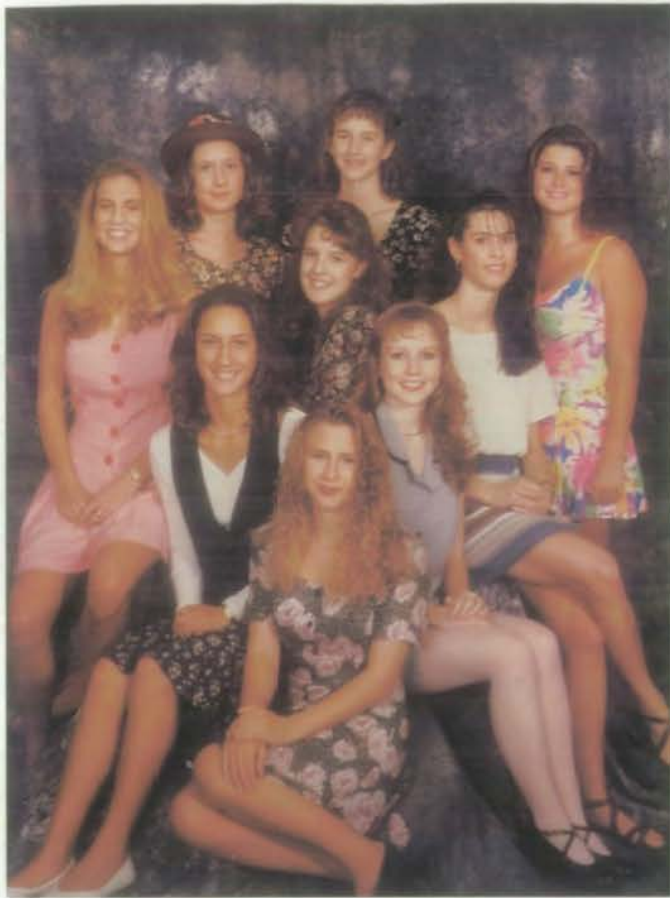

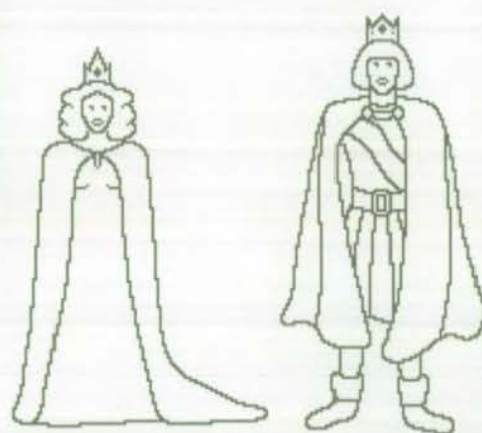

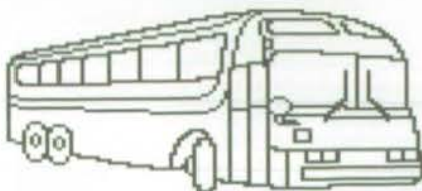

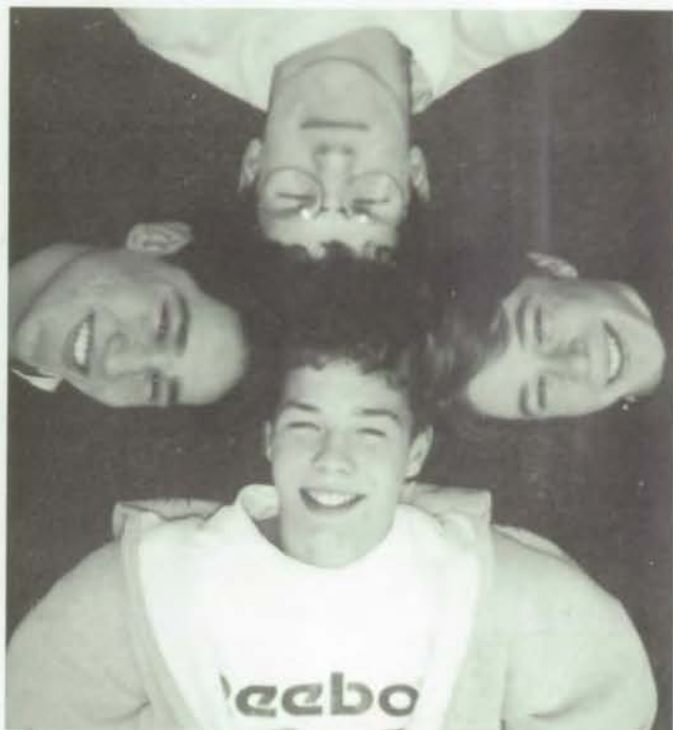

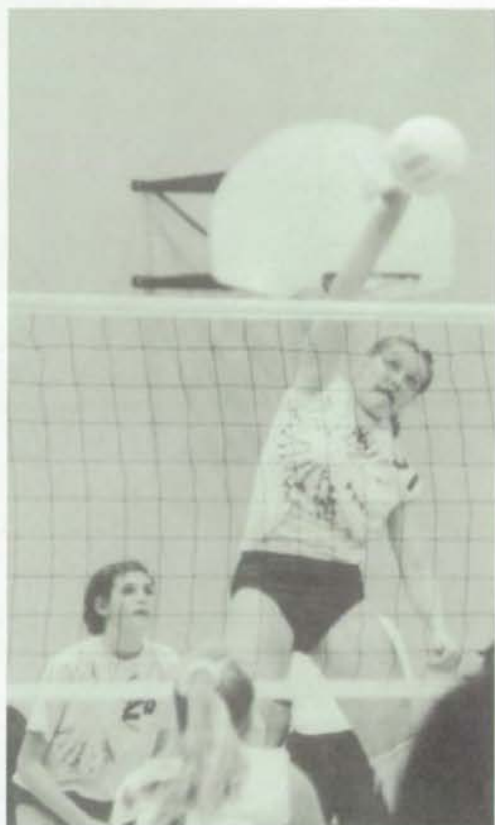

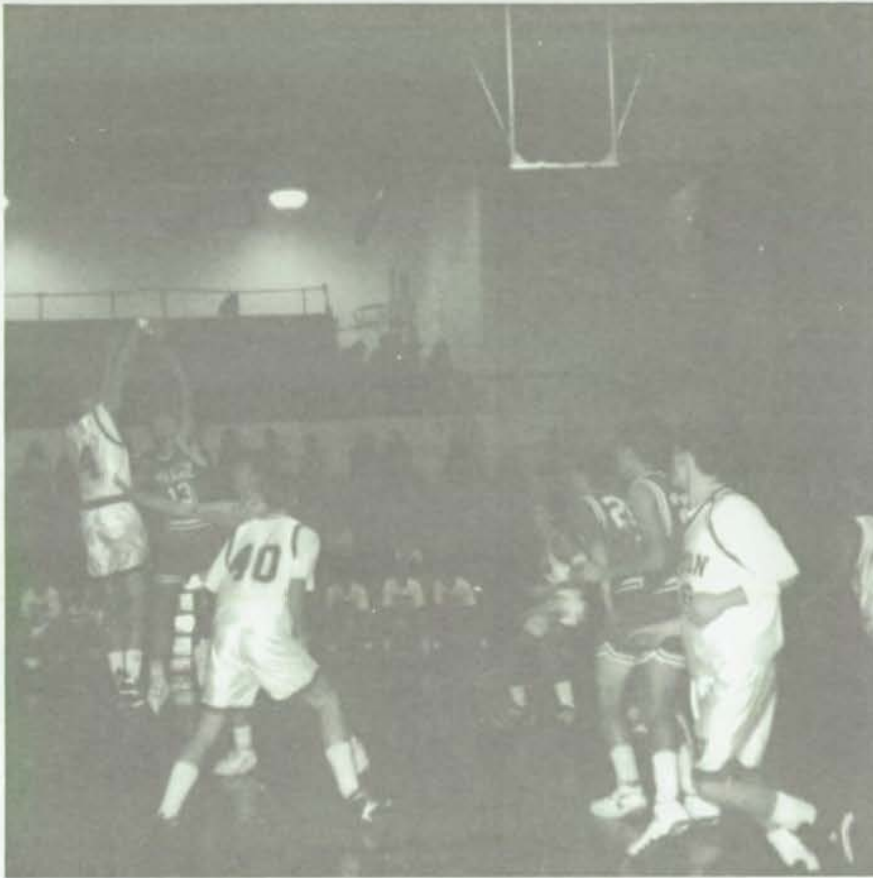

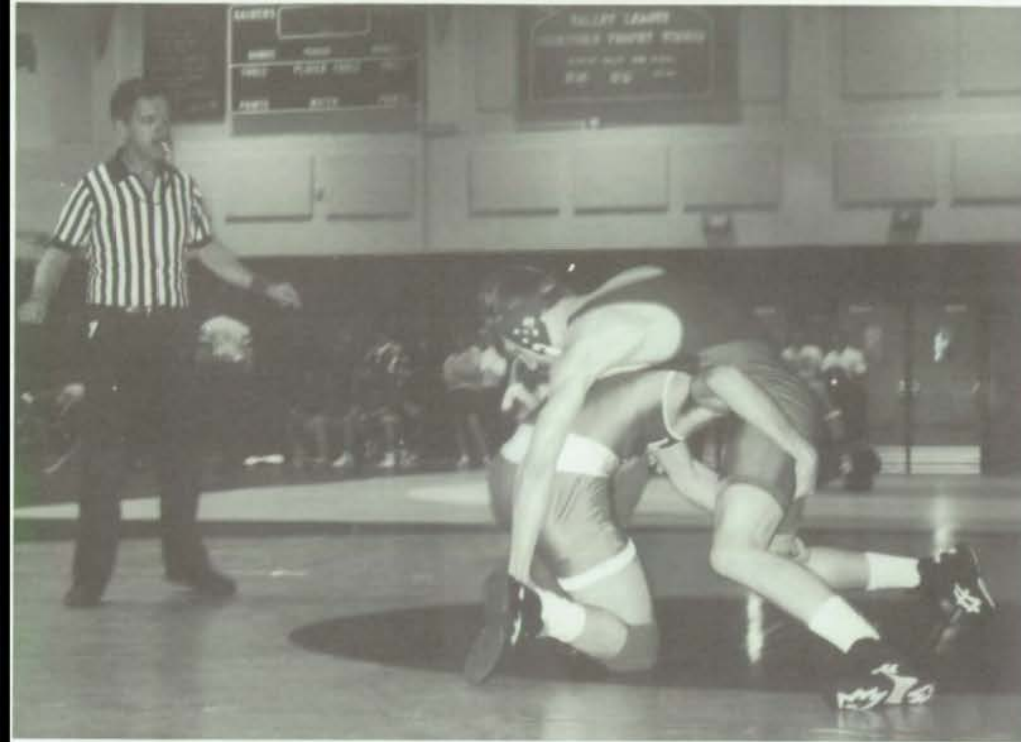

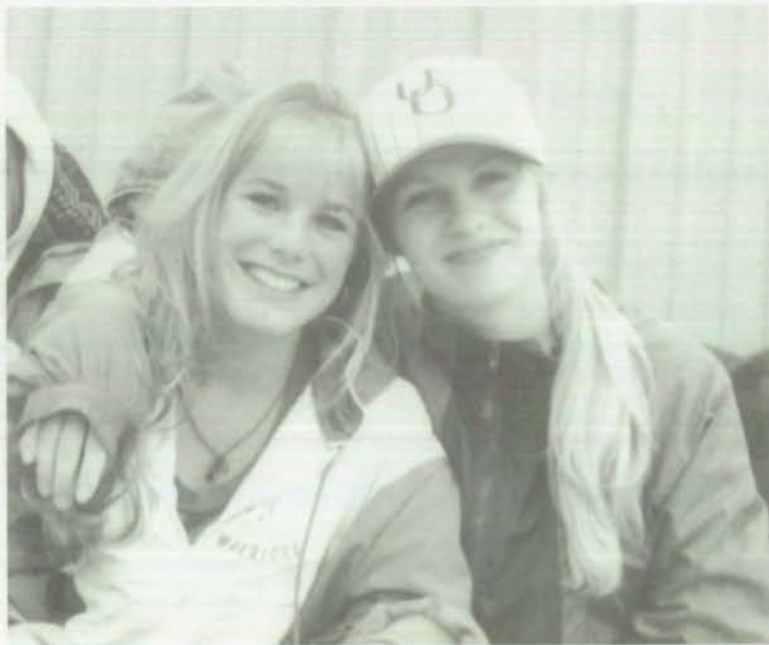

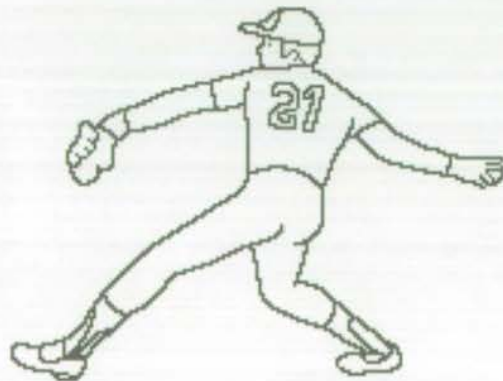

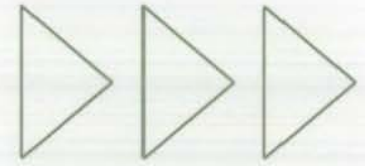

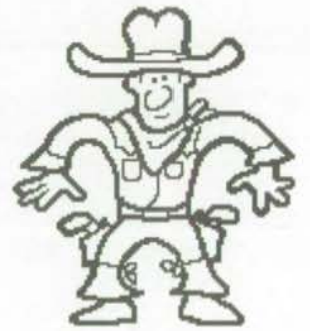

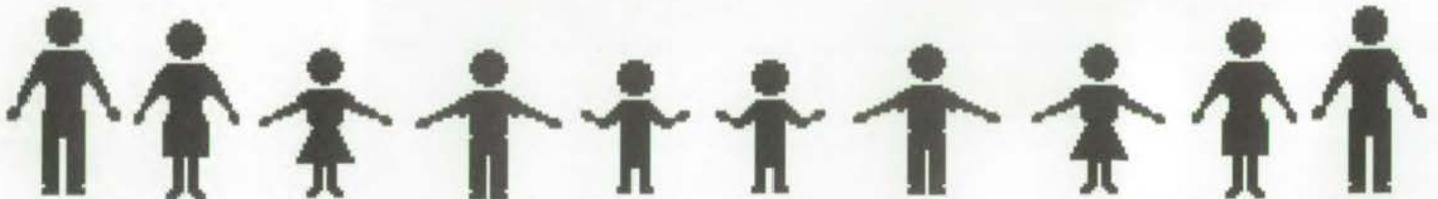

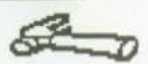

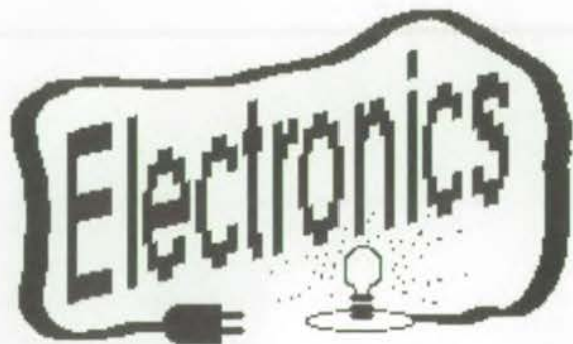

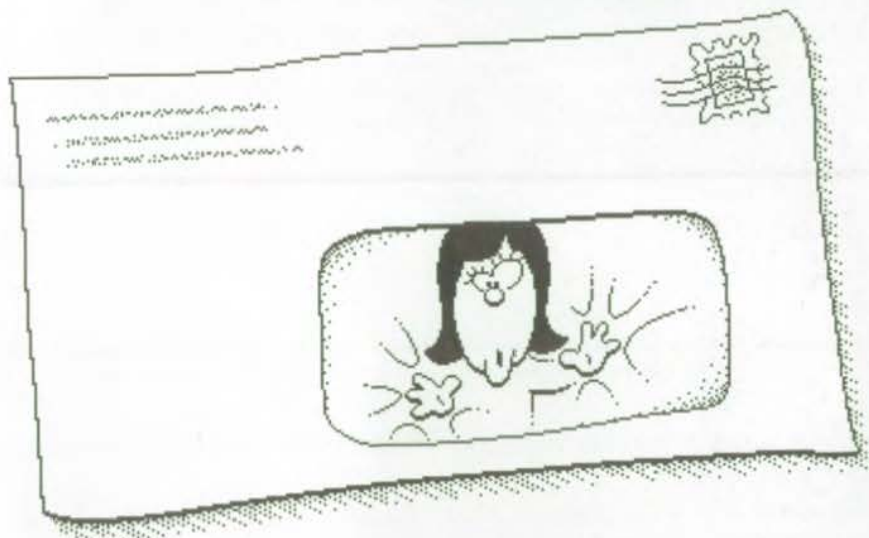

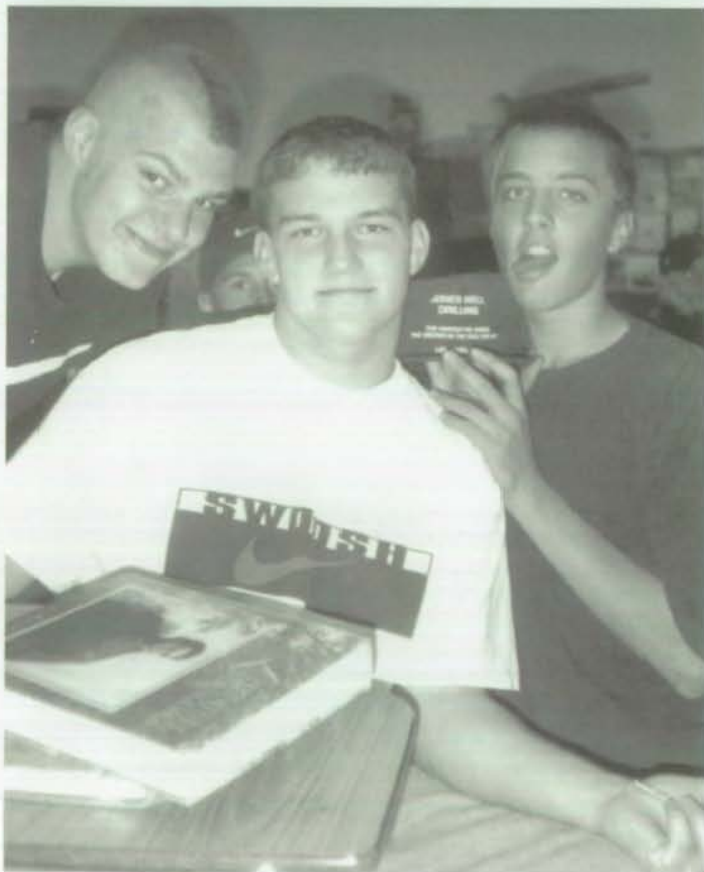

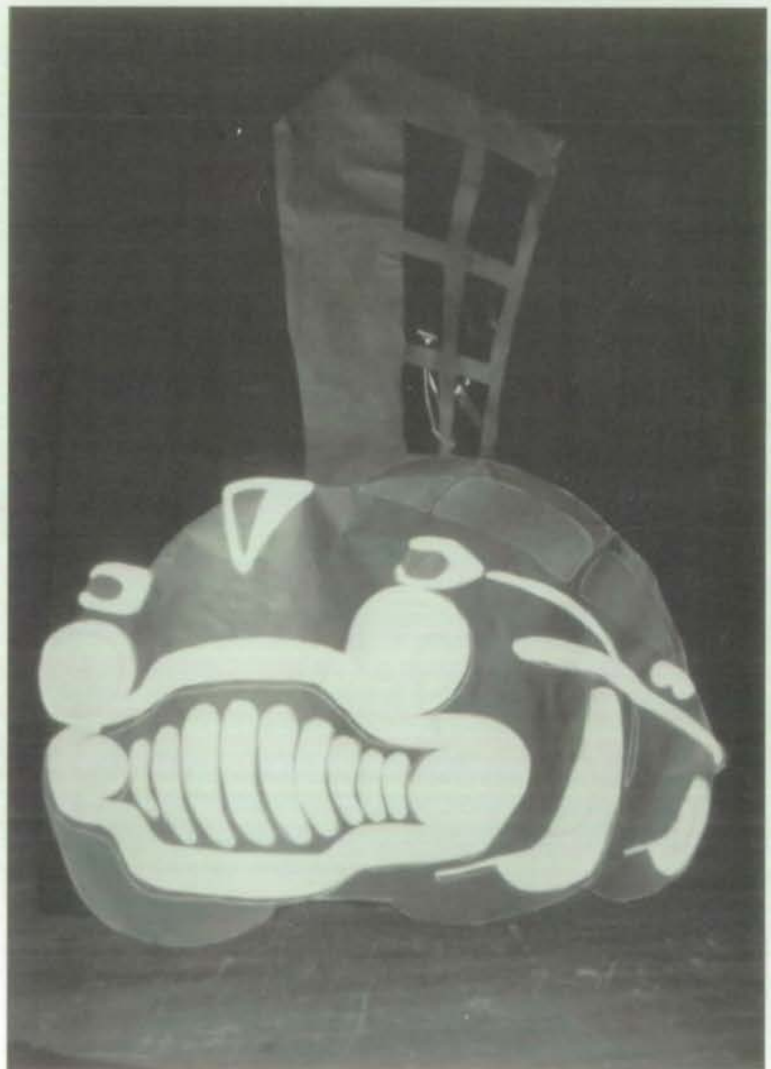

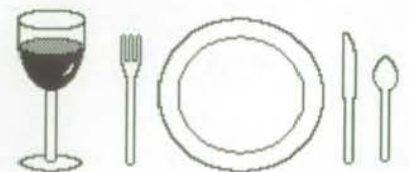
# Home Economics

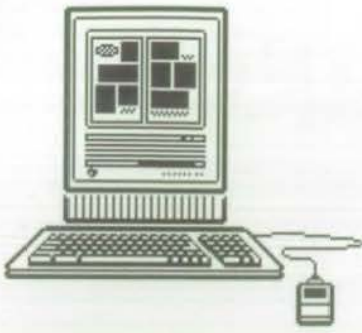

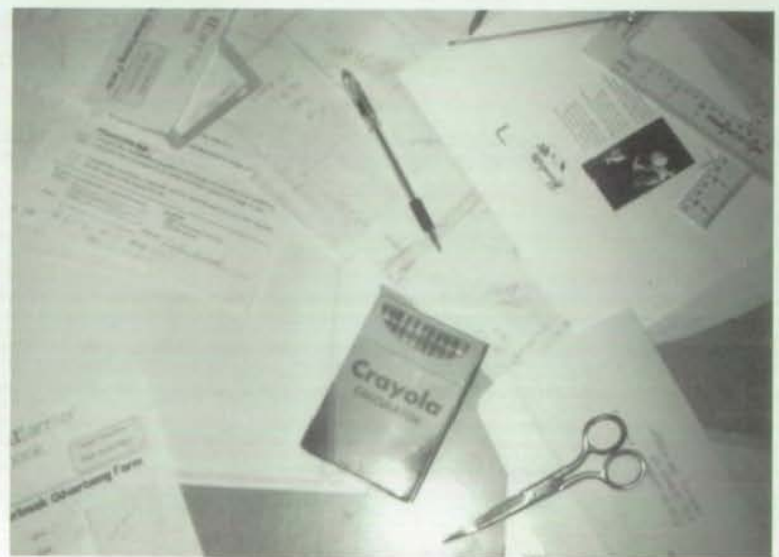
