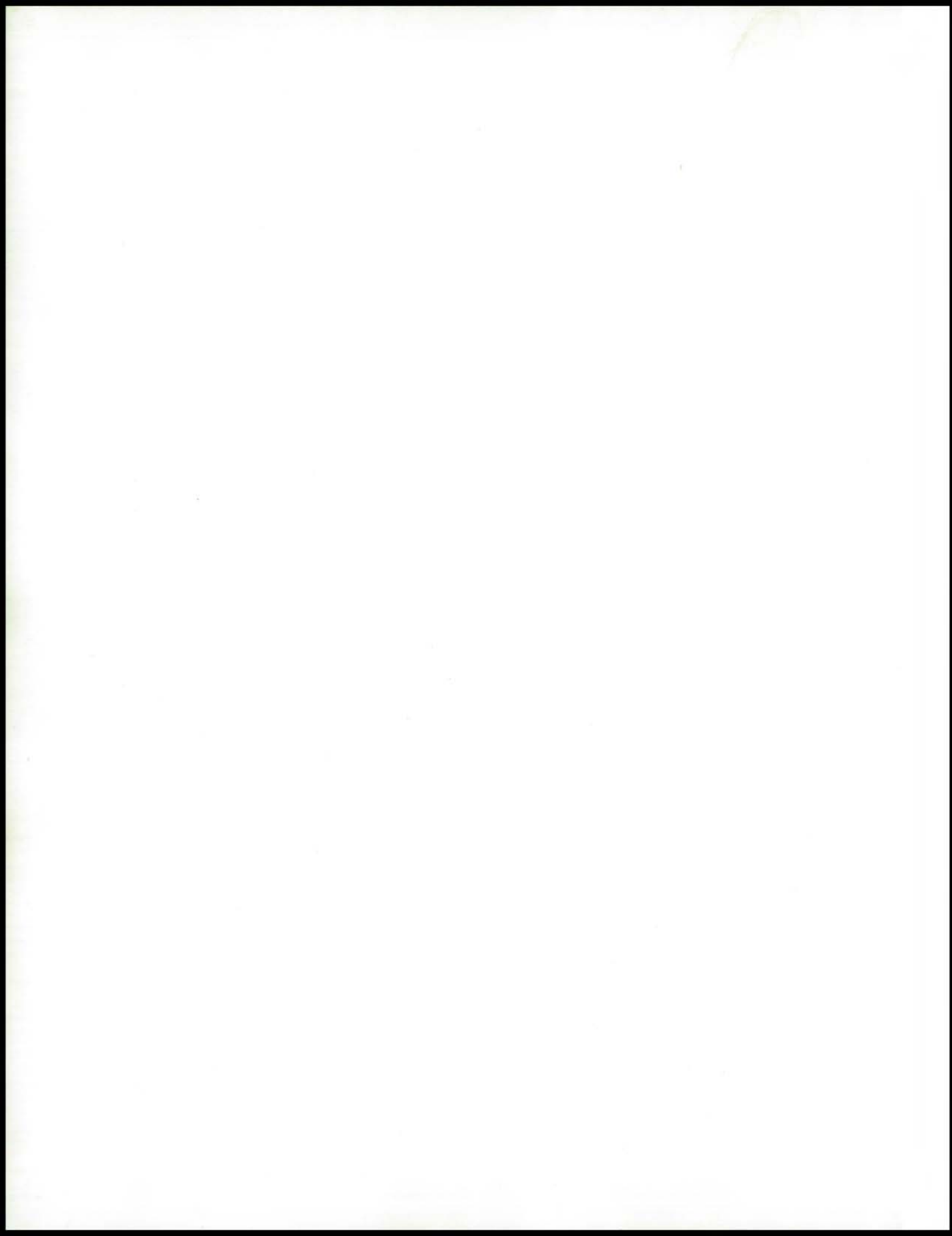

And that has made all the difference.



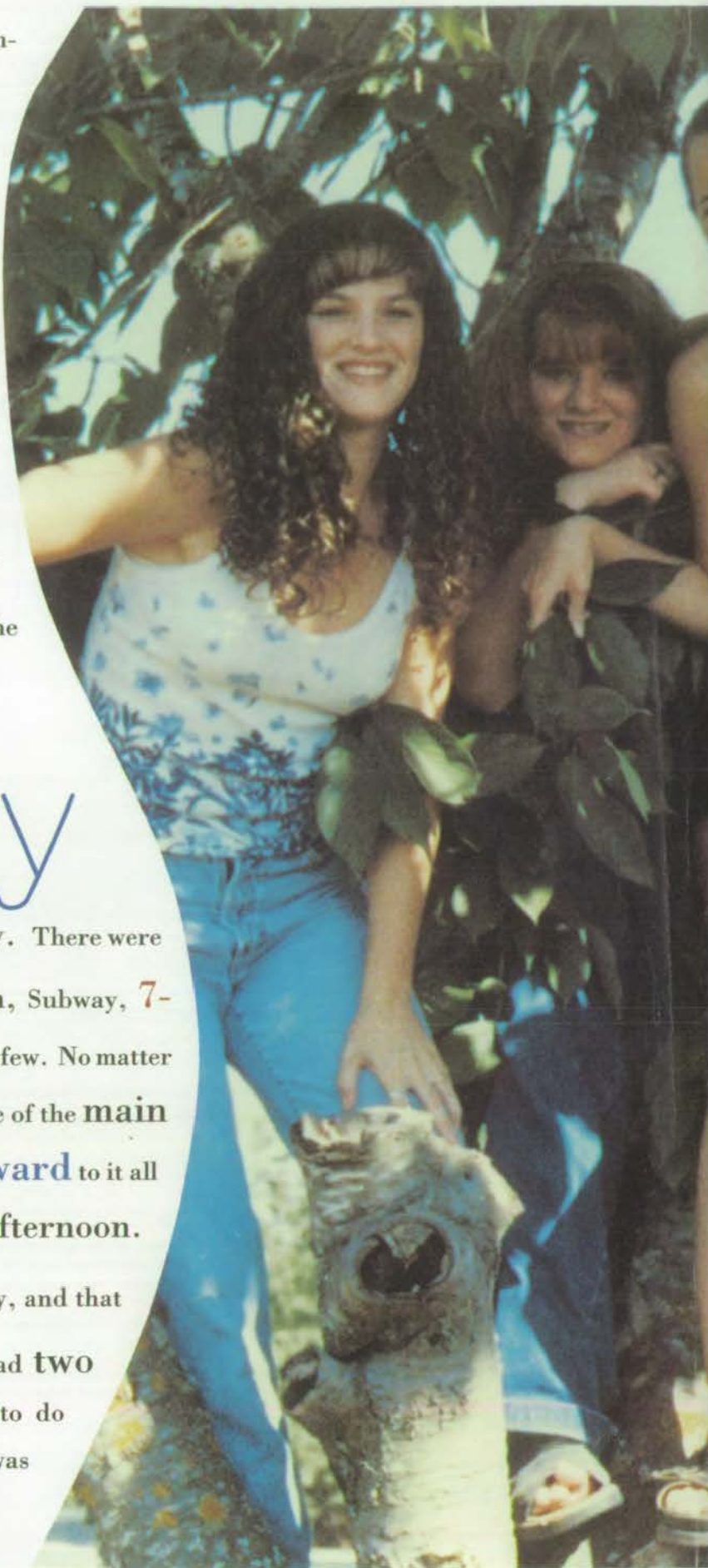

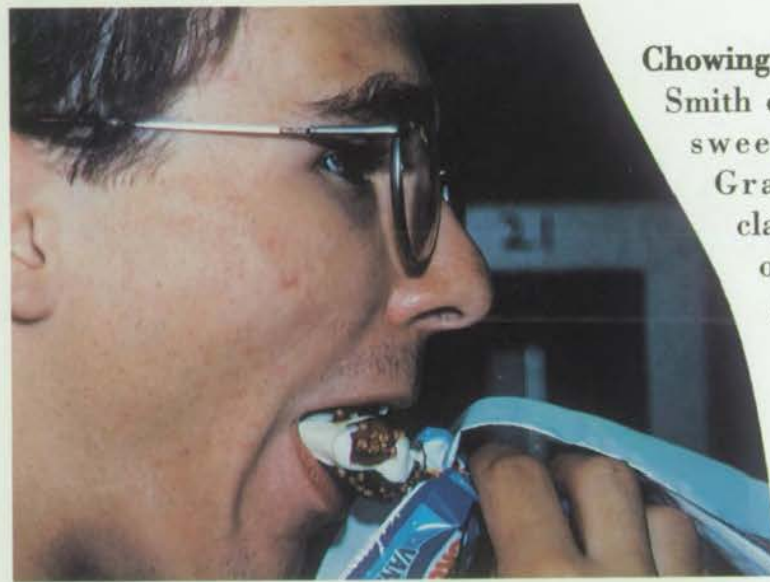

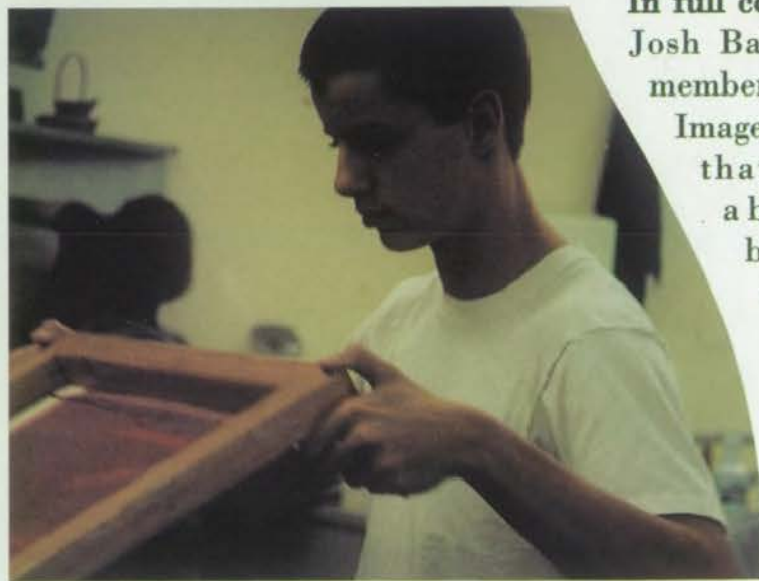

Out of the 1,369 students attending L.H.S, 907 showed up to register, the other 462 stayed home to enjoy what days of freedom they had left to endure. L.H.S consisted of 105 classrooms, 1,054 lockers, and 144 large plate glass windows. Four main hallways housed all 1,369 students, making for a chaotic path to class. 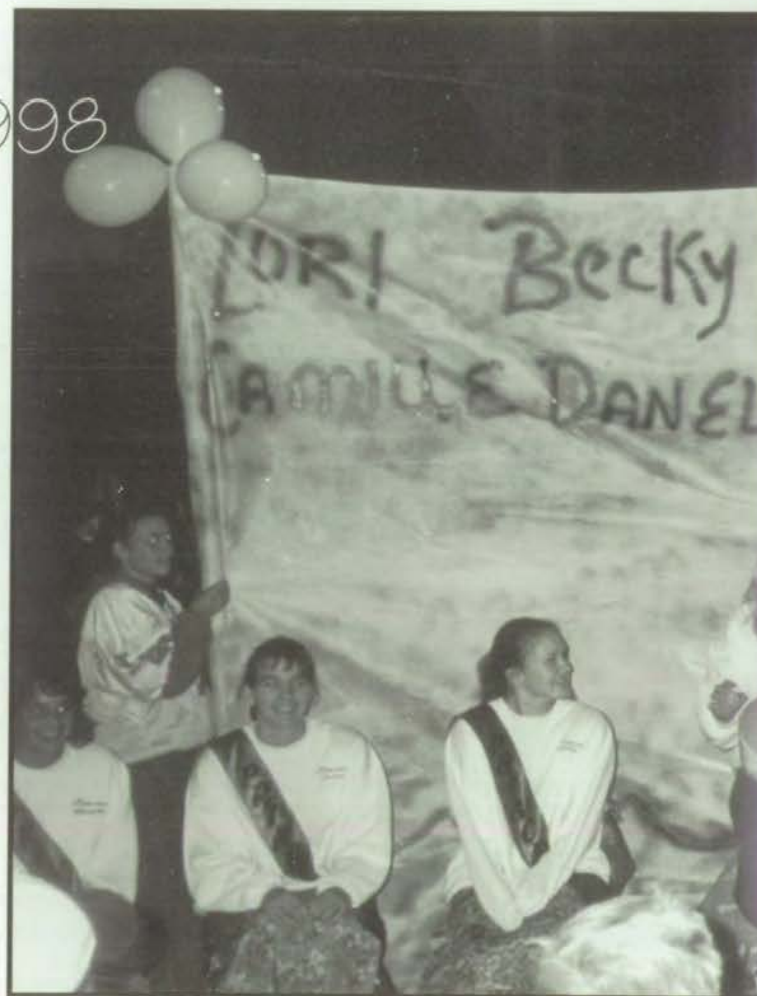

about themselves, their families, or something that would catch the judges attention. Following that

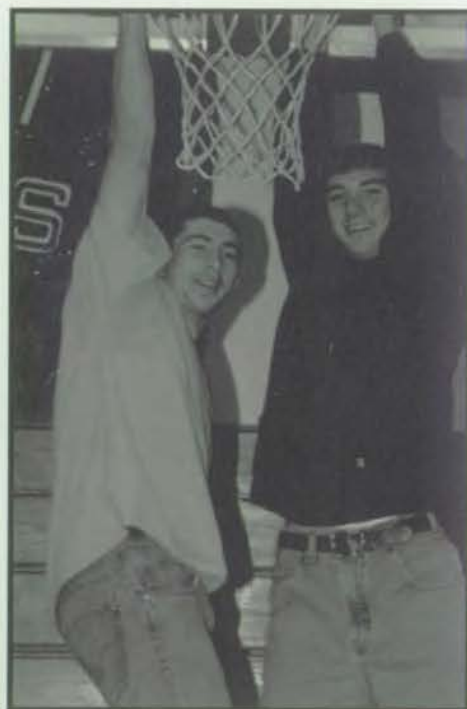

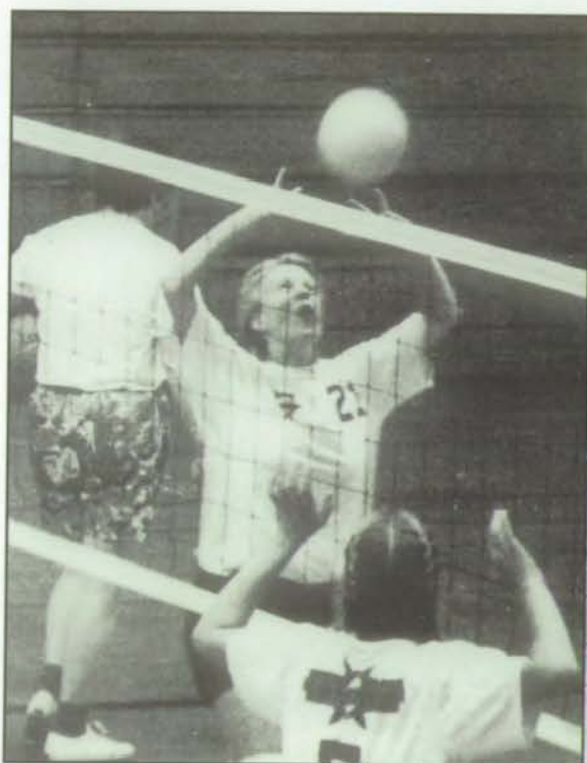

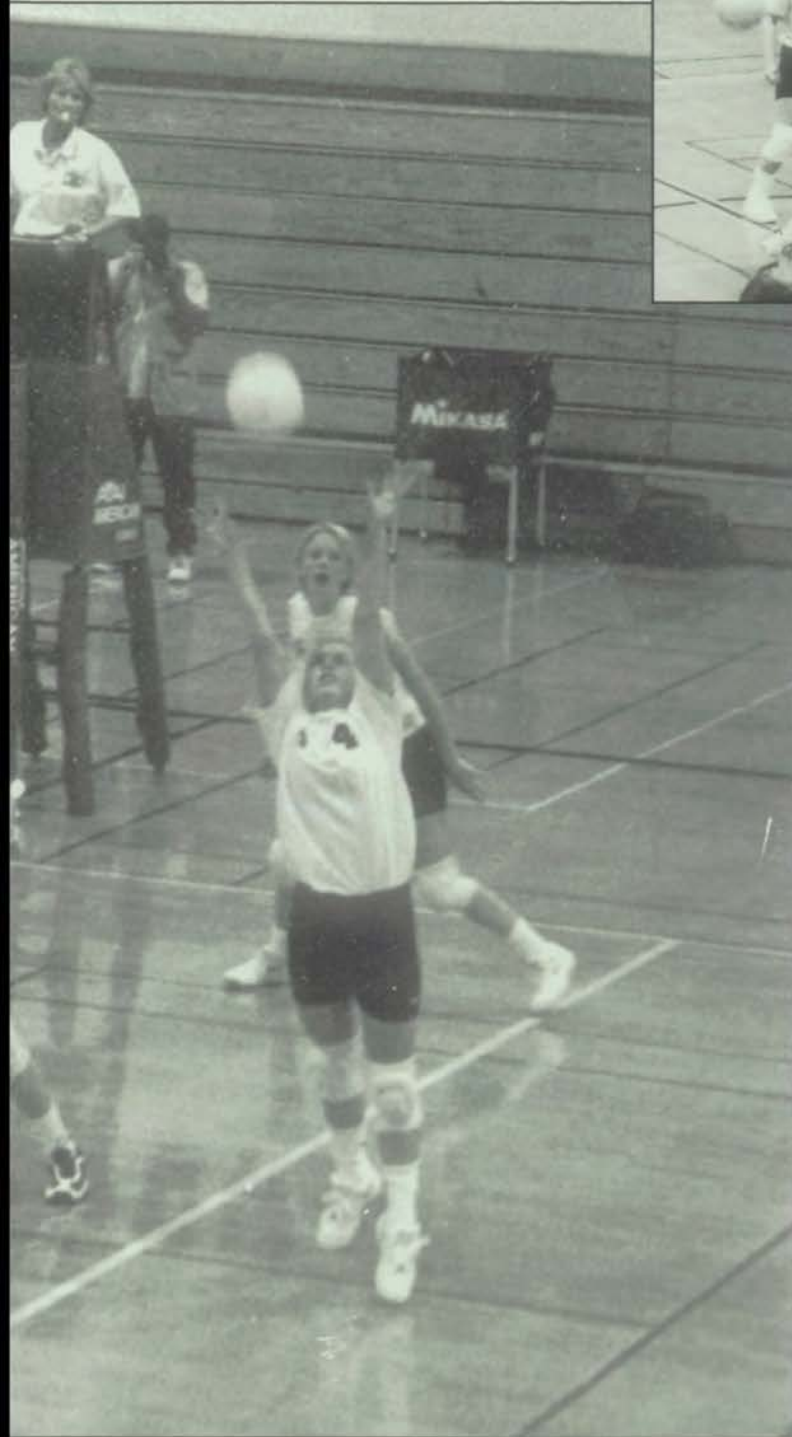

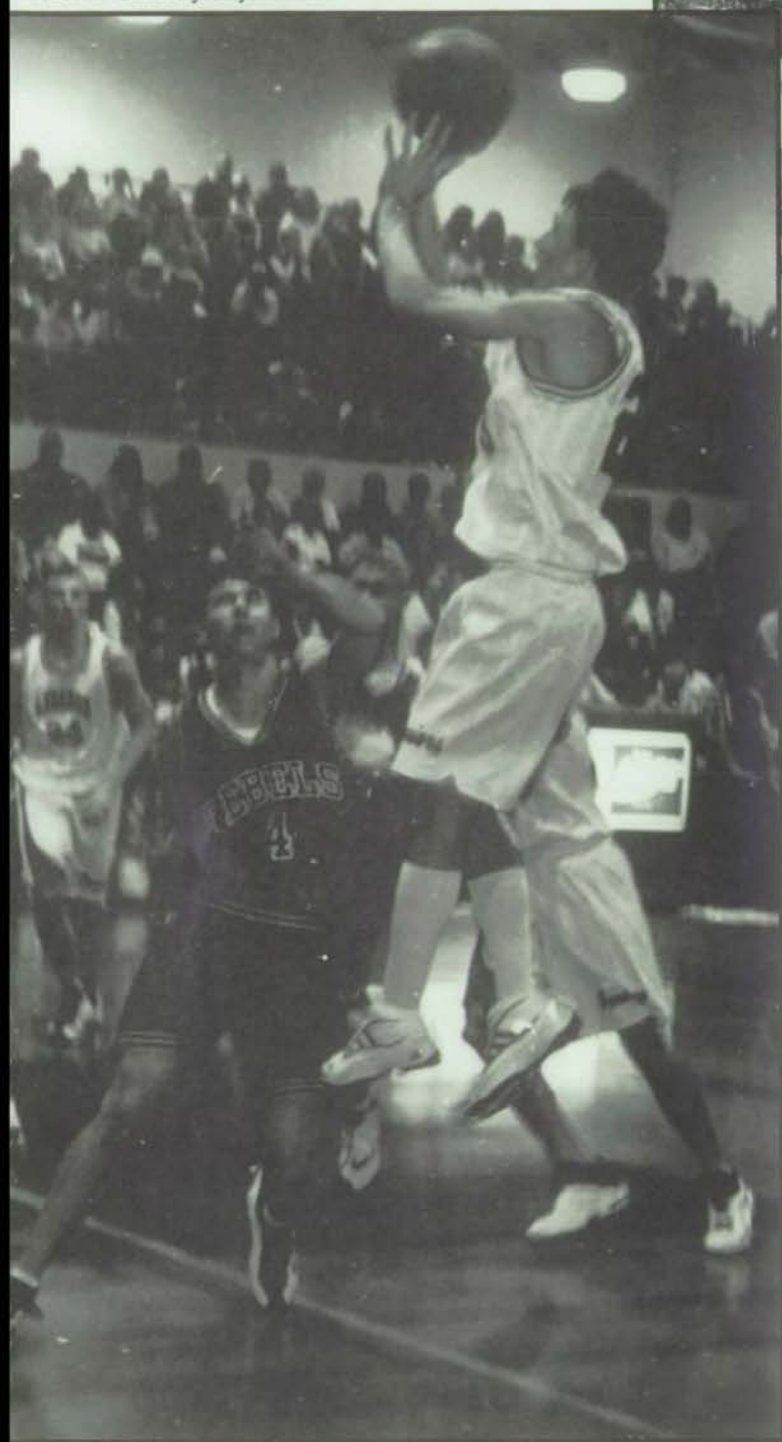

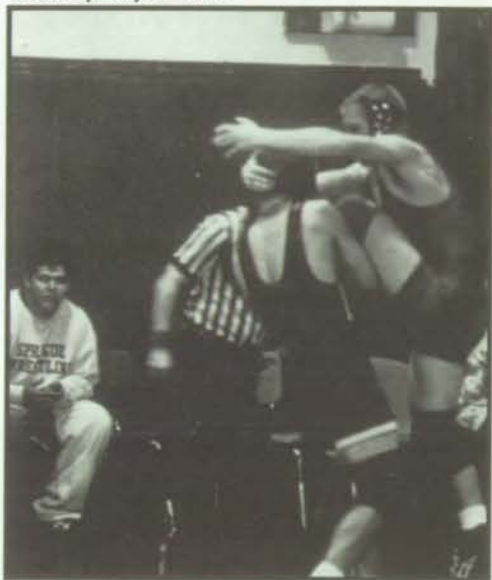

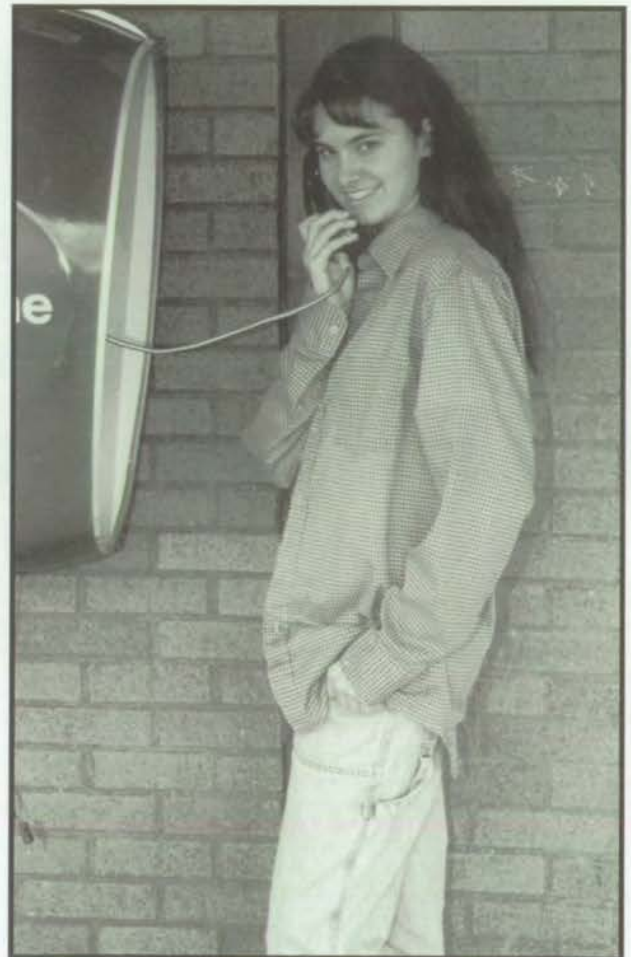

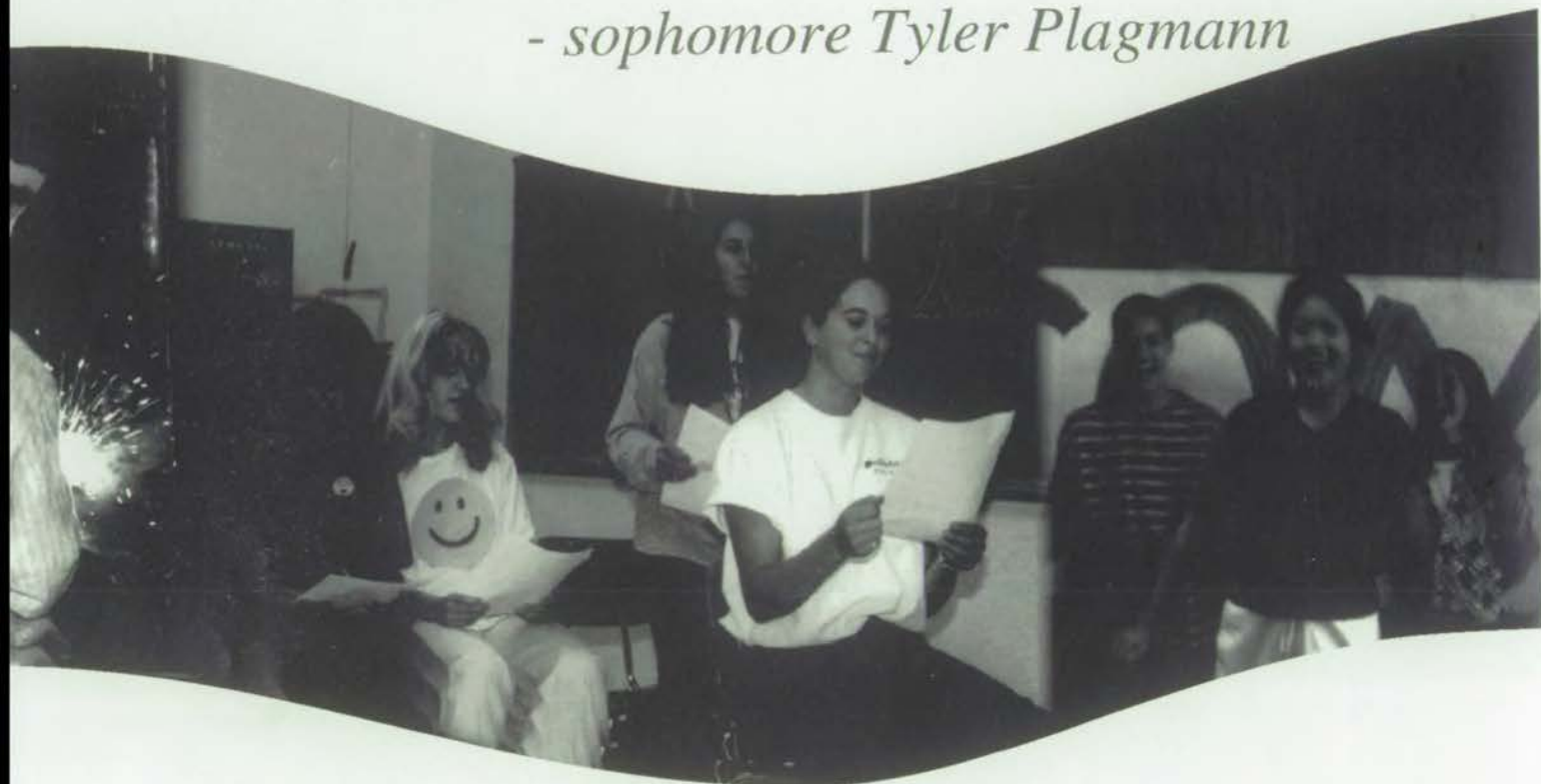
# Clubs &

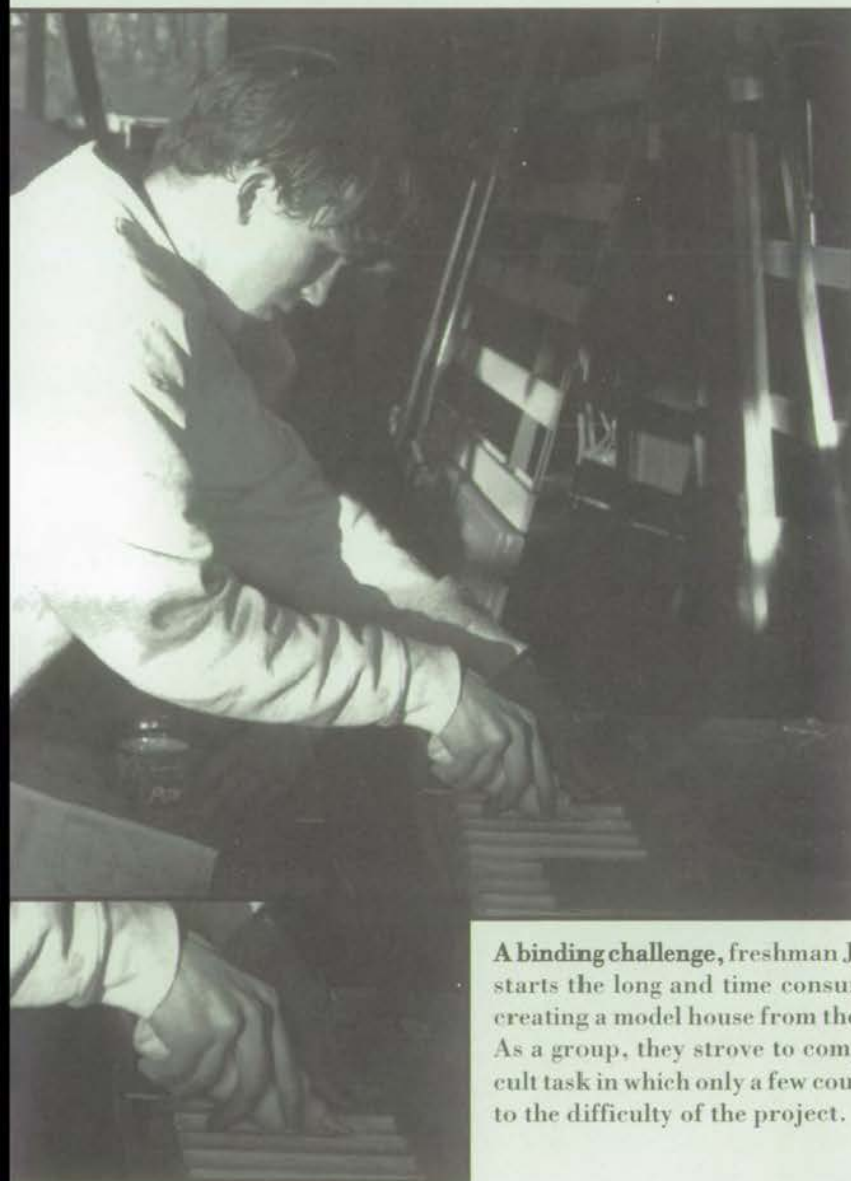

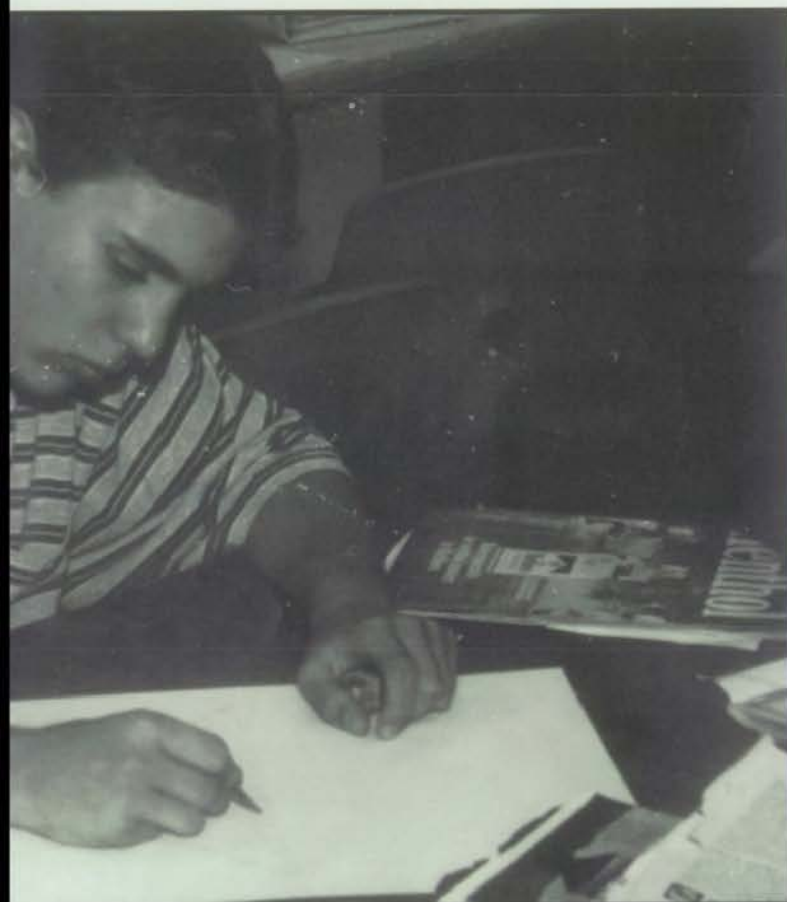
