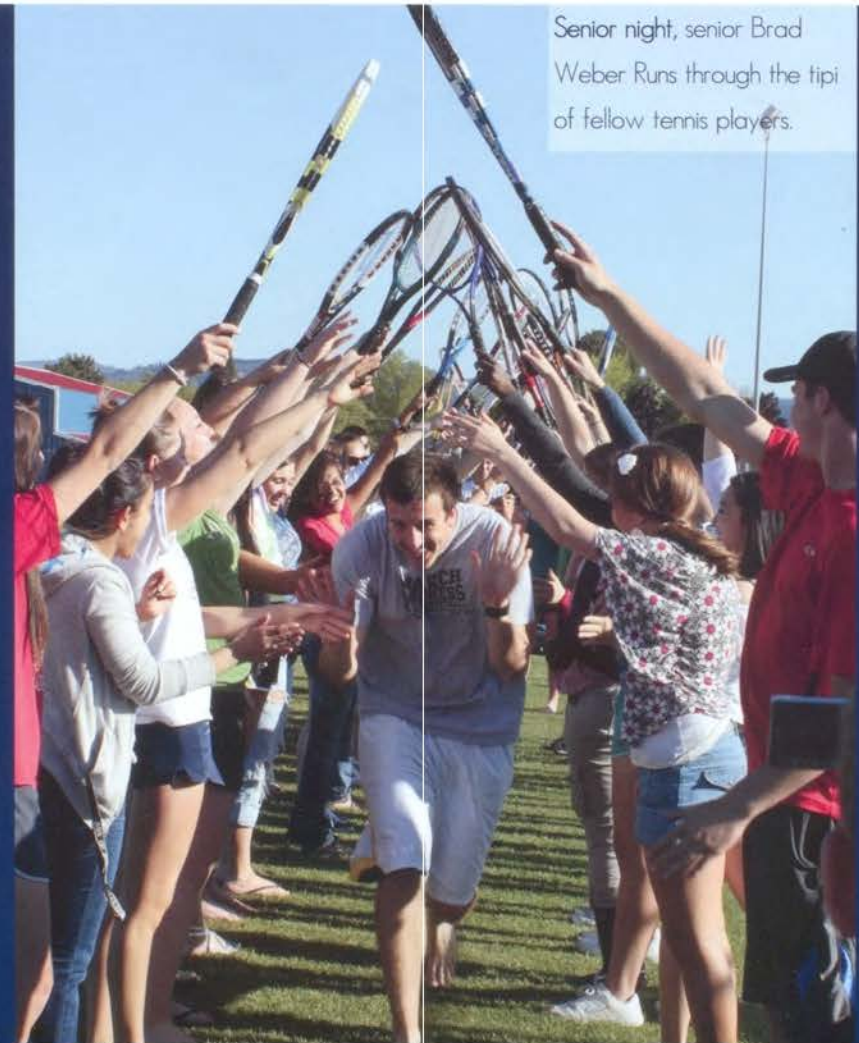

Having the fastest sprinters in the league, a fifth place state thrower, two girls leaping into state placing and a hurdler with another year to edge out a state medal, the Warriors track team reached a level that had not been touched in a long time. The 400 meter relay team consisting of seniors Anthony Langford, Steven Langford, Thomas Avants and Chris Anderlik broke the fifty-year old school record and made their mark in Lebanon history. Showing tremendous

progress in the jumps and pole vault, there were standouts on both the girls' and boys' side. **"I would say that I have worked hard this year and it's starting to show; I'm peaking at the right time,"** said junior Donna Samoylich before placing seventh in state for the triple jump. At the state meet, the boys 4x400 meter relay team placed second in state with a mind-blowing time of three minutes.

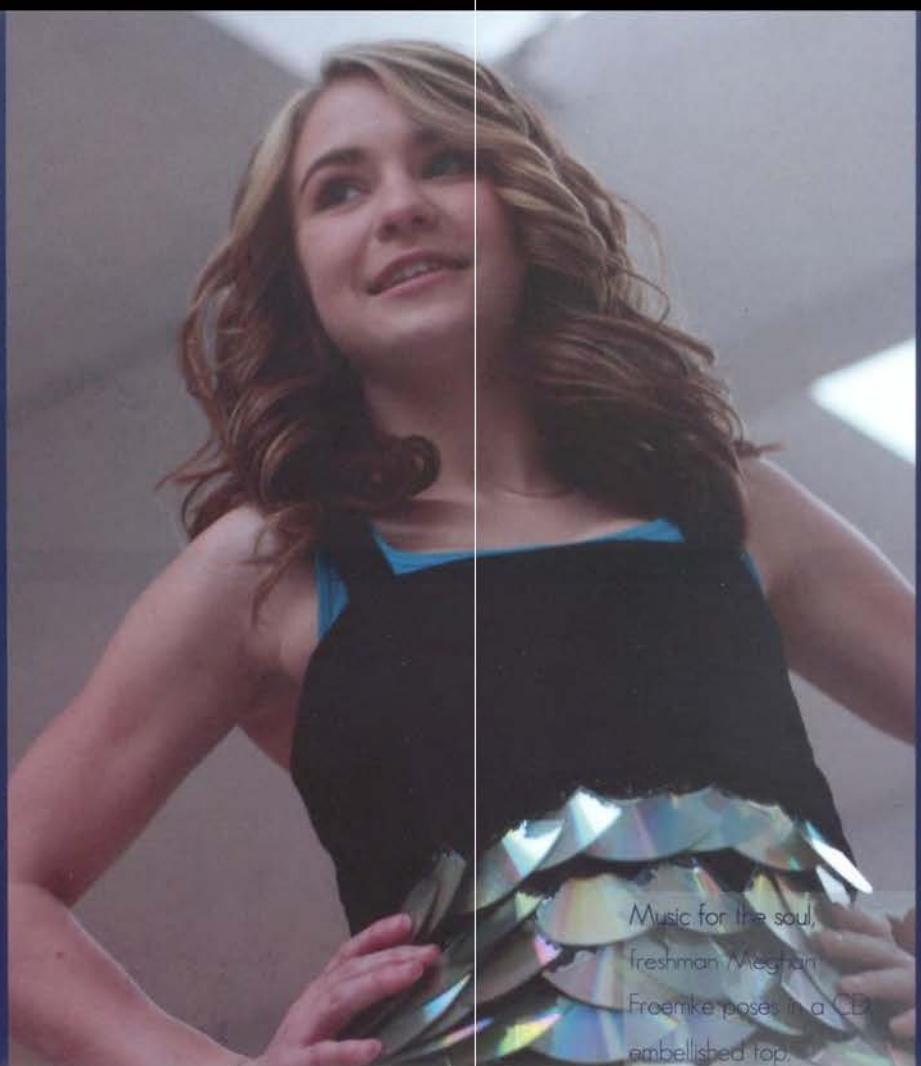

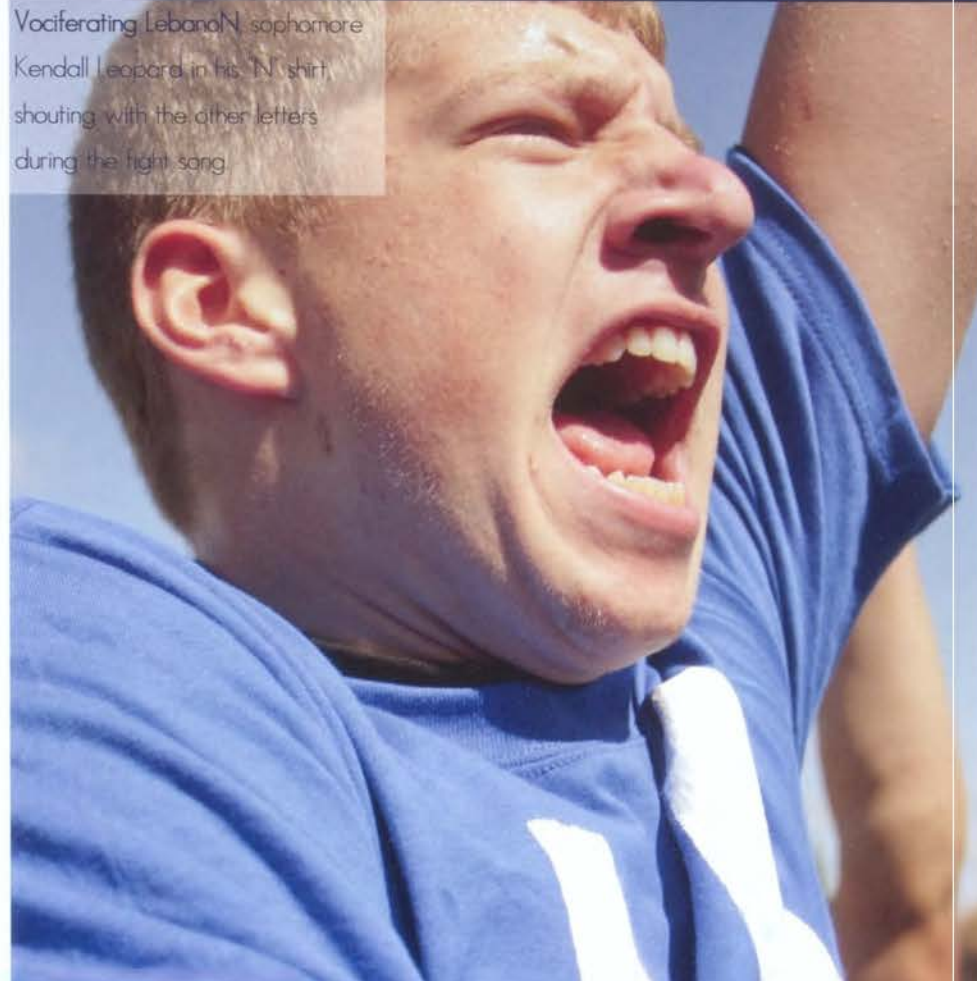

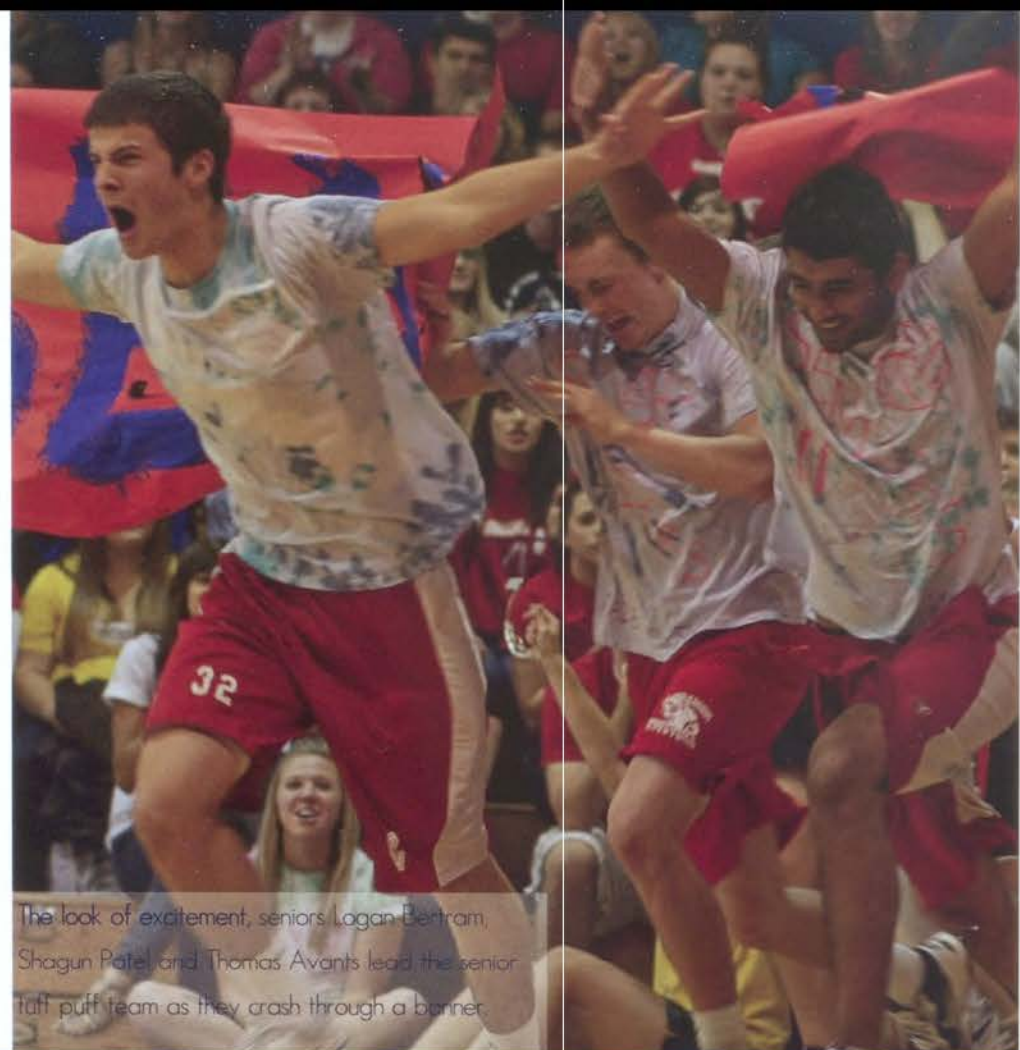
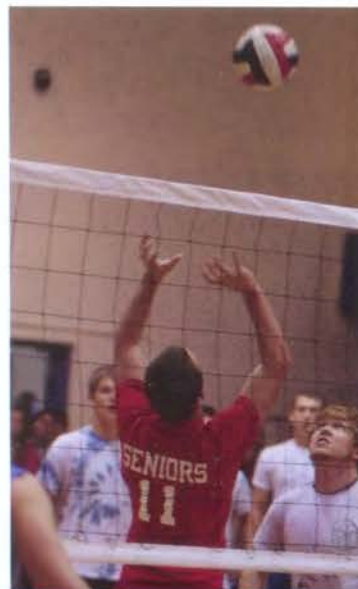

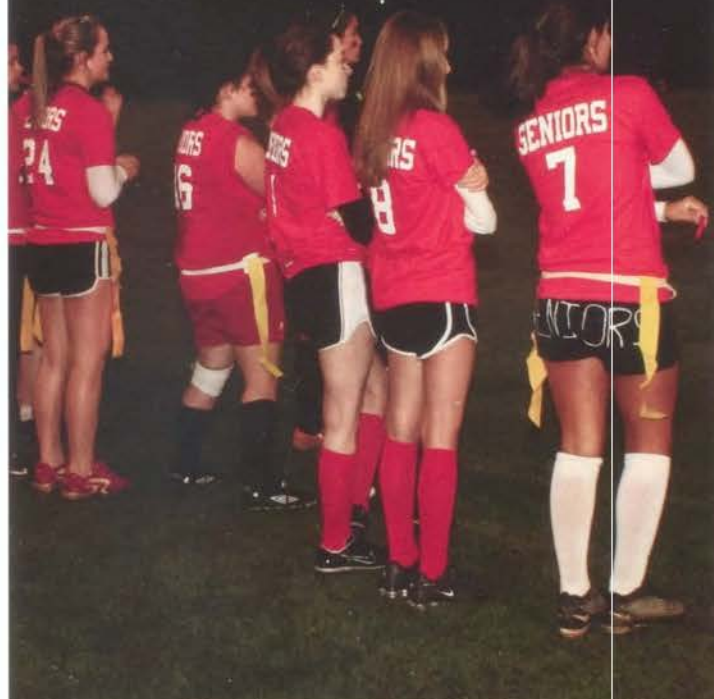

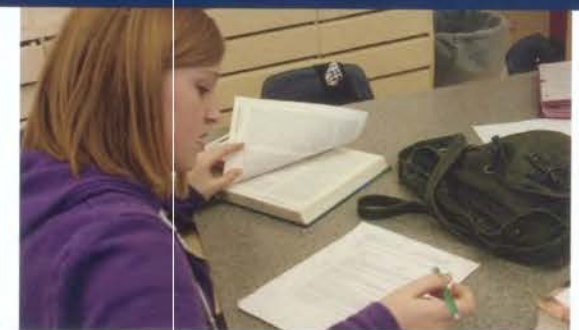

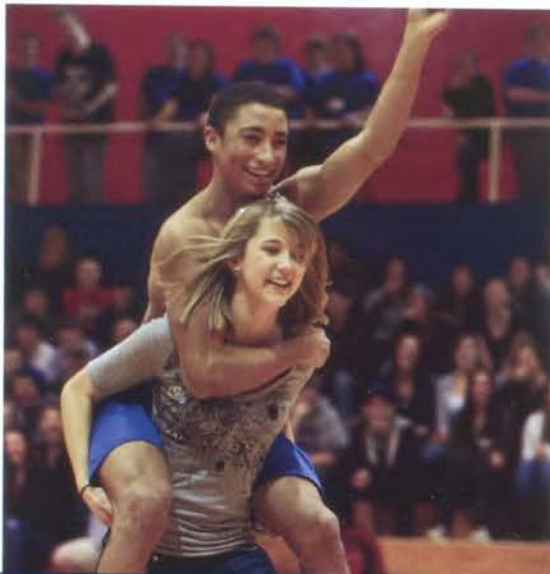

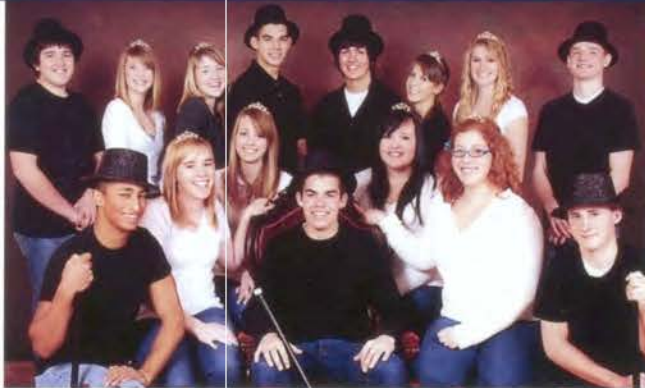

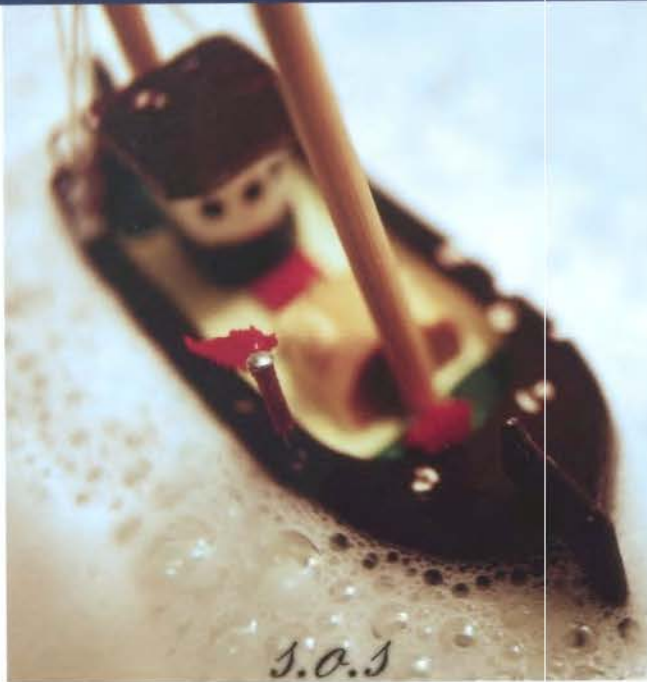

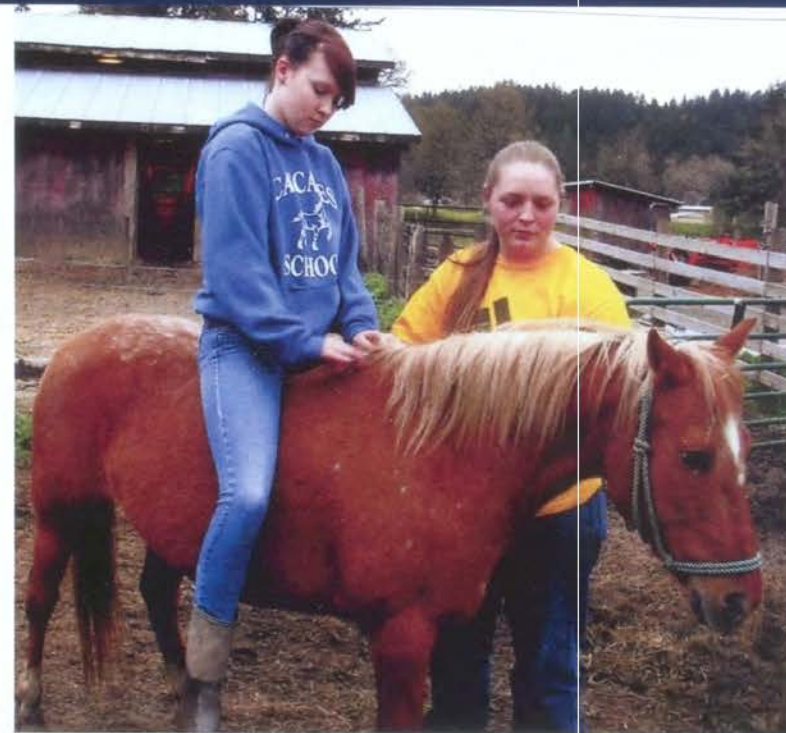

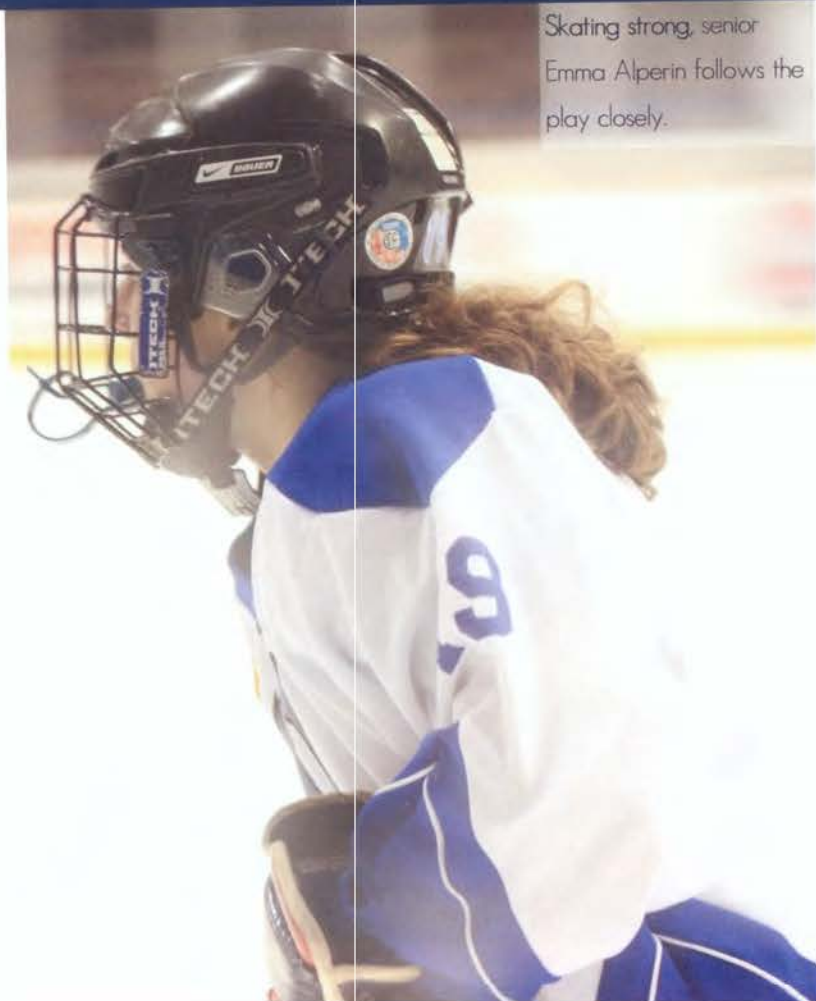

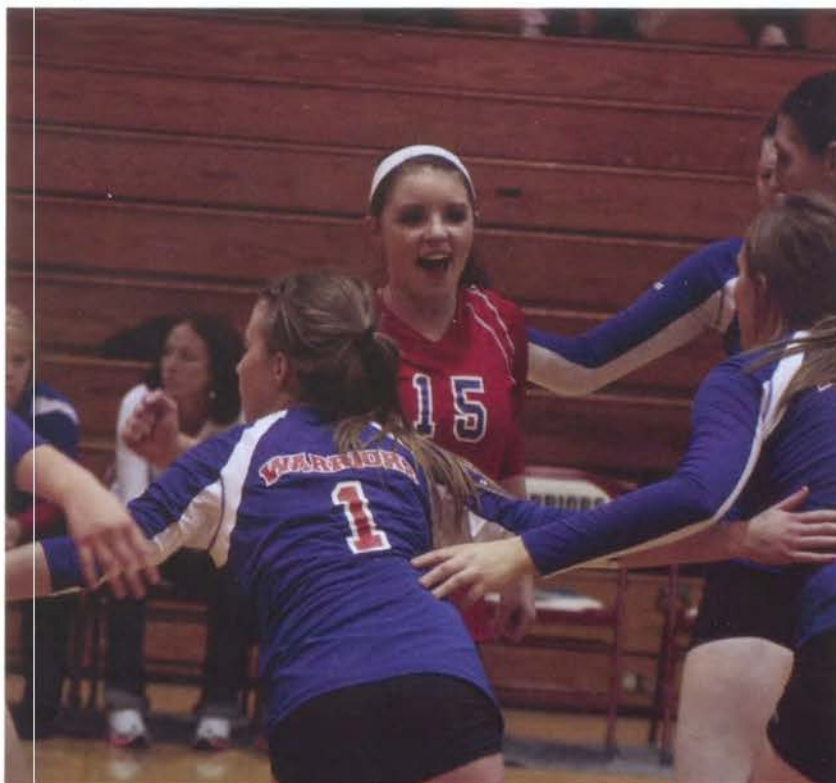

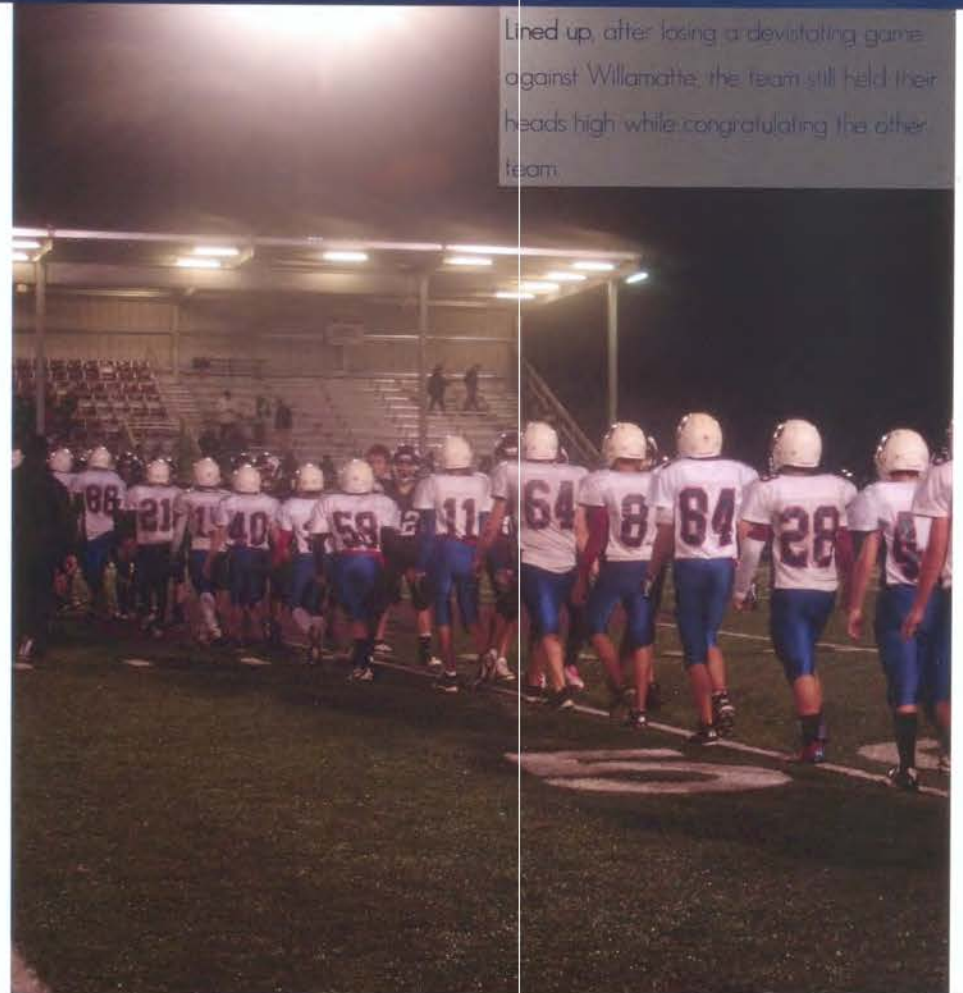

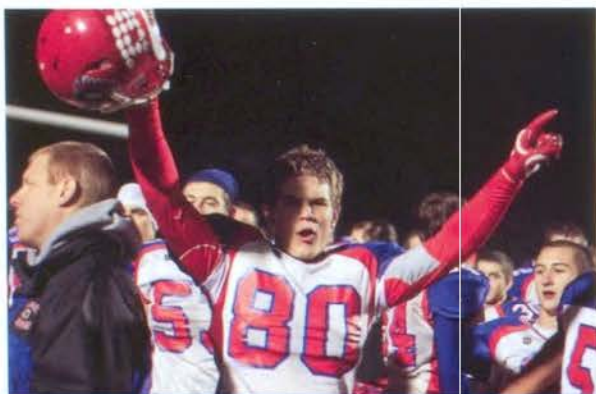

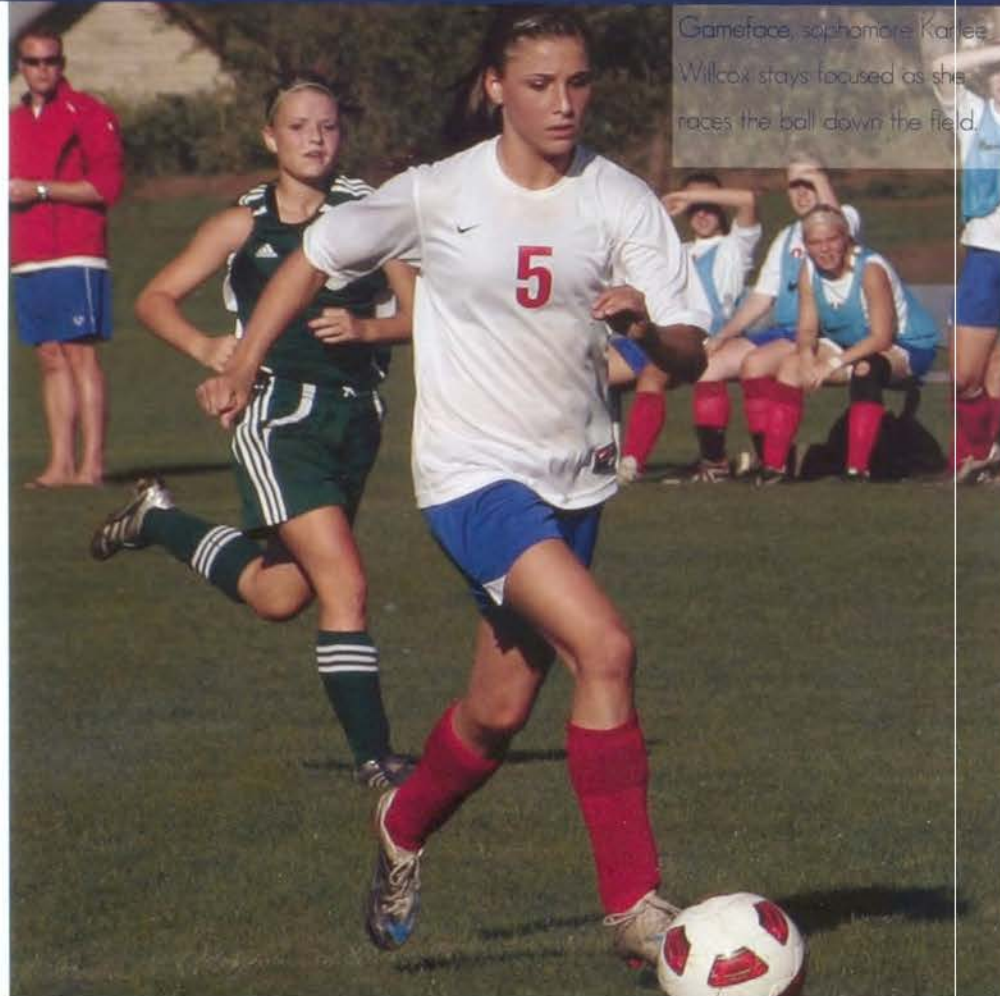

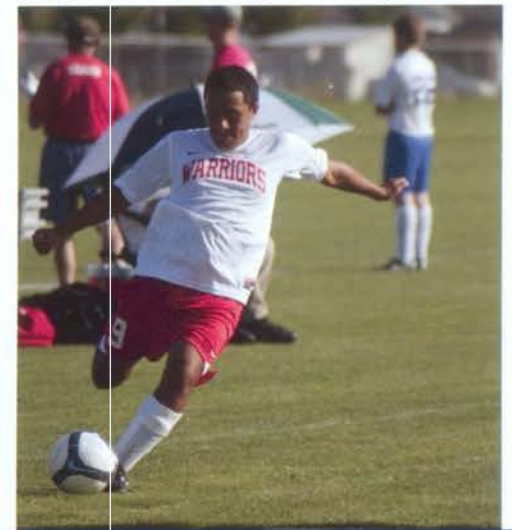

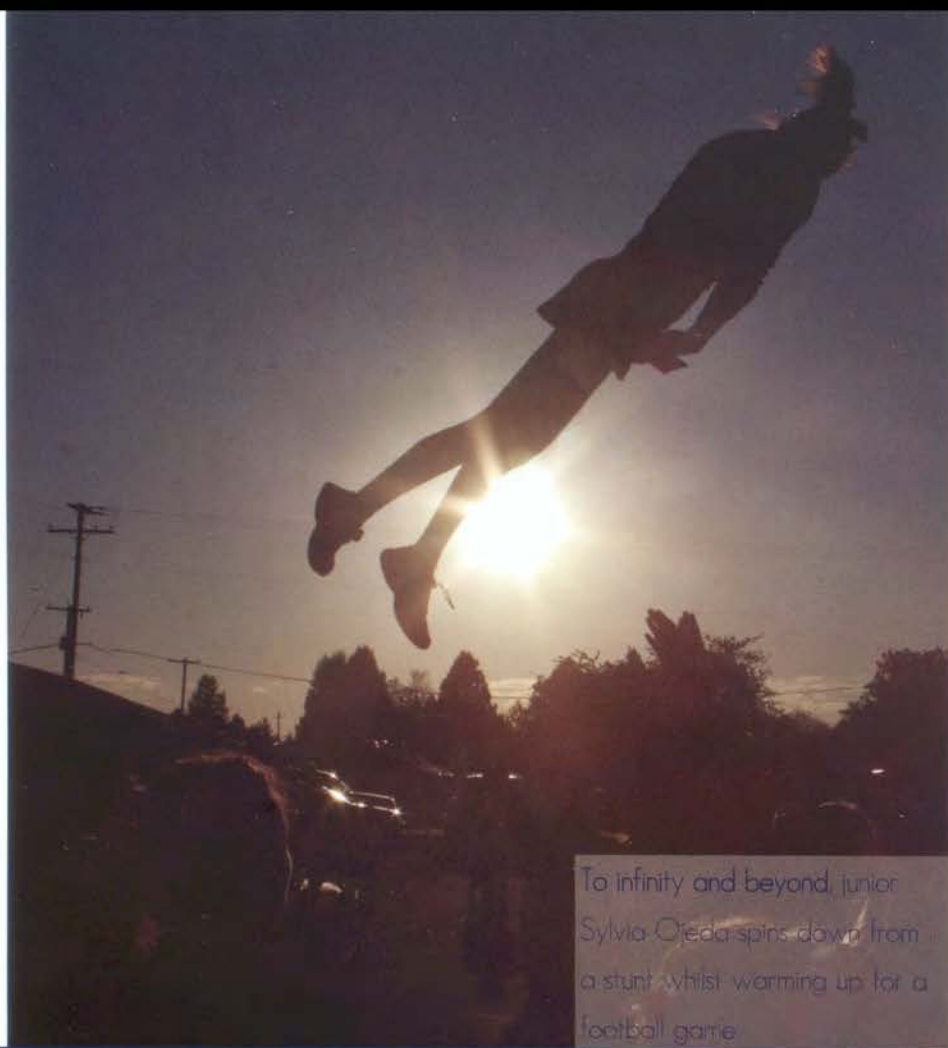

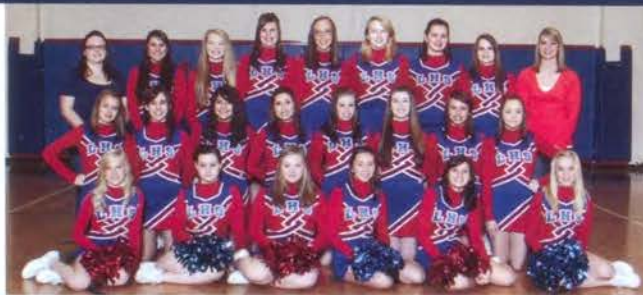

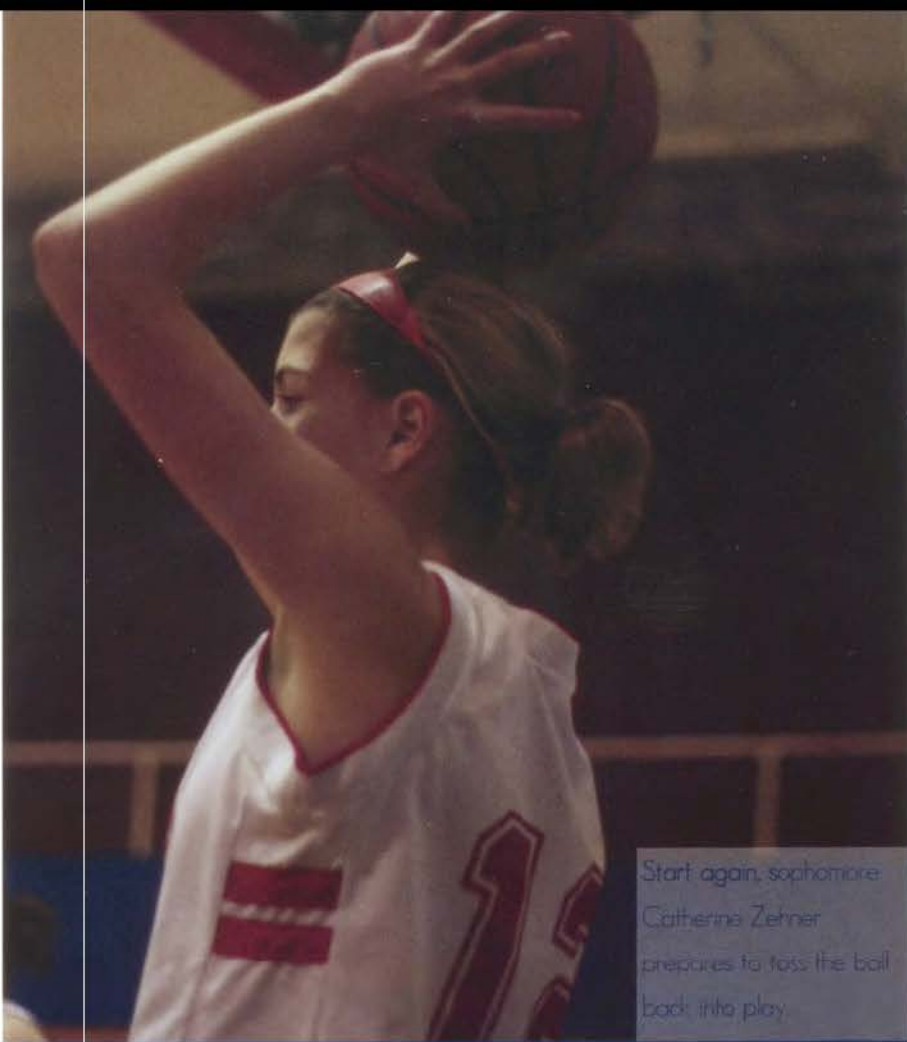

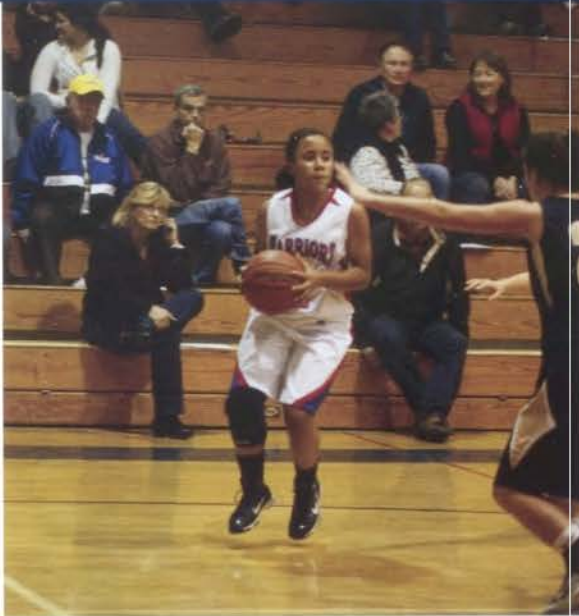

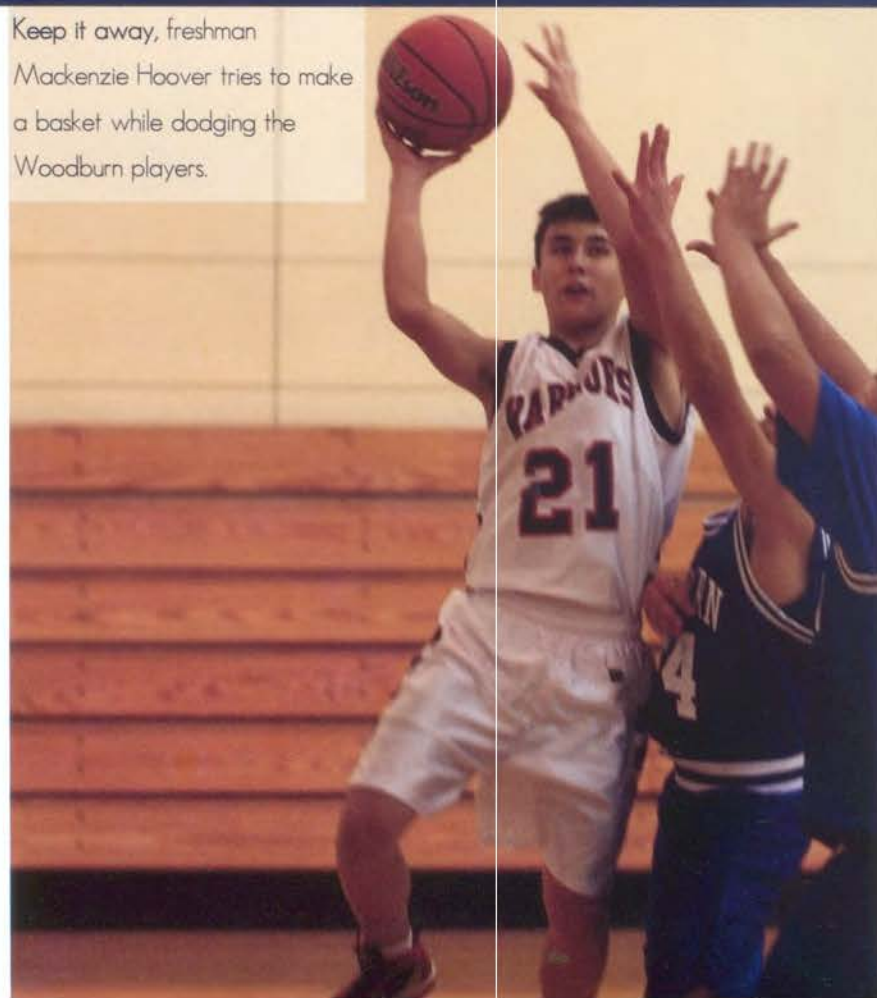

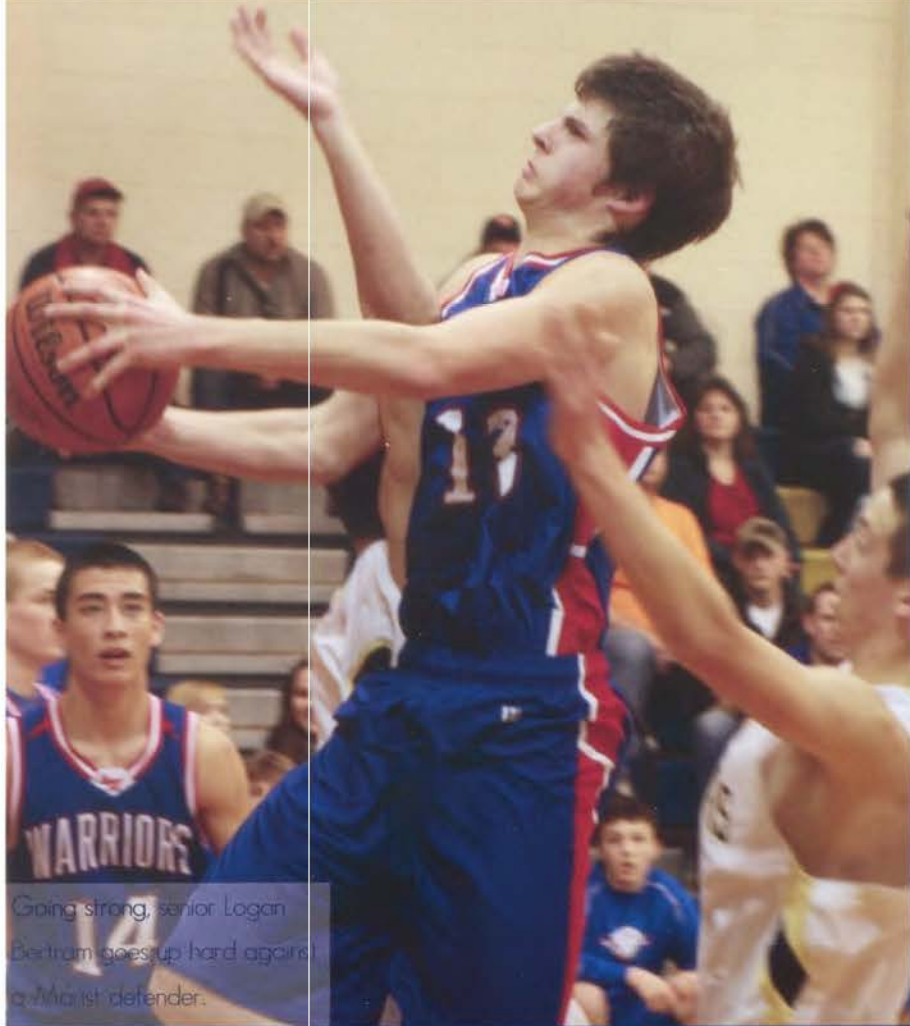

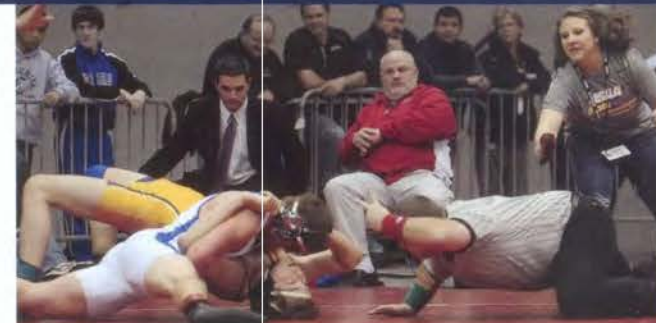


Exhilarating triumph, senior Tance Privratsky raises his arm to victory against Gage Baumer of Eagle Point for the state champion title.

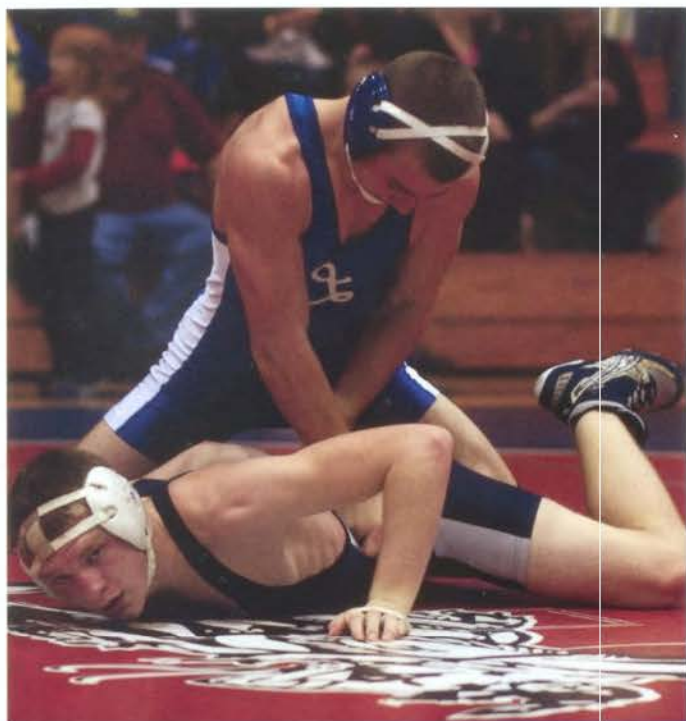

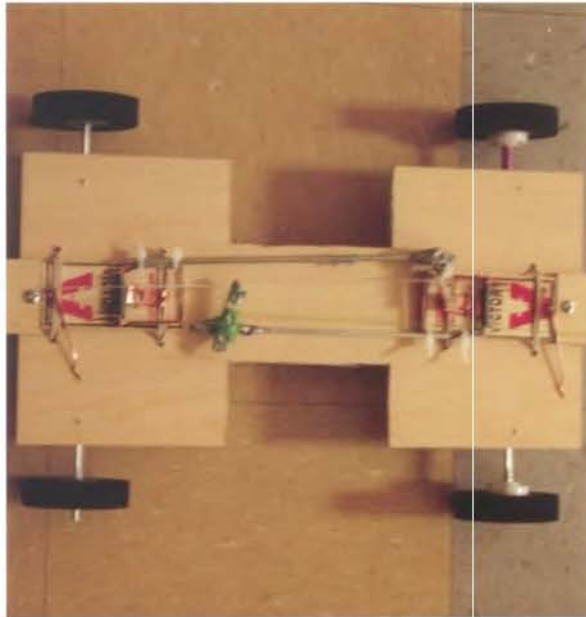

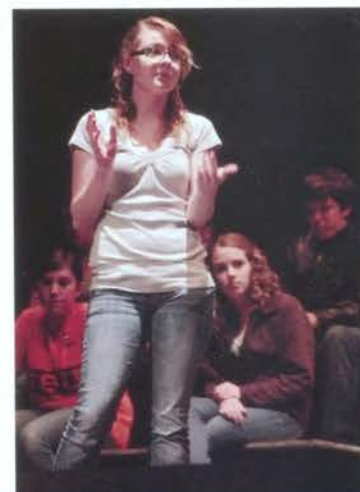

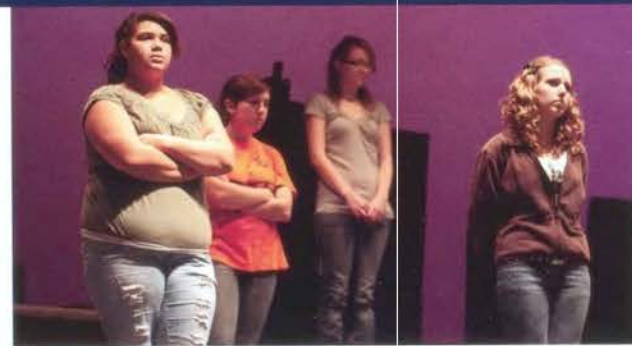

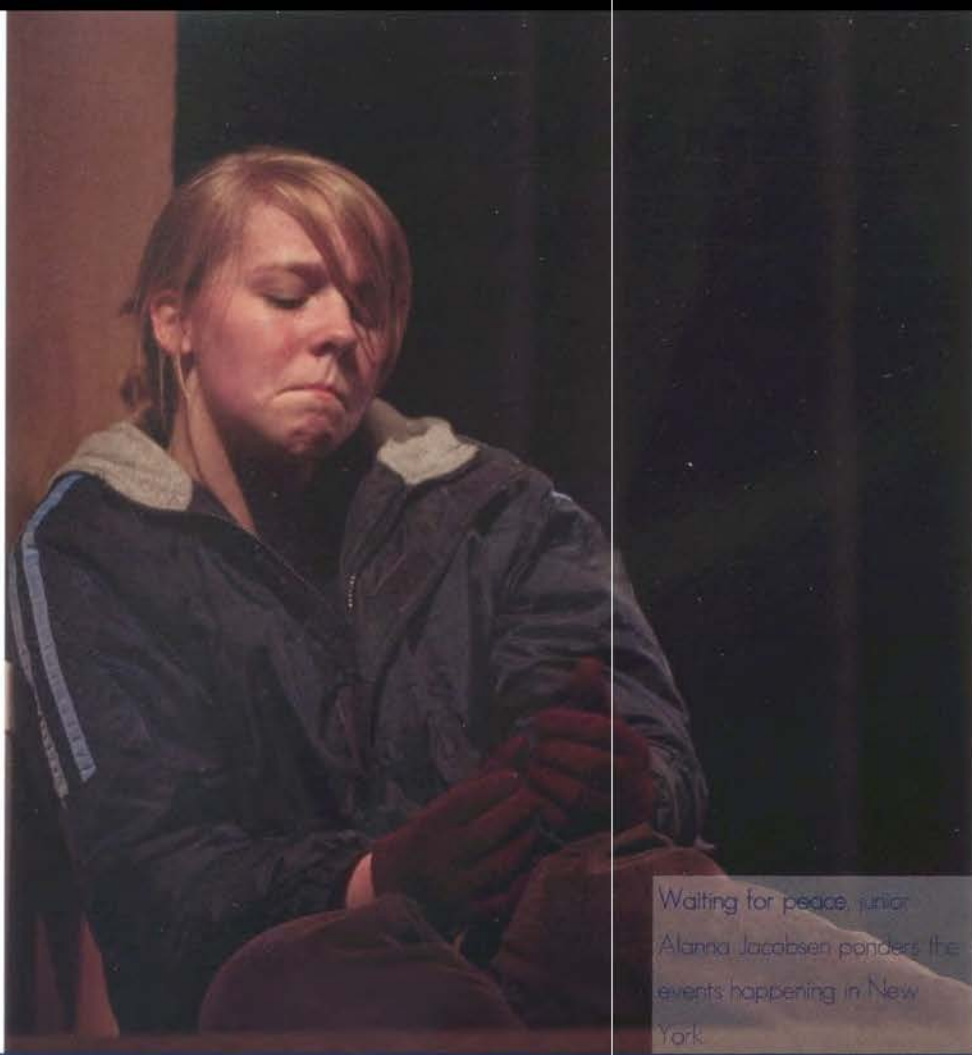

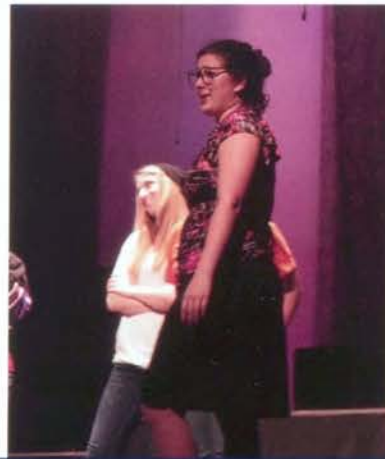

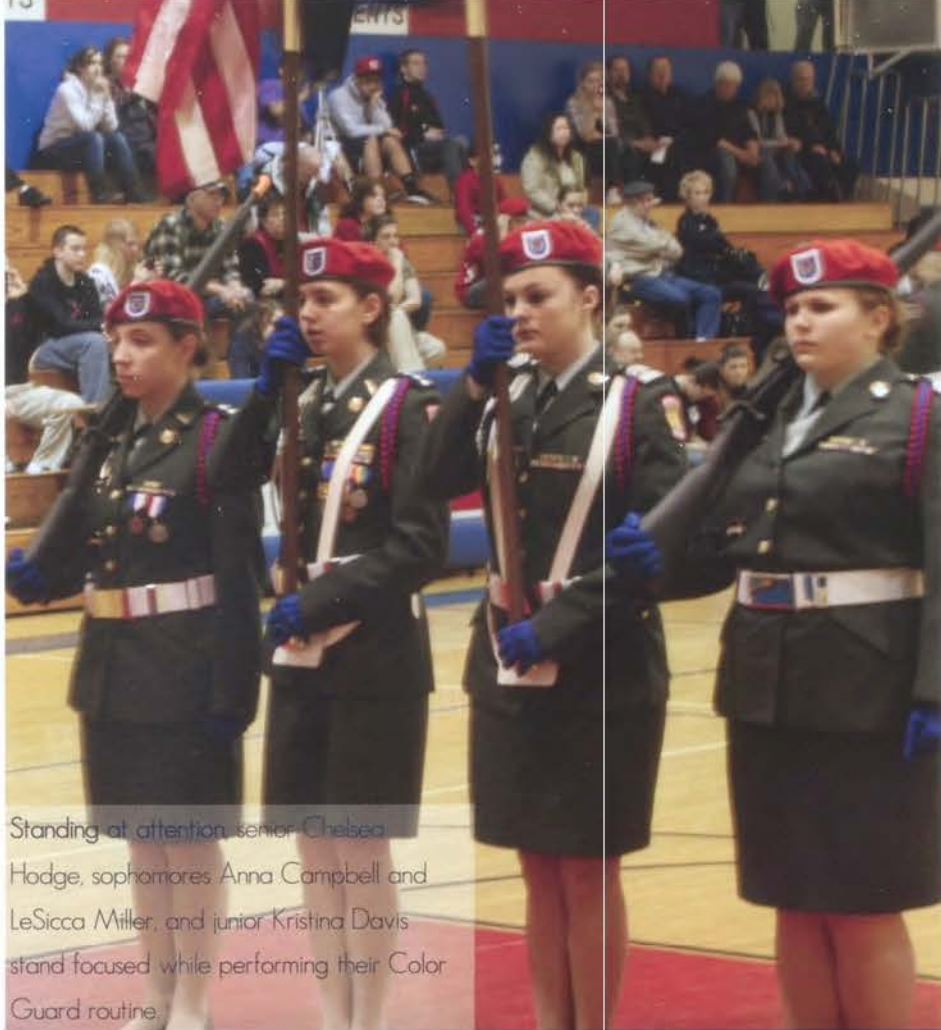

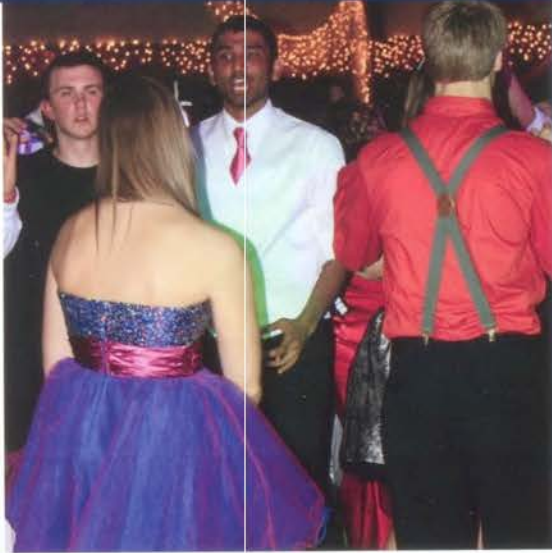
# People
