

Physical description of property and statement of historical significance:

The Linn County Lumber Yard is a complex of buildings used for storing lumber and related building products. There are three structures next to the railroad. The one on the right has a poured concrete foundation wall, wood framed walls clad with corrugated metal and a gable roof of corrugated metal. There are doors on each gable end and on the north a pair of two-light metal frame windows and a larger four-light window on the left.

The building in the center is clad with narrow horizontal wood siding and corner boards. There is a sliding wood door on the railroad side and another facing into the lumber yard. Clerestories on both sides of the gable contain square four-light windows.

The third structure is a flat-roofed, one-story building with a parapet on the south and horizontal siding with corner boards.

History

The current three structures are relatively recent but reflect the role of timber and the railroad in Lebanon's development. The metal clad building on the north dates back to the turn of the century, while the middle and south buildings were built during the early 1940's. A railroad turntable was located where the southernmost structure now stands.
