Physical description of property and statement of historical significance:

This is a one and a half story Queen Anne cottage with a rectangular plan and gables which cross in the center. The foundation is of random coursed rough stone. The first floor has shiplap siding with corner boards, while the slightly projected gable ends are shingled. The one/one, double-hung windows located in all the gable ends have lowered heads. The cornices are boxed and the verges close.

The east elevation features a large fixed window and a double-hung window in the gable end. The entry porch on the north features ball and spindle decorations between turned posts and a three-light front door.

The north elevation has a full height rectangular bay in the center and porches at both ends. Both porches have hip roofs and turned posts. The one/one, double-hung window in the gable end is centered above a large window with narrower side windows. To the east, between the bay and the front porch, there is an oval window with leaded glass in a spider web pattern. An interior chimney is located near the center and an exterior one with a new metal cap is located on the southeast. On the west half of the house there are several additions including a small, one-story, gable roof wing on the southwest corner and there are low, single-light windows.
