Physical description of property and statement of historical significance:

This is a two-lane reinforced concrete bridge over the Albany/Santiam Canal. The concrete posts and buttress-like end walls all have geometrical moldings. The intricate railing that runs between them is constructed with square steel rods. Beneath the bridge, in the middle of the span and at both ends, there are rows of eight fluted monotube steel pipes. The bridge is essentially two 20-foot spans of reinforced concrete, as is evidenced by the thickened beams and double concrete posts at the center. The roadway is 32 feet wide with two five-foot sidewalks. Water pipes have been run along the east side of the bridge and decorative cast steel caps have been removed from the end railing posts, but the bridge is otherwise unaltered.

History: This bridge was built by Sleeper and Keys, a Bend Oregon general contractor, to replace an earlier bridge. It was built for a total of \$5,905 and is one of the oldest public bridges in Lebanon. The bridge plans were prepared by R. T. Stephenson and incorporate many details standardized around Oregon. The railings pattern and concrete posts, for example, are also seen on the larger bridge over the Canal at Park Street.
