Physical description of property and statement of historical significance:

This is a one and a half story Gothic Revival house with a steeply pitched gable roof parallel to the street. The back slope of the gable has been extended to the first floor to cover an addition along the south elevation. The front porch, located on the north elevation, has jigsaw cut columns and a hipped roof. The entry is centered between two four/four, double-hung windows. A wall dormer above contains a two/two, double-hung window.

The east elevation features two four/four, double-hung windows with cornice moldings on each floor. The addition to the northwest is indicated by a vertical trim board and features a one/one, double-hung window with cornice molding. The west elevation has a single four/four, double-hung window in the gable end and a square four-light window in the center of the first floor. There is a pair of double-hung windows without ornamented frames in the rear addition. The house is clad with shiplap siding with corner boards that have capitals.
