URBAN RENEWAL AREA BACKGROUND

The Cheadle Lake Urban Renewal Plan (Plan) within the Lebanon Urban Renewal Agency (LURA) was adopted by the the City of Lebanon in 2000. The maximum indebtedness established in 2000 for the Plan is \$18,500,000. The maximum indebtedness is the total amount of funds that can be spent on projects, programs, and administration in the urban renewal area over the life of the urban renewal plan. The Cheadle Lake Urban Renewal Plan is projected to be in operation until July 2036.¹

The frozen base assessed value of the Plan Area is \$23,436,198 ("Frozen Base"). The FY 2021-2022 total assessed value was \$52,687,650. The excess value, or the value on which taxes are paid to the urban renewal agency in FY 2021-2022 was \$29,251,452.²

The Lebanon Urban Renwal Agency is a separate legal and financial entity, governed by the members of the the City of Lebanon City Council.

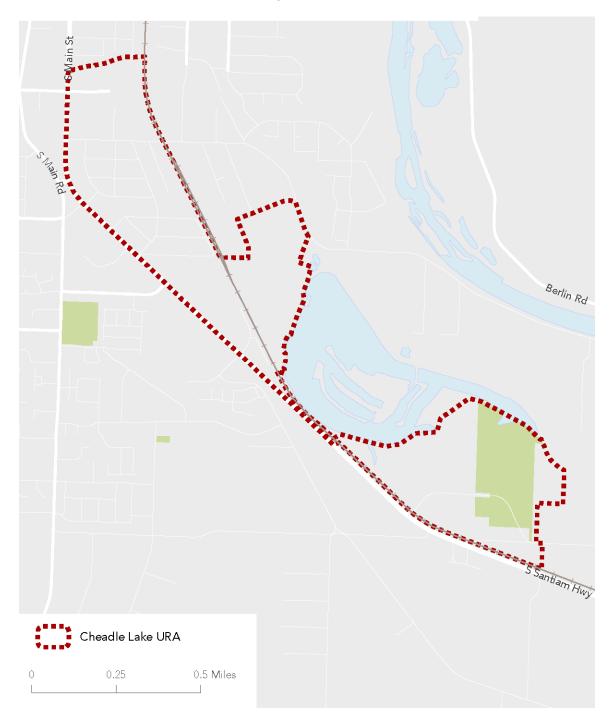
Oregon state law allows cities to create urban renewal districts in size not to exceed twenty-five percent (25%) of the total assessed property value and 25% of total acreage within the city limits. Lebanon has five urban renewal districts, totaling 10.58% of the total assessed value and 24% of their city acreage, not exceeding the 25% limitations.

The maximum indebtedness established for the District is \$18,500,000. At the conclusion of FY 2021-2022 the Plan had used \$4,388,101 toward the maximum indebtedness. There is \$14,111,899 remaining to be spent.

Urban Renewal Goals

The Cheadle Lake Urban Renewal Plan's (Plan) guiding documents are the Plan and Report, which lists a series of goals and objectives to guide activities in the urban renewal area. Goals listed in the Plan are as follows:

- 1. Improve access/egress to the commercial and residential areas south of Airport Road (extended east).
- 2. Reduce traffic congestion on Highway 20 by developing a new frontage road east of the highway.
- 3. Extend and improve the streets and provide water, sanitary and storm sewer services to the residential areas between Airport Road and Gilbert Street.
- 4. Support the development of the Cheadle Lake Area as a regional recreation area by extending utilities and improving access and egress.
- 5. Construct new water treatment plant in the Area.
- 6. Add parks to the Area.

FINANCIAL REPORTING

Pursuant to ORS 457.460, a detailed accounting of the financial activity related to urban renewal areas is required to be reported on an annual basis. The following financial information responds to the requirements of this statute.

Money Received

In FY 2021-2022, the Lebanon Urban Renewal Agency received \$477,596 for the Cheadle Lake Urban Renewal Area from division of taxes.³ The detailed earnings of the Cheadle Lake Urban Renewal Area can be seen in Table 1.

Impact on Taxing Districts

The revenues foregone by local taxing districts due to urban renewal in the Cheadle Lake Urban Renewal Area are shown in Table 4. This information is from Linn County Assessor records, Table 4e and is after losses of \$71 to compression.

Urban renewal agencies do not create an additional tax. Instead, during the Agency's lifespan, overlapping taxing districts "forego" a portion of their permanent rate. Once the urban renewal area is terminated, the taxing jurisdictions receive the full permanent rate of taxes. The School District and Education Service District are funded through the State School Fund on a per pupil allocation. There is no *direct* impact of urban renewal on their funding. The State School Fund is funded through property tax allocations, but also through other state resources.
